Capital Developments get the Green Light

IT'S ALL systems go in 2005 as the club receives a Christmas boost with the news that planning permission has been granted by South Dublin County Council (SDCC) for an all-weather pitch and two grass playing pitches at Sancta Maria as well as for the construction of a Skills Wall at the Greenacres end of Páirc Uí Mhurchú. In addition, technical issues surrounding the construction of dressing rooms at Knocklyon Park, Ballycullen have been resolved and the way is now clear for work to commence on this project.

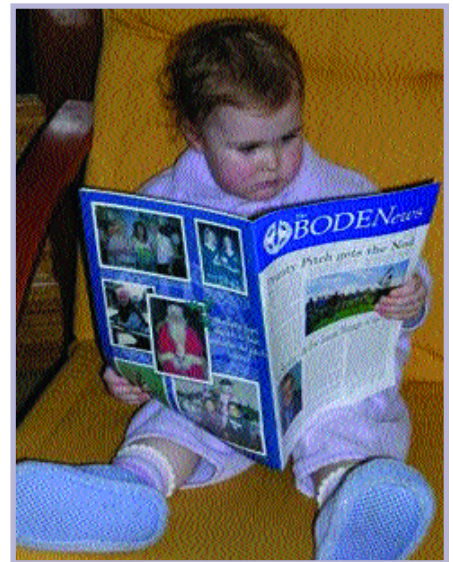
General Manager Noel Sheridan said "it's the news we've been waiting for and we are delighted that we can now make progress on commencing the construction of badly needed facilities."

The provision of these facilities will involve an investment of several

million euro and is a major statement of confidence by the club. The new resources will add greatly to the recreational amenities of the area.

Grant aid from the National Lottery has been acquired for the Sancta Maria and Ballycullen developments and thanks to the initiative of John Ryan and his team who organised a very successful Golf Classic in 2003, substantial funds have been raised for the Skills Wall. The balance of the expenditure will be met from the club's own resources.

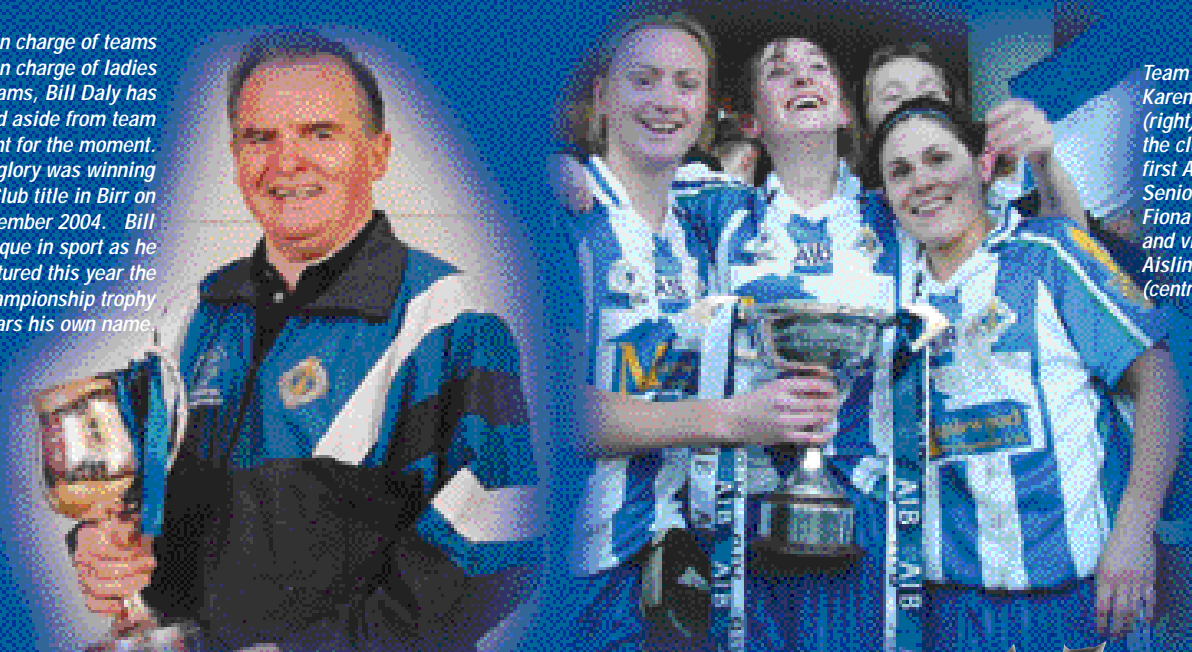
Noel Sheridan says "the projects outlined will impose a huge management challenge for the club as work on all three will be progressing more or less simultaneously. However, I am confident the club can rise to the challenge. I would like to thank all who have contributed to the process."

