These are just some of the highlights of what goes on inside the club and as you can see there's something for everybody.




Kilmacud Crokes. I think all the managers and players will concur that the club provided whatever support and assistance they sought during the season and that sometimes luck just doesn't go your way.

The Maguire Family are no strangers to Ballyboden St. Enda's - hailing from Firhouse. Gary started at U9 football in Páirc Uí Mhurchú with Tony Lennon and then over to Cherryfield with Marius Martin for the hurling. "I got involved after my three older brothers and sister had already joined. I could have easily been playing with St. Annes instead, only for Sean Fitzmaurice said to my mam that she should bring my oldest brother Peter down to Ballyboden when he was around 10 years old and we all followed" Growing up, Gary played all sports but it was the GAA that he had a grá for "It was a help that we played both hurling and football all the way up in Scoil Treasa, Firhouse Community College and Colaiste Eanna so GAA was always around me - my family and friends played it so I enjoyed it more".

Gary came through the ranks underage in Dublin, starting at Under 14's he progressed through the juveniles, minor and onto the Senior team in 2004. "I made my debut in the league against Kilkenny in Nowlan Park, that was a task in itself. I played for Dublin throughout the years but when Anthony Daly came in as manager with Dublin I saw what needed to be done to step up. I would think it was around this time when I reached a more serious level and it was during this time hurling in the club became more competitive and successful so it all rolled into one"

Having played so many matches throughout the years, Gary chooses a poignant game as his most memorable "There have been hundreds of matches between us all in the family but the one that strikes a cord with is watching my older brother Declan win the All-Ireland Hurling Féile in 1992 in Athenry against Loughrea. I was behind the goal when Declan, who had come on corner back made a goal line save that saved the game for Ballyboden St Enda's. I got lost from my parents at the game and had my name called out over the public address but never heard it because I was wrapped up watching the game and celebrations on the field after. This game probably has greater significance now"

Gary's older brother Declan is never too far from his mind and is remembered fondly in Ballyboden St Enda's each year in the annual Declan Maguire tournament on Stephen's Day "The St. Stephen's day game has been going for a long number of years before Declan passed away in 1998. In 2003, Joe O'Brien the hurling chairman at the time asked the family if we would like to have the St. Stephen's day game in honour of Deco. We were honoured and a trophy was provided at the time by the club. The trophy usually gets presented to the winners every year and then returns to the trophy cabinet in my parents house where its sits beside my All Star award. The support from the club since Declan's accident has

always been deeply appreciated by the whole family and felt each year"

The 2019 season wasn't as good to the hurlers as previous years - where did it all go wrong? "Ah. we lost to St Vincents who were a better team, they outworked us and showed greater hunger than we did. We were somewhat sluggish and gave some soft frees away but still had chances to win the game. It wasn't to be, we would have had to drastically step up if we were to overturn Cuala".

This leads me to Garv's plans for the future. Working as a Project Designer for Hugh Munro & Co. Ltd. Consulting Engineers located in Dublin Port and with a new addition to the family he has decided to hang up the boots "Well I am recently retired from hurling altogether as work and family commitments have become more demanding with two young children at home so I will probably be taking a back seat with my club involvement for the near future. Down the line though I would like to try and help the club focus on the development of young hurlers. Our numbers on the Dublin minor hurling team recently do not appear to be as they used to be which does concern me for the future, I hope I could help improve this again. Ballyboden St Enda's is a brilliant club and is hugely important to the community and has helped me develop as a player throughout the years. It is a great outlet for people to put on the jersey in a team environment and focus on something else away from whatever life stresses there may be. There is always a team playing that anyone can go to support or get involved with".

After 28 years of playing in the blue and white we are sad to see Garv retire but we thank him for all the memories & remember the door is always open to return!

# Coaching & Games Executive Report

2019 was a superb year of coaching activity in Ballyboden. Below is just a snapshot of some of the Coach Education activity that took place during the year.

In January we brought a group of under 15 boys out to represent the club for the first time in a Handball competition in St. Brigids GAA club. Many thanks to our handball coach Gary McNulty for organising the event.

Once again there were a large number of parents who started out their coaching careers by getting involved in the club Academy. We wish these coaches well and hope to see them on the sidelines for many years to come.

Under the Children First Legislation, all coaches working with Juvenile teams must have completed the Foundation Award Course. In order to facilitate this we held three Foundation Award courses in the club during 2019. As an add on to the Foundation Award Courses, we also held a refresher skill development workshops with our coaches in the early part of the season.

