After some painstakingly slow decisions both on the planning process and with the sale of the Saplings building we are now finally in position to show some real progress on the ground in 2023. I will summarize the key activities underneath:

Club Development Activities 2023

- 1. The sale of Old Convent (Saplings) building completed in early 2023. We had numerous difficult issues on the contract, but thankfully all got resolved to everyone's satisfaction.
- 2. The renovation of the Sancta Maria building where Sparc resides is now underway. We were unable to begin this work until the sale of Saplings was complete (as per EGM) and money in the bank. This will consist of a good size Audio/visual room for team review meetings, extra treatment rooms for Sparc, kitchenette and toilet facilities. This will provide a much needed resource especially for all our adult teams. We expect the project to be completed by May 2024.
- 3. In 2022 our members at a specially convened EGM agreed to sign off on the developing of two pitches in Carmelite grounds to include: 2 x Full pitches & own entrance. Considerable time has been vested in securing a cost-effective design plan. This was challenging work and needed input from a wide range of professionals. After a detailed tender process the contract was awarded under a number of different headings. Work has been completed by tree surgeons during the summer months and we are ahead of schedule with the levelling of the ground. In January we hope to open our own entrance and continue with the development of the pitches.

- 4. A grant received from Sports Capital has now been allocated to the Carmelite grounds.
- 5. Costings on goalmouths on the Prunty pitch and upgrades to the sideline on PUM are agreed and work to begin in the first week of Jan
- 6. Due to huge efforts by so many members the proposal to develop an All Weather pitch in Ballycullen by SDCC has been withdrawn. This brief was originally the responsibility of the Development committee but very quickly became a club wide issue and coordinated by the Chairman of our Executive.

The Club executive and members have entrusted us with the responsibility of delivering on the above. We are very fortunate to have some exceptionally capable club members who give their time freely to focus on these projects. I'd especially like to thank Frank Moran, Colm Kenny, Billy Coman, Ken Giles, Kevin Brady, Johanna & Graham Donne, Ollie Hickey, David Grant and Vivian Ruddy for their invaluable assistance and input to various projects.

Thanks to all our members for your patience on these time consuming projects but rest assured there is light at the end of the tunnel and these new developments will transform our facilities especially for our playing members.

Membership 2023

Thank you to our members who paid their membership by the renewal date of 31 March. I must thank the representatives from the various sections who follow up those that need reminding to pay their fees. These fees are responsible for over half of the clubs income. The fees covers costs such as pitch maintenance, player registration and player insurance.

Our paid membership for 2023 numbered 2260 males and 1534 females.

A new category of membership was the Boden Óg Spraoi which was started in October. This category was responsible for the increase in overall numbers. Congratulations to the organisers who have taken on the responsibility of 117 five year old boys and girls as they try to add to the

sound foundations that BBSE already has. None of the membership collections would work without the support of the mentors, managers and chairpersons of the various sections but special thanks must go to George Ó Sé, Amanda Barnwell, Jim Keane, Deborah Heavy and Emma Doyle.

I would also like to thank Susan, Amanda and Emma who assist & make the collection process as efficient as possible.

2023 proved a very busy year for our adult football teams, with our inters, U21A, and minor A teams all winning county titles. Our senior footballers also reached the Dublin SFC final, while our junior As reached their first-ever county final. Both our seniors and our junior As were beaten by Kilmacud Crokes in their respective deciders, but it remans a year to be proud of for our adult football section, with our senior footballers also winning the AFL Division 1 title in December.

Off the pitch, we sadly lost Boden stalwart Donie Kerin, who died in October. Donie devoted his time and talents to Boden for many decades and proudly looked on as his son Andrew helped win the All Ireland Club Football Championship in 2016. He is dearly missed by all at Boden.



Seniors

Boden's seniors faced Ballymun in the preliminary round of the Dublin SFC and secured a five-point win that was in doubt until the last few minutes before Ryan O'Dwyer scored a goal after good work by Colm Basquel. Further wins over Ballinteer St Johns and Templeogue left the team winning their group and faced Castleknock in the championship quarter final. A strong second half performance resulted in an eleven-point victory. We faced our near neighbours St Judes in the semi-final which was won on a scoreline of 3-13 to 0-9. In the final, the team failed to reach the heights we know they are capable of, and unfortunately, we were beaten by Kilmacud.

The team finished top of the league table after the scheduled 15 league games with 9 wins, four losses and two walkovers. Having finished top of the league we played St Judes in the league semi-final and were due to play Kilmacud Crokes in the final in Parnell Park on 6 December. However, as Crokes informed the CCC that they could not field a team as scheduled, the CCC awarded the game to Boden.

The highlight of the league campaign was probably the performance against Na Fianna in the second game of the league when a win was achieved against all the odds after one of our players was sent off. Another highlight was the league game against St Sylvesters in PUM where a big fundraising effort for Sarcoma Ireland was organised by Darren O'Reilly and the players. The event was very well attended and supported which reflected the esteem that Darragh Nelson is held in by everyone in Ballyboden.

Another highlight included the progression of a number of talented young players into the senior ranks.