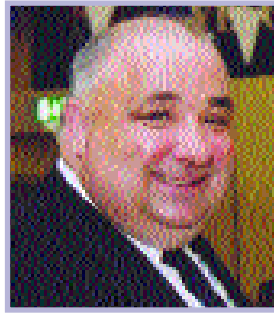

A WORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

All-Ireland Ladies football champions for the first time; four senior teams reach county finals; championship successes in all four sports; we reached all four Dublin Féile finals; a range of activities to celebrate Camogie centenary year that no other club could match and progress on the development front that is recorded on the front page of this issue.

Winning our first All-Ireland Club title was a momentous achievement and I congratulate Bill Daly, Pat Nash, Bobby O'Sullivan, Brian O'Regan, Brid Spillane, Karen Hopkins and all the players. To Bill who has retired from managerial duties for the time being, I would like to say a special word of thanks. He has put Ladies Football on the map in the club and fully deserved the All-Ireland honour. The championship win of the Under 10s led by Eugene Duffy and Pat McGrath ensures that we are starting as we mean to continue.

It was almost a female double again this year as in 2000 and 2001 but a single point denied P. J. Donohue, Anne Scallan, Orna Lucey, Paul Crosbie and senior 'A' camogie players but the success of the Junior 'A' team under Donal Regan and Micheál Glynn meant that Centenary Year was not without a camogie championship success. The programme of events to celebrate the historic year was truly memorable and its all-embracing nature touched on all elements of the club – past, present and future. Well done to Gerry O'Sullivan, Irene Kirwan, Nuala Pope, Anne Scallan, Mona O'Sullivan and all involved.

In hurling, it took a star-studded UCD team to deny our senior team our first title at this level. But winning the League was a significant achievement and a reward for the work of Paudie Ó Neill, John Ryan, Paddy Corrigan and the players. Championship wins were recorded at Junior B (Martin Donohue, Ollie Hickey, Michael Kennedy, John Healy, Hugh O'Neill) and Under 15 levels (Joe Young, Eithne and Michael McGarry) as well as a Dublin Féile na nGael title (Paul Daly, Francis Sharkey, Aidan Kennedy, Robert Woodcock, Conor Doolan).

While in football, well done to the senior team who also made it to the County Final under Dan O'Sullivan and Neil Brennan. The success of "Eddie's Eagles" could not be matched as they swept all before them in Dublin – top marks to Eddie O'Sullivan, Peter Shovlin and squad. The Under 16As championship win under Liam Carter, Conor Doolan, Matt Fletcher and Helen McGuinness was an early season success and augurs well for the minor season in 2005 and beyond. At the time of writing we await the Under 21 C Football final.

Those were among the highlights and the full roll of honour is contained elsewhere in the Boden News.

On and off the field, the club was well represented at a variety of levels – county, province and national. It is vital that we always reflect the best that is in our club and the conduct of all members – players, officials and supporters must be exemplary at all time.