It is also compulsory for all Juvenile coaches to attend the Child Protection and Awareness course. We held 8 of these courses in the club during the year and there are more courses planned for late January/early February to ensure that all coaches have completed this course before the 2020 season commences.

An Award One Child Football and Hurling course took place over four nights in March. This course is for coaches working with Go-Games teams.

Once again our club physio Eamon O'Reilly oversaw the BBSE Warm up to Perform workshop back in February. This is a warm up designed for all club teams from under 13 upwards.

Former Dublin Football and Tipperary Hurling analyst Ray Boyne oversaw a workshop titled 'Player Development at the Centre of Everything We Do (A Discussion on Stats). This workshop, which was attended by coaches from all four codes, went through the theory and practical elements around taking

stats and giving accurate feedback to the

Paul Kilgallon, author of the book Coaching Children in Sport, gave one of the biggest attended and most engaging workshops of 2019. Over 100 coaches attended the workshop 'Building your Coaching World'.

Ulster Council GAA Master Tutor Philp Kerr took a small group of football coaches for a practical and theory workshop in June around the area of designing and implementing effective small-sided games.

It was also great to see a large number of coaches from the club attending the numerous workshops, which were held by the Dublin County Board, and other sporting organisations in order to further develop their coaching knowledge.

Despite being level at half time and the huge effort put in, the side lost out on the day on a final score of 0-7 to 1-10.






# Caoga Bliain ag Fás 1969 - 2019

Following months of preparation by the Caoga Blian Ag Fás Committee, under the leadership of John Kirwan, a comprehensive programme which would involve everyone (young and old) in one way or another in celebrating the 'Boden's 50th Anniversary, was launched on 26th November 2018 by Club Chairman Ciarán Maguire.

The initial activity took place in late 2018 with the launch of an Anniversary Club Crest detailing years 1969 - 2019 and the words Caoga Bliain ag Fás. The crest was incorporated in all club merchandise (jerseys, polo shirts, training tops, mugs and car stickers) for the year. A nostalgic Jubilee Calendar, beautifully produced by Neil Buckingham, with photographs recording the



development of the club was published for Christmas 2018. The inaugural 2019 event was in pursuit of the Caoga Bliain ag Fás Committee's objective to develop Handball in the Club. A ten-man team drawn from the U15 hurlers (mentored by Emmet Pullen) participated in a tournament in St. Bridget's GAA Club. The team acquitted themselves well in front of a large attendance and were presented with

medals by Eugene Kennedy (former All Ireland Singles winner).

On 23rd January, a full house listened to An Leacht Caoga Bliain, a thought provoking lecture by Dr. Paul Rouse. The key focus was on the importance of "sport for all and facilitating maximum participation" and Dr. Rouse pleaded for better planning at all levels in the GAA to address the challenges across six themes of Games. Player, Pitch, County, Money and Meaning (i.e. Why do we do what we do in the GAA?).



On February 2nd the Adult Football Tournament kicked off the games' sections 50th anniversary celebrations. The tournament,

dedicated to the memory of the late Padraig Cullinane, former football committee secretary, brought players from minor to senior together to compete in a brilliantly organised competition. The Westmeath team (Aran Waters, Tom Hannifin, Eoghan Monahan, Ruairi Kirwan, James Mc Tiernan, Mick Rvan, Patrick Dunleavy. Kevin Kirwan) lost out to Carlow Rising (Bob Dwan, Darragh Nelson, Mikey Ryan, Fionn Maguire, Ross Mc Cormack, Malachy Codd, Brendan Kavanagh, Conor Cullen) in a great final by 0 - 9 to 1 - 5. Padraig Cullinane's wife Mary, presented the cup to winning captain Bob Dwan and thanked the Football Committee and players for a great day. The great day was also a great marker on the value of each games section commemorating the 50th anniversary, something that was admirably done by each of the other five games sections later in the year.



The Archives Exhibition, displayed in the club hall from the 25th -28th April, and later in Ballyroan library had hundreds of people come to view the history of the Club from its beginnings in 1969 right up to the present day. Many paid return visits such was the array of information displayed. Starting with the minutes of the first meeting held on 18th September 1969 visitors could walk, literally, through the history of the club viewing, in chronological order, the hundreds of photographs of teams, players, mentors, match reports, player profiles, roll of honour for U16 to Senior teams and much more. The archive was the brainchild of Paddy Walsh who had been gathering material for years and whose hard work (assisted by Pat Walsh, Patricia Walsh, Eamon Treacy and Jim Humphreys) produced an exhibition to remember. The archive continued to be a great resource later in the year in providing material for displays at the Ladies Football, Camogie the Gala events. It will continue to be an invaluable source of press reports, programmes, games reports, photographs, yearbooks, AGM reports, club newsletters, oral histories etc. for club members seeking out any aspect of the club's history.