Inters - Back to Back County Champions

Our Intermediate footballers came into 2023 as defending champions in the All-County Intermediate Football Championship after a year to remember in 2022. They would go on to defend their championship title in style following another memorable year in 2023. The lads finished second in Group 2 following a narrow defeat against Kilmacud Crokes in Pairc Uí Mhurchú in September, leaving them with a tricky away date with Clontarf in the last-eight.



However, a terrific performance saw Boden run out 12-point winners before a similarly excellent performance saw Boden overcome Ballymun Kickhams in the semi-final on a scoreline of 1-15 to 0-12, setting up a date with Na Fianna in the final Goals from Colly Dunne and Eoghan Gannon helped secure a seven-point win on a memorable day in O'Toole Park early in November. The inter footballers also performed well in the league, winning eight of 15 games to finish 7th in AFL Division 3.





An away win at Cuala set the tone for what would be a historic championship campaign for this group of players. A narrow defeat to Whitehall in the second group game meant that it was straight knockout from there on in. A win against Towers saw the lads qualify for a quarter final away to Fingal Raven's, who were undefeated at home in over two years.

An 11-point win at Fingal Ravens set up a semi-final date with Na Fianna, with Boden running out narrow two-point winners to book their place in their first-ever championship final – against Kilmacud Crokes. A fortuitous Crokes goals proved to be the difference as the Stillorgan side ran out one-point winners on a heartbreaking day at O'Toole Park.

The league campaign was a challenging task. Early wins against Man of War and St. Monicas were followed up by defeats to Brendan's, Olaf's and Raheny. Wins against Maur's and Erins Isle steadied the ship but as J1's and college holidays kicked in, it was backs to the wall stuff. Defeats to Raven's, Moran's & Fingallian's and we were in relegation territory. Three defeats in the final three games to Crumlin, O'Dwyers and Whitehall meant a lot of sleepless nights and nerve-jangling moments, but good things happen to good people, and with other results going our way, it turned out to be mid-table obscurity for the 2023 Division 5 league campaign.



Junior B

Competing in Division 7, our Junior Bs finished mid-table after a decent league campaign that saw eight wins and seven defeats.

The B's were drawn in a difficult championship group containing Naomh Mearnóg, St. Vincent's and Castleknock and opened their campaign with a tricky trip to Castleknock, where they were beaten by 12 points despite a brave performance.

A narrow one-point victory at home to Vincent's saw the B's eliminated from the championship, but they did finish on a high, beating Mearnóg by four points.



Junior C

The Junior C footballers played in Division 10 south this year. We had a difficult start to the league campaign but won four of the last five games to finish mid-table. The C's were drawn in a difficult Championship group with Na Fianna's fourth team and Skerries Harps' third team, and finished bottom of the three-team group despite a hugely encouraging display against Na Fianna.

Our Junior D footballers enjoyed an encouraging campaign in Division 11 South before qualifying from a difficult Championship Group featuring Castleknock, Fingallians and St James Gaels. The D's avenged a league defeat to St. James Gaels in their final group game to secure top spot in the group and set up a quarter-final date with Crumlin.

Heartbreak followed for the D's, who were defeated on penalties in a gripping quarter-final clash at Sancta Maria.



U21A - County Champions

Our U21A's enjoyed a brilliant year, claiming a county title after suffering heartbreak at the final hurdle last season.

In a repeat of last year, the championship draw pitted us against Na Fianna in the quarter finals and yet again it was an extremely tight affair, but a narrow win set up a semi-final date with reigning champions Ballinteer St. Johns.

As if the blood pressure wasn't tested enough against Na Fianna, we were on red alert during this one, as both teams traded points in a tactical game. There was never more than two points between the sides, with extra time required to separate the teams. Boden eventually prevailed on a score of 0-15 to 0-14.

The final would see us play an unknown Ballymun Kickham's team. After a sharp start playing against the gale, we found ourselves up by 5. However, a quick 1-1 from the opposition just before half-time meant there was only one point in it at the break. After a few settling minutes of the second period, we began to assert control and eventually won out





With a concession from Mearnog in the QF, the under 21B team only had one competitive game in 2023. A disappointing defeat to a good Whitehall Colmchille first team brought the campaign to an early finish. This is a very talented group of players with some fantastic players. They are very young with the majority under 21 again next year.

Minor A - County Champions

Boden's Minor A's enjoyed a sensational county championship campaign, beating local rivals Kilmacud Crokes after a goal-crazy final on a memorable day in O'Toole Park in November.

Our minors began the year with a hugely encouraging league campaign that saw them take on Crokes on the final day in what turned out to be a league decider. The game was a humdinger, in which we fought back from 10 points down with 15mins to go, with 14 men, to lose by a single point. A win was denied only by a brilliant fingertip save by the Crokes keeper, from a James Greally bullet.

Crokes again enjoyed a narrow victory when the sides met in the championship group stages,



but wins over Thomas Davis and St. Judes were enough for the minor A's to book a place in the

A David Quinlaven goal in the last minute of extra time saw Boden overcome St. Sylvesters in a topsy turvy quarter-final clash, before the Minor A's prevailed away at Lucan Sarsfields in the semi-finals with a well-deserved four-point victory. Crokes awaited in the final aiming to break Boden hearts for the third time in 2023. but it was Boden who came up trumps on this occasion. The Final will go down in Ballyboden history as one of the most entertaining games of





Minor B

Our minor B team recorded a respectable midtable finish in the league this year, finishing with victories against Ballymun, O'Tooles, and St.