Sadly, the year saw the passing of our esteemed former President, and vice-president and trustee at the time of his passing, Kevin Cardiff. 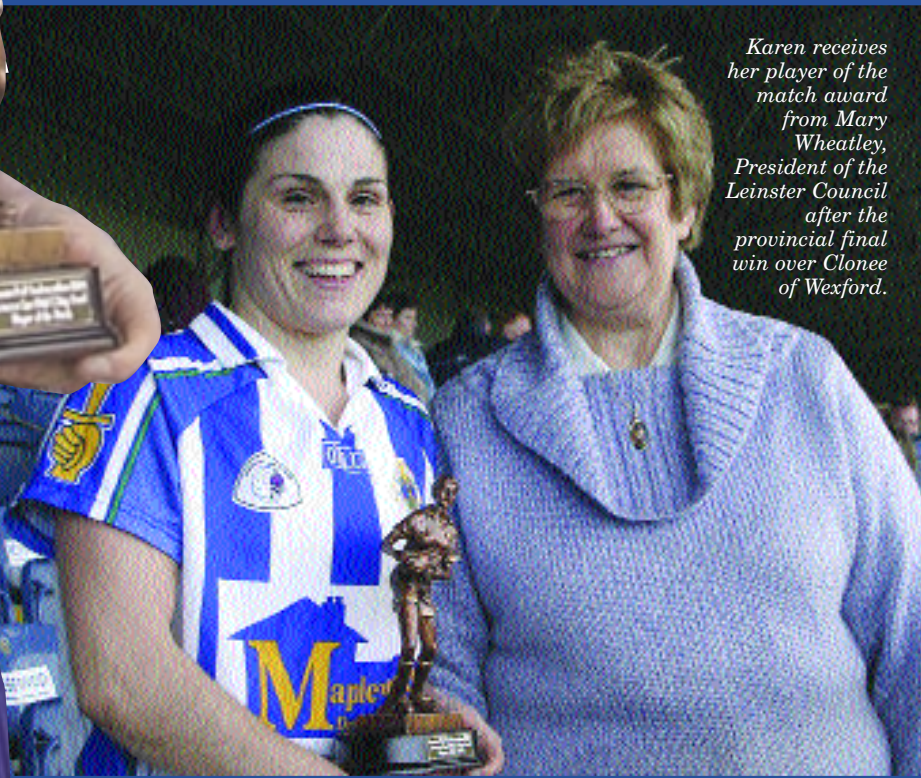

THE CLOCK at the road end of St Brendan's Park, Birr ticked its way down from 30 seconds as Fiona Ní Chorcoráin bore down on the Donoughmore goals. The right boot made contact with the leather and split the posts to a resounding cheer.

We weren't going to be denied now and for the first time in the club's history – we bore the name – **All-Ireland Club Senior Ladies Football Champions**. It was a gripping finale to a great game and the celebrations were suitably racy.

For the fifth time in 2004, Karen Hopkins had the honour of collecting the winners trophy. A truly remarkable achievement. Before the year would extinguish, Karen would make a sixth trip to the winners rostrum, this time to collect the Dublin league title.

The team led by Bill Daly, Pat Nash, Brian O'Regan, Bobby O'Sullivan and Brid Spillane commenced the season by winning the first Holyrood Cup – Ladies Gaelic Football National Tournament in Bundoran, Co Donegal in February 2004.