The 50th Anniversary Golf Classic in Edmondstown Golf Club on May 24th gave an opportunity to put an anniversary slant on an annual event. The organising committee led by Liam Deane and Jack Nolan ensured a successful and enjoyable day with forty teams of four competing on a challenging course in immaculate condition. The winning Sports Surgery Clinic Team (Fiachra O'Connor, Finn McGarry, Ray Cosgrove, Gerry White) were closely followed by Holland Property Management (Liam Holland, Andy McEntee, Seamus Given, Declan O'Donnell).



The Hurling 50th Anniversary Poc Fada and Sevens on 24th June involved 3 Poc Fada competitions and a Sevens competition. The day began with The Juvenile Poc Fada where over 50 players from 13-15yrs competed including the very first girl participant, Mallaidh Ni Fhaircheallaigh. Sean Wall (second time), Darragh Ormsby, Arron Campbell and Joe Rafter won out. In the Adult Poc Fada Joe Ryan challenged every player to be a bit more tactical with the winners being Dean Curran, Finian McDonagh and Aaron Coffey. Prior to the Sevens final we had an inaugural U9's Poc Fada Beag, managed by Emer Kennedy Gannon and Jean McNamara, with over 50 players of the future involved and this was won by Mark Cashin. The Sevens was run on a round-robin basis with each team playing four games in splendid sunshine. The Kevin Griffin Cup in memory of former Club President, Chairman, senior hurler. and selector was presented to the winning captain, Cathal Ryan, by Kevin's wife, Dolores with other members of the Griffin family in attendance. The day concluded with the presentations to the 2018 Minor Hurlers and the senior hurlers by John Kirwan, Chair of the Caoga Bliain ag Fás Commitee and Martin Kenny, Club Vice President.



Our Juvenile Girls 50th Celebrations took place over two "street league" blitzes. Huge numbers from U9 to U14 played on Friday 21st (football) and Friday 28th (camogie) turned out to compete on teams named after local estates and areas in a throwback to the street leagues that were such a feature of the club in the 1980s. Dave Mellon's famous barbecue did a great trade on both evenings while on the field the girls served up a great evening of hardfought competition.



Not to be outdone, the Juvenile Boys 50th Celebrations on Friday 16th August had over 250 boys from U9 to U16 in Páirc Uí Murchú and Cherryfield to celebrate Caoga Craic. With events that included obstacle courses, GAA Clay Pigeon Shooting, Giant Jenga and "baby hurling" (24" hurls and a large sliothar) a hugely enjoyable day was had by all.



The Ladies Football 50th Celebrations on August 24th started with a very competitive sevens tournament over the course of the afternoon with 150 players from under 15 to senior mixed across teams participating. The evening celebrations moved to the clubhouse where Stephen Campbell had taken photos from the archive and created a montage of giant prints of teams from across the years including every juvenile team from recent years. The only non-team photo, looking over the evening, was a picture of Bill Daly who was instrumental in the creation, and in leading the success, of Ladies Football in the Club. No doubt he'd have approved of the evening's highlight where the All-Ireland winning teams from 2004/2005 were acknowledged and each player presented with a silver salver to mark the occasion. Speeches on the night came from Cathal O'Toole, Ladies Football Committee Chair; John Kirwan, Chair of Coiste Caoga Blian ag Fás and Ciaran Maguire Club Chairman.

A very special event August 31st was the 50th Anniversary Mass for Deceased Members. 





The night was one of reacquaintance, reminiscence, catch up and was a huge success as stalwarts of Camogie in the club, past and present were all represented.

The Boden Theatre Group undertook to produce a very special show to mark the club's 50th. And this they did in some style with "50 Shades of Boden" on 13th-16th November under the direction of Mick Keville. A cast of 34 presented the story of the club from the first seeds sown in Ned Murphy's head to form a club, to its present-day achievements. The production, consisting of music, parodies, dance and humour by established and new members of the group made for a show, enjoyed by over six hundred people over four nights, that emphasised the community that is the Club.