In the championship, the B's started with a well-deserved win at Parnells before a home defeat against Beann Eadair set up a winnertakes-all clash against Naomh Mearnóg. Leading by a point in injury time, the B's seemed set to qualify for the knockouts, only for Mearnog to score a late equaliser and qualify in their place.



Minor C

Competing in Division 5 South, our Minor C team finished in a respectable fourth-place. However, the championship draw was unkind to the C's, leaving them in a group with O'Tooles, Templeogue, and Lucan, all of whom competed in higher divisions than the C's.

The lads put in brave performances but finished with three defeats, despite going toe-to-toe with a strong Lucan side. Unfortunately, the season was brought to an abrupt end with the county board cancelling the shield competitions



Our Minor D team competed in Division 6 South and finished with a respectable return of three wins from eight games.

The D's were handed a walkover against Na Fianna in the opening game of their championship campaign but were unfortunately eliminated in the group stages despite trojan efforts against Ranelagh and St. James Gaels.

Finally a huge thanks to the Boden faithful who brought the Boden Roar to venues across the county. It's no exaggeration to say you pushed our times over the line on countless occasions. Here's to many more memorable moments in 2024.

The 2016 All Ireland Club Football final was barely a minute old when Colm Basquel fired a precise shot past Rory Byrne to give Ballyboden St. Enda's an early lead over Castlebar Mitchels.

Basquel, who had turned 20 just days prior, was instrumental in Boden's 13-point win over Castlebar on that famous day and appeared to be the latest in a long line of outrageously talented Dublin forwards at Jim Gavin's disposal. It perhaps took a little longer than anticipated, but Basquel has now delivered on that outstanding potential, finishing as the top scorer from play as Dublin reclaimed Sam Maguire and ending the year with an All Star in his back pocket. It had been a long time

Regularly excellent with Boden, Basquel struggled to establish himself as a Dublin starter in the years after his club and U21 heroics. "You have to kind of learn the system as a young player. We had a very systemorientated game plan," Basquel said. Although Basquel made the panel for Dublin's All Ireland replay victory over Mayo in October 2016, he initially found intercounty opportunities hard to come by, missing the 2017 championship through injury and playing a bit-part role in 2018 with Jim Gavin's Dublin at the peak of their powers. However, he views his early Dublin career as a series of "stepping stones", pointing to an encouraging league campaign in 2018 that saw him chip in with two points from play in the league final against Galway. He also made his championship debut against Wicklow that summer and later made his first championship start against

The following year, with playing time still at a premium, Basquel opted to play football in Chicago for the summer, swapping the blue of Dublin for the blue of Wolfe Tones and giving himself a "mental break" from intercounty



He returned in time for the Dublin Championship, scoring 3-04 as Boden edged out Na Fianna in a quarter-final thriller at Parnell Park. He went on to score 1-04 as Boden came from behind against St. Jude's in the semi-final and notched 3 points in a relatively comfortable final against Thomas Davis. Boden famously went on to win another Leinster championship later that year, but dreams of a second All Ireland title were ended by Kilcoo in a closely fought All Ireland

Colm Basquel - Boden hero to All-Star corner forward

Basquel's exploits with Boden saw him reenter the Dublin fray the following spring, scoring a brilliant goal in Dublin's league defeat against Tyrone in Omagh. However, his season, like everyone else's, was disrupted by the emergence of the Covid-19 pandemic. Injury also prevented him from making a starting contribution during Dublin's six-ina-row campaign, but he recovered in time to make an impact off the bench as Dublin overcame Mayo yet again in All Ireland decider. "Coming on in the Covid All Ireland as a sub was a massive breakthrough," Basquel said, adding that it was "so important" that he was able to train with his Boden teammates



more prominently in the 2021 campaign, but, unfortunately for the Boden star, that coincided with a downturn in Dublin's form and the end of their longstanding dominance of the All Ireland series. More unfortunately still, Basquel was black-carded as Dublin famously lost to Mayo in the All Ireland semi-final, their first Championship defeat in seven years. "It was tough to come back from that. You don't ever want to get a black card in an important match. It was just probably something that I had to learn from. "The goal chance is something I regret more. I probably should have taken a point. My decision-making was questioned after and rightly so."

He subsequently decided to opt out of the Dublin panel in 2022 and, like his decision to spend a summer in Chicago in 2019, the decision paid dividends. Basquel returned to the Dublin set-up in early 2023, playing each O'Byrne Cup game and featuring prominently in the National League campaign. He said he immediately recognised a change in the Dublin squad following disappointing semi-final defeats in 2021 and 2022 against Mayo and Kerry respectively. "I thought it was something that made us really hungry to right the wrongs in 2023. There was just a buzz. The young lads in the group had developed so much." This time, Basquel seized his chance with both hands, scoring 1-05 against Laois in the opening round of the Leinster Championship, but he pinpointed the All Ireland group stage game against Kildare as the moment that his campaign kicked into gear. "It was definitely that game that kickstarted the season for me. It gave me confidence and my teammates start believing in me."