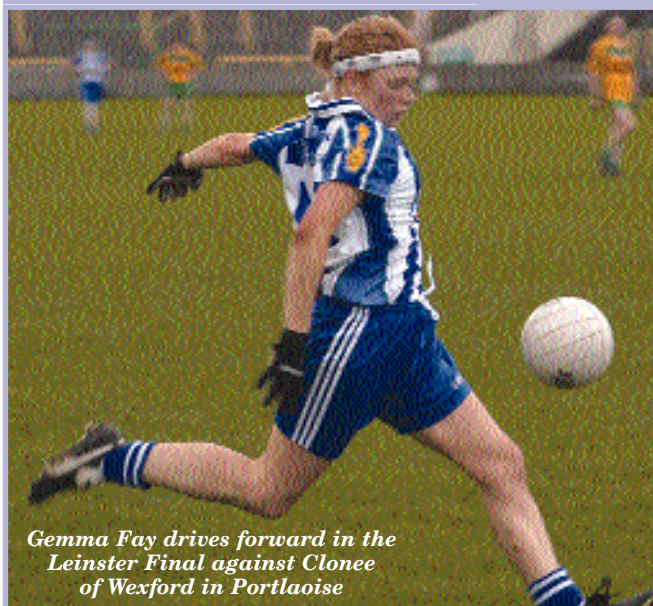

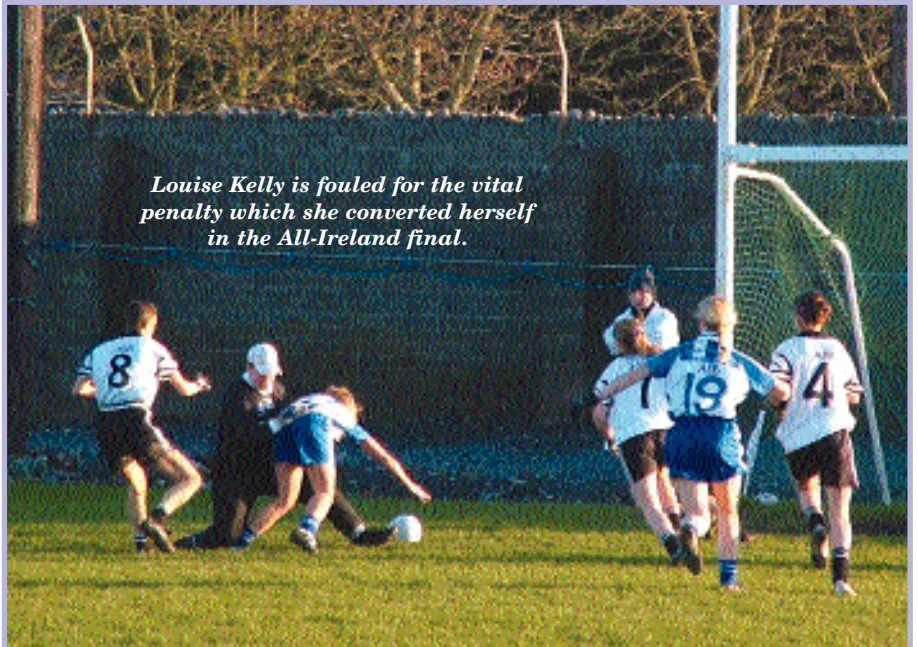
Dublin League/League Cup

A ten match winning streak saw the team capture the league and cup competitions.

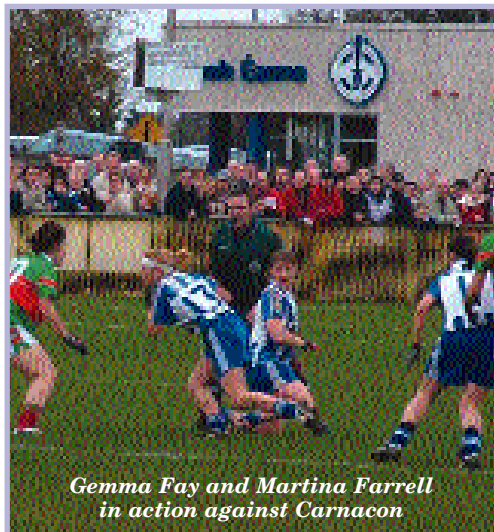
In all the team played 28 matches and held 84 training sessions and were unbeaten in all 15-a-side matches from Donegal to Dublin.

Camogie Centenary Year



History of Camogie in Ballyboden St Enda's

Believe it or believe it not, camogie in Ballyboden St Enda's is moving into its 40th year.