Fifty from 50, an idea from Club PRO Sinéad O'Dea and delivered by Neil Buckingham (design/website) and Cliona Mellett (FB/IG) profiled fifty club members, with one profile shared on social media on each day of the fifty days leading up to the Club's Gala Gathering. The fifty members selected came from across the four codes and from every decade. The initiative highlighted the breadth of the club's membership in terms of origins and

contributions to the development of the club.

A thoroughly professionally produced Anniversary Video by Sinéad O'Dea was aired which captured clearly and succinctly the origin and the growth of the club and its contribution to the community it serves.

An Anniversary song composed by Neil Buckingham was also launched on the night, the lyrics of which are on the back cover. Ciarán Maguire, Club chairman addressed the Gathering and reflected on the journey the club had taken. Gradam an Cathaoirligh were presented to Kathleen O'Sullivan (for resurrecting Camogie in 1983), Noel Sheridan (for his work as mentor, committee member

# **Juvenile Ladies** Report

#### **FAST GROWING**


With over 350 girls now registered to play between the ages of U9 and U14, ladies football and camogie are among the fastest growing sections of Ballyboden St Endas. A survey of the juvenile ladies membership earlier this year showed that approximately 85% of our girls are dual players, which is reflected in the huge number of girls teams which were fielded in Go Games (up to U13) and in league and championship (U13 and U14) by Ballyboden St Endas in 2019 – with 26 teams playing ladies football and 22 teams playing camogie.

#### **CELEBRATING 50 YEARS**

To mark our 50th year in 2019, the girls celebrated the club's rich heritage in both codes with specially staged 'street leagues' played over two memorable weekends in June with the participating teams named to hark back to the origins of the club. First up was ladies football, with approximately 250 girls playing in 25 mixed age teams at Páirc Uí Mhurchú and Cherryfield on a glorious June evening, while over 160 girls in 16 teams took part in the camogie competition the following Friday. Always a highlight of the Boden juvenile ladies' year, 2019's blitzes were a great way to celebrate the success and contribution of our ladies footballers and camogie players in the life of the club over the past 50 years and for many years to come.

































#### **GO GAMES**

The Ballyboden pipeline into competitive ladies football and camogie continues to thrive! This year, we fielded 39 teams in Go Games: 21 in football and 18 in camogie. These numbers were supported by very strong attendances at training reported across the board, with 50+ girls now the norm among all the age groups. In addition to the Go Games, many groups also took 'away days' travelling for games to as far afield as Knocknacarra, Crookedwood, Oulart the Ballagh, Moneygall, while hosting teams from Danesfort and Abbeyknockmoy among others. There were also trips to Croke Park to support the Dublin Ladies footballers for their '3-in-a-Row'.

















#### ON FIELD SUCCESS

The 2019 celebrations off the field were matched by the Boden girls' successes on it. Leading the way were our U14 Division 1 Camogie team, winners of the Division 1 Dublin Féile, which they followed with a memorable All Ireland campaign in Cork which took them all the way to the national shield semi-final. Meanwhile in football, it was our

U14C footballers who kept the Boden flag flying, winning the Division 7 Championship Shield. Our U13s also had a very successful season with the Division 1 teams completing league and championship doubles in both football and camogie, while elsewhere U13B camogie went to a championship semi-final and the U13C footballers made it all the way through to their Championship final where

they lost out to Na Fianna.



This year 100 boys played in nine teams, in both codes, and were entered into three Go Games groups. IT WAS A YEAR OF CHANGE IN THE CAMOGIE SECTION WITH NEW MANAGEMENT. NEW COMMITTEE AND PLAYERS RETURNING FROM RETIREMENT TO FORM A 4TH SENIOR TEAM FOR CHAMPIONSHIP. THERE WAS ALSO A CHANGE WHERE THE CLUB FIELDED TEAMS AT UNDER 15 FOR THE FIRST TIME IN A NUMBER OF YEARS.

#### Senior A

The Senior A Camogie team played out a total of 25 games over the year starting with the Leinster League in early February where they made the semi-finals.

The Dublin League ran from March to May and was a mixed bag with 4 wins and 4 losses. The girls though were improving throughout and worked hard through the summer with guest coaches focussing on skills development along with a team building weekend away in



Limerick and challenge games against country opposition. All the hard work paid off with a great run in Championship with 6 successive victories earning them a home Semi-Final against St. Judes. The championship is where this group really took off. The panel of enthusiastic Camogie players meant there was more than enough for one team and with some experienced players persuaded to dust off the helmets, the two squads were complete.