Basquel scooped his first-ever Championship man of the match award after kicking five points from play against Kildare, but it was his match-winning turn against Mayo in the All Ireland quarter-final that brought his form to national prominence. The Boden forward scored 2-02 from play as both he and Dublin

banished the demons of two years previous. Speaking about his first goal, Basquel drew comparisons to his missed goal chance in the 2021 game."I made sure when I got one-onone with the goalie this time that it was going in the net. I wasn't going to blaze it wide."

A difficult outing against Monaghan in the All Ireland semi-final followed, with Basquel hooked shortly after half time moments after he was called for overcarrying. The final appeared to be going in a similar direction, with each of the Dublin forwards struggling to extract any change from their markers in difficult conditions against Kerry on a wet day in July. Kerry held a slender lead at half time, but Basquel came to the fore after the break, making a vital contribution to Dublin's All Ireland success and probably securing his All Star in the process. The Boden forward kicked two points from play and won a vital turnover that led to Paddy Small's decisive goal, while he also set up Paul Mannion for the lead score late on and won the free that effectively sealed the win for Dublin.

Reflecting on the final, Basquel pointed to his first score as the moment that helped him settle into the occasion. "Fenton gave me a lovely kick pass down the wing and I got one on one with Paul Murphy. He kind of backed off and I got a shot off on my left. That helped settle me down.

"It was brilliant to play a part in that win. To win with lads from the club like with Ryan (Basquel) and Ross (McGarry) and lads like Con



(O'Callaghan) and Paddy Small who I played minor and 21s with. That's something that I'll always remember." "Lifting the cup with him (Ryan), that's special. Not every set of brothers who play Gaelic get to do that."

Basquel, along with Ryan and Ross, returned to Boden following Dublin's All Ireland success as the club attempted to reclaim the Dublin Championship for the first time since 2019. Unfortunately, after a hugely encouraging campaign, Boden came up short against an experienced Kilmacud Crokes side in the final, with Crokes claiming their third county championship on the spin.

Basquel, however, is optimistic for the future, pointing to the club's success in the league as well as success in the Minor and U21A

championships. "There are young guys coming through and they're driving the whole thing on. We had a really good league. We have a good a management team. It's definitely a goal to go after the Dublin Championship next year."

Despite the disappointment of October's county final defeat, the year still finished on a positive note for Basquel when the Boden forward received a much-deserved All Star award for his efforts in 2023, the only Dublin forward to make the All Star team. Basquel said it was "brilliant" to win the award after scoring a hugely impressive 5-17 from play across the Championship, adding that his sights are now firmly set on 2024 for both club



We look forward to another season with our brilliant Boden Braves!



An Coiste Oiliúna agus Cluichí



Coaching Workgroups - BBSE

The Coiste Oiliúna agus Cluichí, BBSÉ, has over recent months set up six Coaching Workgroups for each of the following specific areas within the Club: Iomáint, Peil, Camógaíocht, Peil na mBan, Go Games, Boden Óg. Each Workgroup has a designated Coordinator(s) and consists of 5/6 members. The Coaching Workgroups work in close collaboration with our CPDM, Coach Player Development Manager, and all are linked to the Coiste Oiliúna agus Cluichí.

The Coaching Workgroups work in parallel with the various playing Section Committees. The purpose of the Coaching Workgroups is to review and oversee the quality of coaching within their respective codes and design and implement initiatives to enhance the quality of coaching provided to all of our players. A key objective is to ensure that all players are afforded coaching of a high standard and are thus enabled to fulfil their potential.

Another key objective is to give coaches the opportunity to upskill themselves through the support, mentoring and learning opportunities provided by the Workgroups. In accordance with one of our Club values, Teamwork, the Coaching Workgroups will work to ensure (1) that there is a high level of cooperation between mentors of different age groups, (2) players are exposed to a range of different coaches. The Coaching Coordinators are there to support all the coaches in their section and can be contacted to provide advice and assistance if required. The Coiste Oiliúna agus Cluichí confident that the Coaching Workgroups, working in collaboration with mentors, coaches and committees and maintaining a close link with our CPDM, can make a hugely positive contribution to the development of our Baile Buadáin Naomh Éanna Player Pathway and our Coach Pathway.

Coach Education

Ballyboden St Enda's Coach Development Pathway is structured on the basis of three strands: formal learning; informal learning and self-directed learning. At the heart of it is a commitment to on-going learning, upskilling and improvement. Over 2023 this approach encompassed the following:

Formal Coach Education: 5 ICGG Courses - 175 participants ● 1 Award 1 Hurling Course - 15 participants

Informal Coach Education: Observation and Support sessions - All Boden Óg and Go Games teams

2 Go Games upskilling Workshops - Hurling delivered by Paudie Butler and Football by Ronan Mcdonald

2 Communities of Practice Workshops - 1 for Hurling/Camogie and 1 for LGFA and Gaelic Football

3 Work Group led Workshops focusing on specific skill Development. 1 Hurling/Camogie, 1 LGFA and 1 Gaelic Football.

These were led by Paudie O'Neill, Liam O'Dwyer, Declan O'Reill and Orlaith Keane

3 Code specific review Workshops, 1 LGFA, 1 Gaelic Football and 1 Hurling

All Coach Education initiatives in Ballyboden Saint Enda's are conducted in collaboration with the CPDM, Coiste Oiliúna agus Cluichí and Code specific Work Groups. This is a model that was first introduced in 2023 and will continue to be the way in which Coach Education is rolled out club