Fiona Ní Shúilleabháin has been going back to our roots. But first a look back to the game's beginnings in 1904.



Rugadh camógaíocht sa bhliain 1904. Bhí mná na hÉireann tar éis múscaíl i dtaobh a cinniúint i Náisiúin na nGael.

Fiche bliain níos luaithe, bhí na fir tar éis an rud céanna a dhéanamh. Thug siad an Cumann Lúthchleas Gael chuig léibhéal nua. Rinne said foirméaltacht ar na céadta bliain de traidisiún spóirteanna agus caitheamh aimsire na hÉireann.

Bhí an Cumann Lúthchleas Gael, an Conradh na Gaeilge agus cumannacha eile ar nós seo ag maidneachan ar réimeas nua i Stair na hÉireann. Lán le spiorad na hóige i leith spóirt, teanga agus amhránaíocht na Éireann, mheall siad mná agus cailíní chucu. Ag an am seo, tús an fichiú haois, bhí mná ag tógáil a háit in Ollscoileanna, Cóláistí Traenáil Múinteoirí agus an Stát Seirbhís.

Ag fáil réidh leis an tuairim nár chóir do mhná spóirt a imirt thosaigh siad ar a ranaíocaíocht fhéin chuig an Éire Éireannach. Bhí bunús an chluiche Camógaíochta bunaithe i mBaile Átha Cliath i Craobh A' Chéitinnigh, an brainse Céitinn den Chonradh. Sa bhliain 1903, bhí foirneacha peile agus iománaíocht iontacha acu.

Sa bhliain céanna scríobh grúpa, le Máire Ní Chinnéide mar cheannaire (Céimí an Ollscoil Ríoga), rialacha an chluiche Camógaíochta bunaithe ar rialacha iománaíocht ach le cúpla athraithe chun oirreadh le haghaidh imritheoirí baineannach. Bhí Séan Ó Ceallaigh ('Sceilig'), i ndiaidh Aire Oideachais don Dara Dáil, scoláir Tadhg Ó

Donnchú ('Torna'), a tháinig suas leis an hainm 'Camóguidheacht' le haghaidh an chluiche nua, agus Séamas Ó Braonáin, níos deanaí Stiúrthóir Radio Éireann, in éineacht léi.

Nuair a bhí na rialacha socraithe ar, thosaigh cailíní Craobh A' Chéitinnigh ag traenáil i bPáirc Drom Conrach agus níos deanaí Páirc an Fhionn Uisce. Tharla é seo

sa Samhraidh sa bhliain 1903. Déartar gur thóg siad a chamáin leo faoi cótaí fada ionas nach bhfeicfear iad. Ní raibh siad ag iarraidh daoine ag spocadh astu. Rinne siad a traenáil go luath ar maidin i bhfad ó súile an phobail.

Bhí na chéad oifigí de Chumann Camógaíochta Uí Céitinn, Máire Ní Chinnéide (Uachtarán), deirfiúr Torna Cáit

Ní Dhonnchadna (Captaen) agus Nóra de Róiste (Rúnaí).

Bhí an chéad Cumann Camógaíochta i gCúige Uladh, déanach sa bhliain 1903, tosaithe san Íúr le M. Laverty ina Chaptaen agus Rose McAnulty ina Rúnaí. Tá an onór ag an chlub seo, as an Dún, a bheith mar an dara Cumann Camógaíochta in Éirinn.

Faoi 1904, i mBaile Átha Cliath, bhí siad in ann a rá go raibh Cumann Camógaíochta eile acu. Cúchulainns ab ainm dó. D'imir siad i gcoinne an fhoireann Chéitinnigh ina chéad cluiche poiblí. Imríodh é i "Talamh Cumann Talamháioch na Mí" (anois Páirc Tailteann) san Uaimh, ar an seacht-déagú d'Iúil, 1904. Bhuaigh foireann Chéitinnigh ar scór cúl amháin in aghaidh nialas.