The newly enlarged squad trained through the summer in preparation for playing in both the Junior 3 and Junior 4 Championships. Both teams competed admirably in the championship with both teams making shield finals. Ultimately it was disappointment for the C team but joy for Senior D team in winning their own shield final.

The Minor A's were confident going into their championship which got under way at the end of October. They started well with 2 victories resulting in a home semi-final against Kilmacud.

However on the day our girls found it difficult to get a foothold in the game and didn't play to their potential. Crokes got their revenge this year having been beaten in the final last year by this panel.

So in the end it was disappointment for this group with many of them having been together since nursery and having achieved great success over the years winning Féile, leagues and county championships, with some of the panel having two minor county championship medals to their credit.

It was disappointment also for the Minor B's. After 2 good victories in getting them to the Semi-Final they couldn't get to the next stage and bowed out along with the A's.



At the start of 2019 there weren't quite enough numbers from the '03 year to make up an U16 panel and with the club transitioning to an U15 grade for the first time in years, it made sense to combine the 2003 and 2004A girls into one large training group with a view to competing at U16 with the support of some '04 girls on each match day. The league campaign got off to a great start for the girls, with pulsating one point victories against Kilmacud and Lucan. After mixed results in the rest of the games, the girls ended up second in the league, albeit one or two other clubs failed to complete all their fixtures. A fair reflection and reward for the way they played throughout. The U16 Championship saw our girls winning their 2 group matches to earn a home tie against Lucan in the semi-final. However as with the Senior A's and Minor A's, the home draw did not work out to their



advantage and the girls went down to Lucan.

The U15 league campaign ran from February through to the middle of April and included wins over Plunkett's, Cuala, Crokes, Castleknock and Whitehall before a league decider away against Lucan late in May. In a very tough game the girls had to dig deep to come away with victory and a third Division 1 league title in a row.

Championship rolled around after the summer and the girls battled their way through to the final in Abbotstown. However this was a match where the girls just never got to the level of performance that they'd reached in the past and Lucan came out on top by two points. We're now looking forward to another successful year at U16 and beyond. Long may they continue to play and enjoy their camogie!



Having finished second in the league in 2018, the U15B girls were moved up into Division 3 which was a more competitive division and included both A and B teams. The strength of character was demonstrated throughout the 7 league games with 3 wins and 4 losses with the team finishing a respectable mid table position. One more win would have seen the team joint third, but that was not to be. Every Saturday morning throughout the year we gather at the clubhouse at 9am and head off to walk the hills somewhere in the Dublin or Wicklow mountains and sometimes even further afield. We have good numbers each Saturday throughout the year and we regularly have over 30 members for our walks during the summer months. For those who don't want to do a long walk there is generally the option of a shorter walk each Saturday morning. Our hill walks take us to the most scenic spots around Dublin and Wicklow like Djouce, Tibradden, Trooperstown, the Spinc, Sorrell and Black Hill, Glencree, Aughavanagh, Hollywood, Tinnahealy, Lough Dan, Lugnaquilla, Howth Head and Camaderry to name just a few.

The year produced many fantastic highlights. We had a wonderful trip along the Barrow way starting at Goresbridge, passing through Graignemanagh and finishing up in St. Mullins. However, the main highlight had to be our away trip to Croatia in October. A total of 50 travelled and we stayed in a beautiful resort overlooking the Adriatic Sea. The resort was close to Trogir, a UNESCO protected town, reachable by water taxi from the resort. The resort was also close to the beautiful city of Split with its lovely streets and squares. We were very fortunate to make contact with Pat Herbert, who, through his company Enjoy Dalmatia, organizes guided walking holidays in Croatia. Pat would be well known to many people in the club as he played senior hurling with Ballyboden St. Endas and also played with Limerick. The walks in Croatia were across stunning terrain and were quite challenging as

they involved some steep climbs and descents. However, there were 2 walks on each day and people could choose a slightly easier and shorter walk but with equally stunning views across the Dalmatian coastline. Pat had also organised experienced and friendly guides who ensured that we were safe at all times. Croatia is a truly beautiful country, with very friendly people and an ideal destination for a hill walking holiday.

We had many other highlights during the year. The annual Moonlight Challenge in support of the Glen of Immal Mountain Rescue Team was again supported by Na Súiltóirí when 10 members completed the 26 km route around Glendalough on a November night with the aid of head torches. A large number of our walkers also participated in the Darkness into Light walk in May in aid of Pieta House and 10 of our members did a further stage on the Camino de Santiago during the year covering the stretch from Leon to Ponferrada.