Ballyboden Player Pathway- The Boden WayWork has begun on our Player Pathway and going into 2024 and beyond it will underpin all Coach Education in Ballyboden. The Pathway will involve all four codes and will outline the goals and approaches that we will take to each stage of development, Child Youth and Adult. The Pathway will be a mixture of the official GAA Pathway along with the research and feedback from our own Coaches. Each Working Group is working on the specific details for their own code and will all combine into one Holistic Club wide Player Pathway. coaches on an annual basis. Another objective would be to ensure that players are provided with a range of game opportunities outside of the specific team to which they usually belong.

Prior to the closure of schools for Summer break we held an invitational School Blitz on Páirc Uí Murchú. Boys and girls from 3rd class enjoyed hurling/camogie and football matches across 4 days in May.



This has been achieved due to the help of volunteer and 3rd level coaches between September - November. There has been a Ballyboden St Enda's presence through the coaching of Senior Infants & 1st class children in 9 of our 10 schools. The plan for term 2 is to maintain our presence in a number of schools while engaging with the schools that have not been heavily exposed to Gaelic Games.

Between September & Christmas 2023 we have had Paul Waters and 3rd level students Cormac Hayes, Jemma Hayes, Pádraic Doyle, Emma-Jane Weir, Megan Dignam, Micheál Manning and Jack O'Connor actively coaching on behalf of Ballyboden St Enda's in 7 of our local primary schools. Athletic Development and Gym Upgrades

Conor's background is in sports science and strength & conditioning with the Wexford Senior Footballers, Meteors Basketball Club and DBS Éanna Basketball. Along with these two appointments, the club gym in Sancta Maria underwent a refurbishment in November, the first since the gym was built back in 2016. 
Championship kicked off late August with three defeats to Man O'War, St Annes and O'Dwyers. A comfortable win in the Shield semi-final

How do you measure success in sport? At the end of yet another thrilling encounter between Ballyboden St Endas and St Sylvesters for the U16 Football Division 1 Shield - one final bruising rollercoaster between these two well matched sides in Sancta Maria on November 11th last - winning Boden captain Sadbh Dunne, accepting the trophy perfectly encapsulated it when she said: "There's no-one I'd rather spend Sunday afternoons with than this group of girls…".

It's a formula continually being recreated by girls at all age levels around the club- the U8 and U9 girls training together at 6.30pm on a wet Tuesday in April on the hockey pitch are forming friendships and camaraderie that last well into their teens and well hopefully beyond into our adult teams. The trophies and shields are all part of it of course, just like the losses are. But it's who they win and lose with that the girls will remember.



Player Numbers Year End 2023

Growth of Juvenile Ladies Football and Camogie in Ballyboden

During 2023, seven hundred and thirty-nine (739) girls- from U16 down to U8 – were registered to play for Ballyboden St Endas in football, while six hundred and fifty-four (654) girls were registered to play camogie. The girls lined out in 86 teams, 46 football and 40 camogie.

Numbers at training are also consistently high across the board, with 70 plus players not uncommon on the hockey and all-weather pitches in Sancta Maria, while many teams reported a growth in numbers as the year progressed, finishing the year with the same number or more girls than when they started in January. The success and popularity of the girls' games continues to go from strength to strength in Boden, with parity of playing numbers now broadly reached between boys and girls playing juvenile sports in the club.

Go Games Participation

Boden's Go Games participation in both Ladies Football and Camogie continues to go from strength to strength, with the club represented by huge numbers of girls on a weekly basis across all the age groups. It's a testament to the volunteer coaches, bainisteoirs, mentors and FLOs and to the enjoyment the girls get from it that they continue to turn up for matches and training on a weekly basis in both codes and in such big numbers.

Go Games participation by Ballyboden Juvenile Ladies in 2023 was as follows:

Boden U8 Girls Take to the Field for the First Time

A historic first for our U8 cáilíní as 93 seven and eight year olds took to the field for Go Games for the first time in the history of

the club. The girls rose to the challenge and really embraced the opportunity to compete for the ball in both football and camogie. Training sessions on Thursday evenings were always fun while also focussed on developing the girls' skills, game sense and confidence in playing both games. Well done to all the girls.

And all the hard work by the girls has brought with it lots of success, with Boden girls regularly competing in finals, whether Championship, Shield or Féile. Our U14s were League Division 1 and Division 8 winners in camogie while they also claimed Shields in Division 5 football and Division 1 Camogie, while our U13s were Division 1 Football League runners up as well as claiming the Division 1 Shield.

2023 continued online with the Lotto Committee meeting weekly on Zoom and conducted the 'Virtual Lotto' draw with the aid of an on-line random number generator.

