Great Championship Winning Weekend!

The first Sunday in October brought rich pickings for the Club with the Junior Footballers capturing the County Junior C Championship and the Senior Camogie team delivering three in a row County Senior Camogie Championship titles. There was a real celebratory mood in a thronged Clubhouse on Sunday night.

Commenting on the wins, Club Chairman, Terry O'Neill, said " Great credit goes to all those involved in the wins. It is well known



that winning a Junior Championship in Dublin is very difficult and this team has done it in style. A junior championship win is a great sign for the Club because there is always a great mix of players, young and old, on the team and it demonstrates that the Club is not just about the senior teams.

The Camogie win was thoroughly deserved and one has only to look at the achievements of this group of players in both Ladies football and camogie over the last ten years to know that they are a very talented group who have brought great success to the Club. It was clear from the celebrations on Sunday night that there is great goodwill among Club supporters for both the Junior football and Camogie teams and I think that is due in no small measure to the management and players on both teams who have a great Club ethos and know the importance of sharing their success with the Club supporters".

Senior A Camogie Team make it 3-in-a row

BBSE 1 – 11 St Vincents 1 – 5

An emphatic second half saw Boden reverse a one goal deficit to outscore their rivals by 1-7 to 0-1 in the second half and capture the second three in a row in the club's history. Vincents looked to be in command for the first 20 minutes when they led by 1-4 to a point – the goal coming from Eimear Brannigan but a super point by Anne Griffin from a sideline



netted two points – the first such score in adult camogie since the new rule change in 2012.

In the second half Denise McGrath in her first Dublin senior final captured the headlines with a smashing 1-2. Boden's defence was unbeatable none more so than captain Sile nic Coitir between the sticks. Dearbhla Brennan was another to shine as the club collected its 8th Senior Camogie title.

The team is now through to the Leinster Club final on Sunday 28 October against either Oulart the Ballagh or Mullinavat.

Senior Footballers must do it again Wed night v Crokes

Although they failed to score from play for 51 minutes, Boden's senior footballers pulled off a deserved draw against hotly fancied Kilmacud Crokes – 2-8 to 0-14. Boden enjoyed a terrific start with Andrew Kerin goaling after only 2 minutes. The corner forward was Boden's saviour on the night kicking all bar a point of Boden's second half tally of 1-3. Stephen Hiney was outstanding in the first half and Mark O'Sullivan put in another excellent shift. Crokes wing back Cian O'Sullivan did a lot of damage and scored four points and substitute Mark Vaughan found the range with 5 points in the second half. Click here for full report



Speaking to the BodenZine after the game manager Liam O'Dwyer said "it was a fantastic performance. Alright we struggled to get scores but Crokes have the best six backs in Dublin club football. We started strong but losing Declan (O'Mahony) after a minute was a huge blow. But I'm optimistic we can rise to the occasion in the replay."

Mark O'Sullivan has been through the mill for Boden. Sporting a bloodied lip, the corner back commented "we lost our way a bit in the last 10 minutes and they got a run on us. But we battled hard and it's now down to who can recover better by Wednesday."

Recovery will be very much on the mind of the manager with Declan O'Mahony sustaining a deep gash to his leg. Physical Therapist Hammi Cunningham said "we made sure to clean the wound after it happened. Declan will have a number of stitches and it's a question of how much swelling there will be on the leg over the next few days. But there's a good chance he might make it."

Tuesday Night Bingo


The Bingo jackpot is still waiting to be won and is €850 tomorrow night. Bingo is on in the club every Tuesday Night at 20:30. All welcome!