Turning to Ballyboden St Enda's

THE 'SEVENTIES

Margaret Francois started camogie in Ballyboden in 1976. She became Camogie Chairperson in the club and she trained both the juvenile and senior teams. Maeve O'Sullivan assisted her in this. Maeve was married to Sean O'Sullivan, one of the founding members of the club.

Margaret's husband also served for a time as Chairperson of Ballyboden St. Endas.

In the late 1970s, Maeve O'Sullivan became Chairperson of the Camogie Committee and she enticed players back into the club and early in 1983 she started a junior camogie team.

THE 'EIGHTIES

May 1983

Around this time talks began between Kathleen O'Sullivan and Maeve O'Sullivan. Kathleen wanted to start up camogie in Loreto NS, Grange Road.

As well as speaking with Maeve, Kathleen also spoke with Sean Flynn, Chairperson of the Juvenile Committee. He supported her wish by supplying her with hurleys

and sliotars. This is when the legend of Ballyboden St. Endas camogie really began.

1984-1985

The Dublin Camogie Board sent out Nell McCarthy, famous trainer, to the Hermitage for six months. Nell was the woman who helped Dublin win ten All-Ireland titles (1957-1966) and she is the aunt of Niall McCarthy who won an All-Ireland senior hurling medal with Cork this year. She began training with fifty girls, teaching them the basic skills of camogie.

Two teams were entered into leagues, an Under 11 team and an Under 12 team in 1984. An Under 10 team also trained regularly.

Kathleen wrote to numerous parents seeking help in looking after teams. Three people came forward to help; Phil O'Neill (who later became Camogie Chairperson and senior player), Noel Sheridan who is still active in the club and Anne Keoghan, who was a member of the Wexford team at the time.

Many of the people who had played in the seventies returned as coaches – Doreen O'Sullivan, Úna Scollard and Nóirín Mulvey.

Juveniles

Kathleen O'Sullivan along with the other coaches ran a street-league in May and June. It was a tremendous success. The Rathfarnham Garda donated a beautiful cup and medals to the competition. Usually Joe Young presented the medals.

As well as that the children often went on trips. They went to Croke Park on All-Ireland Day and visited other clubs. They also had a Christmas Party and many discos.

They had a sponsored walk every year and even at this early stage they were supporting themselves.

The First Junior Team

In September 1984, they had enough members to put together a junior C camogie team. The majority were women who had

played before in the club and girls who were too old to play juvenile. Some of the girls were thirteen and fourteen years of age. Kathleen O'Sullivan and Noel Sheridan were in charge of this team. Noel was also training the juvenile team at the time. They won the league and championship in 1985 – first championship camogie success.

The First Intermediate Team

In 1985 the Presentation Club disbanded and nine of its players joined Ballyboden St. Endas. Kathleen entered them into the Intermediate B competition. In 1986 they won the championship at this grade.

New Pitch

In 1987, Ballyboden St. Endas received the use of a pitch in Cherryfield and because of that the number of young people playing in the club grew appreciably. By 1990 there was approximately ten juvenile teams in the club. In 1988, the club attained senior A camogie status when we won the senior B league.

The Nineties to the Present

This was the clubs best decade yet!

Eight Dublin Féile Titles!

The first was in 1989 and more were to follow. We won the first All-Ireland Féile na nGael in 1999. We went on to claim our first Senior Championship title in 1999 and added two more in 2000 and 2001. In 1992, the club won Intermediate and Junior championships on the same day and in 2004 we won our third Junior A Championship title.

Camogie has never been stronger in the club and we look forward to building on that record in the next century.

Eagraíocht náisiúnta is ea Cumann Camógáiocta na nGael arb iad a bhunaidhmeanna agus a chuspóirí ná cluichí agus caithimh aimsire Gaelacha a chur chun cinn, eolas ar shaíocht ár gcultúr dúchais a chothú agus spiorad pobail a mhúscailt i measc mhuintir uilig na hÉireann. Tá na haidhmeanna sin riachtanach fós.