New Beginnings and The Changing of the Guard

In April, we partnered with ClubZap, the automated, online sports management platform to administer and run the weekly Lotto draws, bringing all our membership streams under one umbrella. The move allows members play the Lotto with the click of a button and enables us to communicate the Lotto results directly with players while also re-engaging expired players. Currently we have over 550 Annual and Recurring subscribers with many other players opting to play on a week by week basis, a welcome increase on 2022.

July 2023 saw the existing lotto committee step down and hand the baton over to our new committee. It was a good year for Lotto members with €28,000 paid out to 5 jackpot winners. Over the course of the 52 weekly draws, €3,000 was won by Neil Howard in January, with long term member Joseph Byrne winning the €8,000 Jackpot in May. Gearóid O'Súilleabháin was our next winner of €5,000 in July. Juvenile Boys Report 2023 Eamonn Gormley

U8 Football & Hurling

2023 was the first year that BBSE entered the U8 Boys Go Games and it proved to be a big success. Alan Ryan (Hurling) and Anton Hegarty (Football) led this group and were assisted by 34 other coaches throughout the year. There were 129 boys registered for 2023 and these were split into 4 x 3 Team groups for the Go Games series. Games ran from February- June and September-November and there were consistently 85-90 players turning up for matches each week, with up to 100 attending training. The progress made by this group has been impressive. This group participated in 40 training sessions and 21 Go Games mornings, 2 matches per morning. They are constantly improving the basic skills that they are practicing each week at training.



U9 Football & Hurling

There are 106 Boys registered in the U9 Boys group and we fielded 9 teams in both football and hurling each week. Go Games started in mid-February and we participated in 12 hurling weekends and 12 football weekends. Training sessions took place twice a week with an average of 80-90 boys attending training, the dedication and commitment of the boys and their parents/guardians was appreciated. Go Games concluded at the start of November leaving us time to squeeze in a few blitzes, before the winter break. To wrap up the Go Games season, there was a football trip to Wexford. After a great morning of football, the boys moved onto laser tag, archery and orienteering before returning home with lifelong memories.







U10 Football & Hurling

In January 2022 the U10 boys, coaches and parents were back for the second year competing in Go Games. We had 96 boys regularly playing both football and hurling and we were delighted to enter three groups in both codes during 2023. The year commenced with some challenge matches before moving into Go Games, and throughout the year we had the opportunity to host Granemore (Armagh) and Monasterevin (Kildare) for a football blitz, which gave the boys great experience and opportunities to develop their skills. The U10 season came to an end in November, with our final challenge games against Cuala in football and Na Fianna in hurling, where the boys were able to demonstrate all they have learned throughout the year. We look forward to 2024 and the next stages of our journey with the club.



U11 Football & Hurling

The U11 boys had 95 footballers and 72 hurlers, with 19 coaches helping them to improve throughout the year. The parents have also been particularly supportive with the fundraising efforts and team commitment this year.

During the year we played 15 different rounds of Go Games, displaying excellent skills with lots of great teamwork. On top of great competitive Go Games, we hosted a Hurling blitz at PUM in May where we welcomed teams from Dicksboro, Moycarkey Borris, Clane and Faughs.

U12 Football & Hurling

There were 94 boys registered in 2023 and we fielded 5 teams in football and 4 in hurling each week. We are grateful that we had 23 coaches to help train the boys in both codes. Boys regularly moved across teams throughout the year based on aptitude and attitude. Progress across the football group was strong, which was evident with many of the teams competing strongly against opposing teams at the end of the year.

The 12-month progress was a major highlight and huge testament to the trojan work that all of our coaches put into their teams. Each of our 4 hurling teams played their first grading games in February, to kickstart a great year of hurling. While results in the initial grading games were mixed, the boys performances constantly improved and it was great to see their skills develop throughout the year. Once the final league compositions were decided, the boys put in some great performances throughout the year and all of the teams finished in the top half of their respective divisions.









U13 Football & Hurling

We had 85 boys playing football across four Divisions in 2023. The development of the lads has increased hugely this year. The coaching group was also grateful to the Senior football players who made themselves available to pass on their knowledge. The involvement of the Senior players and the introduction of S & C helped to develop the skills of the boys and the coaches. In June we took our football-only lads to Cooley Kickhams (Louth) to compete in the Michael Bammel Malone Tournament along with 40 plus clubs from London, Scotland, Derry, Antrim, Dublin, Louth and Meath. We brought a cross-section of players from across all the groups and the day was massive craic. We also competed in the Colm Cooper Invitational Dr Crokes tournament. Nothing beats a 4 hour return bus trip to Kerry to collect a cup from Colm Cooper. The lads beat Dr Crokes, St James Gaels from Galway in the final and sang all the way home!



This was also a great year for the U13 hurlers. We returned to play in February 2023 and began with several grading games before competing in Divisions 1, 4 & 7. Our playing numbers have remained very strong with 57 hurlers currently playing. The skill level of these hurlers improved greatly this year. We played in several tournaments which allowed us challenge some top-quality teams including O'Loughlin Gaels, Tramore, Ballygunner, Cashel King Cormacs, Naomh Eanna, Naas, Clane, Monaleen. We also had an experience to remember in Waterford when Liam Phelan invited us down for the Willie Phelan Trophy. Congratulations to the Division 1 team who won their league after some fantastic displays of hurling during the year. We must give massive praise to all of the U13 players who, along with maintaining a super attitude, showed great resilience when facing stronger opposition. They also showed great respect to teammates, coaches, referees and opposing teams.