We finished 2019 with a well-attended Christmas party in the Yellow House and with our traditional Dodder walk on 21st December from the clubhouse to the Grand Canal Dock. We have already planned our away trip for 2020. A group of around 50 members will travel to Mayrhofen in Austria at the end of August for a week of hill walking in the Zillertal Alps. Everyone is looking forward to a week of good walking and the normal ceol agus craic in the evenings.

We would like to thank the club chairman Ciarán Maguire for his support during the year and also Mick Farrell and his bar staff for always being so accommodating to us throughout the year.

We are always looking for new members and anyone interested in joining us on the hills during 2020 can try it out by meeting us at

# **DERMOT 'DIGGER' MANLEY**

The club community woke on the morning of November 14th to the shock news that club member Dermot Manley had suddenly passed away the previous evening.

To many in Ballyboden he was just known as "Digger", "a trusted teammate", "a soldier on the pitch; a gentleman off it"



Digger grew up immersed in the GAA and it wasn't long until he was playing hurling and football and building lifelong friendships. He was fortunate to be a member of successful teams in both codes and had the distinction of playing Senior in both codes. Having Mayo and Monaghan connections, it was only natural that football would be his favoured sport, playing at the highest level in the club. He was a brilliant attacking half back and the highlight of his football career was a Dublin Senior Football Championship medal in 2009.

Work and life commitments meant he didn't have as much time to pursue his football passion but he did find time to play Junior Football in 2019. He was also a fine hurler, starring at half back and mid-field, achieving great success at championship level. Among his haul were an Under 16 Hurling Championship (2003) and Under 21 Hurling Championships (2006 and 2007). A senior B championship followed in 2012 and he was part of the panel that won Senior A Championships. At schools level, he was a member of the Dublin Colleges Team that won the Dublin's first Croke Cup in 2006, adding an All Ireland Medal to his chest.

To all his clubmates and friends he was just "Digger". He enjoyed the simple things in life like eating crackers and cheese and having super competitive games of FIFA. He inspired his friends through his exploits in sport, work and by his impact on those around him. One friend described him as "the smartest man I know, with the silliest sense of humour".





He had a unique ability to generate craic from the simple things, from his humorous take on everyday human interactions, making a mockery of modern pop music, his impressions of some of his favourite characters from Lord of the Rings and Harry Potter or his impersonation of hilarious fictional characters. This was typical of Dermot as he always looked to enjoy most engagements and ensure that everyone else was enjoying themselves at the same time. Despite all this devilment, you could always trust his judgement and he was someone who his friends always looked to for advice when faced with a difficult decision.

All in Ballyboden will miss Digger Manley and there is no doubt he will be most fondly remembered by all his club mates and friends. But, of course, he will be mostly missed by his heart broken family; by his beloved wife, Kylie, his parents John and Rosemary, his siblings Sean, Paul, Ciara, Eimear and Aoife, his father-in-law Gabriel, mother-in-law Marian, brothers-in-law Damien, Gabriel and Elvin, sisters-in-law Lindsay and Chanelle, his nieces, nephews and all his extended family.

The turnout at his funeral in Our Lady of Good Counsel spoke volumes about his popularity and the effect he had in such a short life - those who knew Dermot had lost a shining light in their lives. Michael Darragh Macauley summed it up most eloquently in an interview on RTE after this year's Leinster final success when he said that "he was one of the best humans I ever met. If we had a few more like him, the world would be a better place"

# **Boden Theatre Group**

After a break over the summer, the group came back in September to take on the huge task of marking the club's 50th anniversary. Mick Keville, Ger Reynolds, Cormac O'Farrell, Declan O'Brien and Owen McLoughlin wrote



all the comedy sketches and songs that would become an original two-hour show called "50 Shades Of Boden". The play was a celebration of the club and its history through comedy sketches and songs. Mick, as director was keen to get as many people involved in this historic event and looked outside the group for other club members to join in the frivolity, fun and experience of treading the boards. It really was our pleasure to have been part of the club's 50th anniversary and we look forward to the next 50 years and hope to still be bringing quality drama and comedy to the loyal audiences who continue to support our group year after year. 

Last season got off to a promising start, winning six championship games in a row. Unfortunately, this came to a disappointing finale when we were beaten by local rivals St Judes in the Semi-final, a game that we felt we left behind us. We are eager to get stuck into the season this year and hopefully advance to a final and win it!!