The Year 2004...

Pride of place must go to the Junior A team (Micheál Glynn, Donal Regan) for ensuring that the club had a championship success in Centenary Year.

A marvellous victory over Good Counsel was recorded but on the same day the Galtymore Road crew turned the game around and beat the Senior A team (P. J. Donohue, Paul Crosbie, Orna Lucey, Anne Scallan) by a single point. The side did enjoy success capturing the Naomh Jude Centenary Floodlit cup and a Leinster Sevens in Mullingar.

On the juvenile front despite the best efforts of the teams - two of whom reached championship finals – Under 16A (Nuala Pope, Eileen McNamara, John Byrne) and Under 15 (Quentin Nea, Dave O'Driscoll) championship success eluded us.

The Under 14A team (Micheál Glynn, Clarinda Noonan, Sheila O'Shea) put in a tremendous effort in reaching the Féile final and this work will stand them in good stead for the future. The U12A (Mick Kennedy, Deirdre O'Reilly, Carol Ann Woulfe, Richard Fitzpatrick, Jackie Boyd Lyons) won the 7-a-side indoor Centenary Tournament organised by Skerries Harps.

The programme was an outstanding success and it is fair to say that all targets were attained. The following pictorial record is but a selection of some of the main highlights.

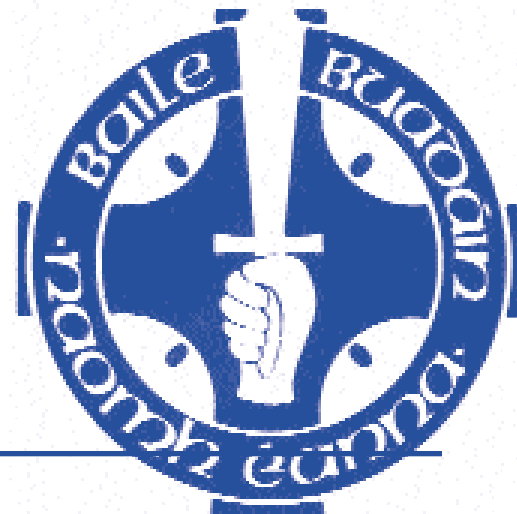

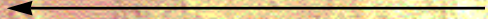

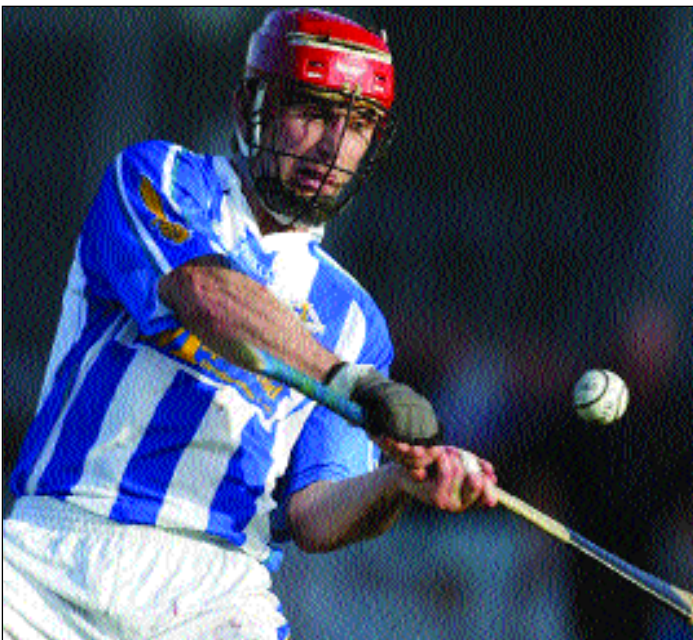