U14 Football & Hurling

The U14A hurlers had a very strong year and finished by losing a very competitive county final by two points to St Vincent's. Prior to the summer break we played 3 games in 6 days and used many players from both the A and B panels. We have seen boys develop a range of skills through the year and we continue to concentrate on the basics of striking and catching in training.

The U14B hurling team had a great year. Before the summer holidays the lads played five games in Division 4 of the league, winning four and drawing one of these fixtures. When summer arrived the team was promoted to league Division 3 where they had two good wins and three

narrow defeats against quality opposition, frequently featuring Dublin A development squad opposition. This qualified the lads for the semi-finals of the Shield competition where we lost out narrowly to Naomh Maur. We finish 2023 as the top ranked B panel in the county looking forward to the craic and the challenge of Féile na nGael next year.

The U14C team was very competitive in the Division E. After some good results, particularly a great come back to earn a draw (4-12 to 6-6) against Erin Go Bragh, we qualified for the Cup competition. Unfortunately, after a hard fought match against Fingallians, we came out on the wrong side of the result bringing our season to an end. This was another big year for







the U14 Football boys, physically and mentally. We started the year with four teams, then scaled back to three to ease the pressure on numbers playing. This was also the first year to attend team gym sessions, which elicited a great response from our lads to the Youth Athletic Development Programme.









We also had a great year playing in competitions. Our Team 1 had a good year progressing to the Shield semi-final of Division 1. Over 30 players were exposed to Division 1 football through squad rotation prior to the fixed panel competitions. Team 2 had a great season culminating in an epic encounter that saw them overcoming a very strong Ranelagh Gaels A team in the semi-final. The final saw them up against a very talented Cuala A team who had 3 or 4 players that would make most A teams in the county. Our lads put in a great effort but unfortunately fell short on the day. Our Team 3 and Team 4 amalgamated at the back end of 2023. As a result, all of our T4 team players had to step up from Division 8 to Division 5, and ended up reaching the Shield semi-final.

We are all now looking forward to a fun filled Féile year and more football development in 2024.

U15 Football & Hurling

All three football teams were very competitive this year. The U15A Division 1 team played 17 games that included a strong showing in Féile and a narrow cup semi-final defeat by a strong Clontarf team. They also finished joint second in a very competitive Division 1 league. Under the player pathway initiative, the U15 boys were welcomed into, and supported our U16 teams in both their league and championship campaigns to great effect.

The U15B team played in the Division 6 Féile competition, which saw them meet Lucan in the Cup semi-final, and from there on to the final against Kilmacud Crokes, only to be beaten in the last guarter of the game to finish as runners up. They also competed in league Division 5 only to finish runners up, but which sees this group of lads get promoted for the second year in a row.

The U15C team competed in Division 9 of the Féile competition. After a tough group stage, the boys qualified for the semi-final of the shield where they faced a strong O'Dwyers A team away in Balbriggan. The lads put in the performance of the year winning by 6-4 to 2-15 and claiming a place in the shield final. In the final they faced a rematch of the earlier Group match with Castleknock B team. Despite a great effort on the day and battling to the end, a late goal flurry by Castleknock won the day. The lads represented themselves and the club with distinction throughout the year and showed tremendous resilience through a tough Autumn league campaign that will serve them well as they move onward





to the next campaign. Away from competition, the boys enjoyed a start of season trip to a muddy Kilruddery and an end of season overnight to Killary Adventure Centre. Both occasions proved great opportunities to deepen the bonds of friendship between all of the boys.

It was an exciting year for the U15 hurlers as they participated in Féile. The competition ran over several weeks from February to April with some great wins, close losses, and tough challenges. The two Ballyboden teams were super ambassadors for the Club and played some great hurling with only the slimmest margins preventing us reaching the Division 1 finals. In August the group travelled to Killary Adventure Centre for an overnight stay and participated in many activities such as wall climbing, river gorging, raft making, and high ropes. The league commenced after the summer break with the weather having an impact on some of the fixtures. Some new voices and fresh perspectives were brought into the coaching team with the purpose of taking this group to their next stage of development as they enter the U16 group and from there into the minor ranks.

U16A Football

After finishing 2022 on a high as League winners, hopes were high for another good year for the U16A footballers. While results in the early rounds weren't as hoped for, the effort of the lads couldn't be faulted. Towards the end of the league campaign the performances improved and we finished the competition with a great battle away to Lucan Sarsfields where, unfortunately, we were pipped at the post, with Lucan claiming the League title.

Spirits were high as we looked forward to a good championship. As luck would have it, the championship draw saw us begin with a trip to Lucan on the first Saturday in September. The soaring temperatures that day saw the Boden lads also in scorching form- with a fully deserved win by 5-7 to 1-9. This was followed by convincing wins over Cuala & St Oliver Plunketts to top the group. It was two months later when we got to play Na Fianna in the semi-final. Na Fianna came out of the blocks in flying form, and despite the best efforts of the Boden lads we couldn't peg them back- Na Fianna fully deserving of their victory on the day.

U16B Football

After finishing strongly to reach mid-table in Division 4 in 2022, The U16B team resumed again as the only B team in that division in 2023. As a result of injuries across the group, the League campaign was a struggle throughout, with the notable exception of a strong performance and result against Naomh Olaf in May. The team, with the support of some U15s, headed into Championship with the hope of better performances. The team performed very competitively in the Group stages, with a narrow one-point defeat to eventual Cup finalists Saggart, meaning that



the Shield competition was all to play for. The team turned in a season's best performance against Round Towers of Clondalkin in the semi-final, to qualify for the Shield Final against St Judes. The final was a very competitive affair, with the play dictated by an extremely strong wind blowing straight down the field. St Judes came out on the right side of victory with a two-point winning margin at the final whistle.

U16C Football

Following a challenging league campaign finishing mid-table, the U16C team battled hard throughout the Championship to meet Beann Eadair in the semi-final. Our boys came through when it mattered by beating them in a very close game, 3-13 to 4-08. We then faced Erin Go Bragh in the final in December, the match played in desperate weather conditions. The boys delivered a very convincing performance against the strong Clonee side to win the Championship final on a 5-6 to 0-11 score.



U16D Football

The U16D team entered into the G Championship composed of five clubs competing in a league format, with the top two competing in the final. The boys finished the league with 3 wins from 4 matches and played in the final against St Judes in early December at Tymon Park.

With support from a number of our U15 players, the U16D won the final 1-11 to 3-1 in extra time, winning the Championship while also claiming the first ultimately successful campaign for this group.



U16 Hurling

The U16 hurlers had 43 registered players in 2023 and fielded two teams. The start of the season was difficult with many players (circa 50%) absent due to injury and involvement in other sports.

Team 1 topped its championship pool recording three wins and our reward was a home semi-final against Lucan. Once again, injuries played a part as we lost players before the match. Boden had not played for 6 weeks before the semi-final and made a slow start. But gradually they fought their way back into the match. Nearing the final whistle, we were a couple of points down, but the boys dug deep and levelled the game in injury time.

Ultimately this game was settled in Boden's favour with a goal scored in first period of extra time sending us through to the final.

On 2 December we faced Kilmacud Crokes in the U16 Final at Pairc Ui Mhurchu in a repeat of the final when the lads played at U14. Crokes took an early lead and took the upper hand. A goal early in the second half left Boden nine points down. The response from our players was magnificent and we narrowed the gap to one score with a few minutes remaining. Alas, that was as close as we got as a late Crokes goal put the game beyond us.

Team 2 got off to a great start, topping the group after wins against St. Pats, Lucan and a fabulous away performance against Binn Eadair. Winning the Group gave them a home semi-final against St Vincents. The semi-final was a classic, Team 2 had not played for quite some time and this showed as the lads handed St Vincents a 6-point lead. But the boys stormed back and with five minutes left were 5 points to the good! In an absolutely heart breaking last few moments, a late deflected goal saw St Vincents emerge with the narrowest of winning margins.

For the season finale, the boys, coaches, and parents gathered in the club on the evening of 2 December to mark the end of the Championship and also the end of our time as the 2007 juvenile group. They were also there to acknowledge this exceptional group of young men, displaying the qualities associated with the best of Boden; talented, hardworking, exceptionally well behaved, brave and with a never say die attitude that brought them much success. The 2007 Hurlers have won A

& B titles at U14, U15 and were runners up in U16: that's all right by any high standard.






After more than 10 years in existence Siúltóirí Buadáin continues to go from strength to strength with now over 80 members in the hill walking group. Every Saturday we have two walks setting off from the club and this could involve up to 50 walkers in total. Our main walk will generally be a challenging hill walk, normally around 4 to 5 hours, and our second walk will be around 3 to 4 hours with climbs that are a little less challenging. Some of our favourite walks include the Spinc in Glendalough, Djouce, Scarr and Kanturk, Lugnaquilla, the Howth Cliff walk, Maulin to name just a few. Over the last number of years, we have seen a heightened interest in outdoor activities and hill walking has become a very popular pastime and form of exercise.

As a result, Siúltóirí Buadáin has experienced a big surge in interest in joining the group. Over the last couple of years, while we have been able to take in a number of new members, we still find ourselves with a waiting list of over 20 people looking to join. While we would like to be able to take in everyone looking to join, we are unfortunately not able to do so at the moment as we have limited walk leader capacity within the group. This is something we have begun to address and during 2023 we organised a number of walk leader training courses, provided by Mountaineering Ireland. We now have additional walk leaders in the group who, with a little further training and experience will be able to guide walks over the coming year. This should enable us to take in some more new members in 2024 and make inroads into our current waiting list.

Hill walking is a very enjoyable and sociable pastime and one that lends itself to developing strong friendships. However, with tricky terrains

and often unpredictable weather conditions, accidents can happen and we need to be in a position to handle accidents and administer first aid when the need arises. During 2023 we organised 2 first aid training courses for members and more than 40 members of the group took part. We also replenished our first aid supplies during the year to ensure that sufficient first aid supplies are available on all our walks.
