She was brilliant'

And so to next year. Over the years, this team has raised the bar for all other teams at this age level. This year, the level of competetion has been really strong. It is now our job to work twice as hard to get back on top. And be in no doubt, these girls will rise to the challenge and raise that bar!!!


Hard luck also to the U14B's and U13A's who also went down in their respective semi-finals.

Following a recent security meeting please find underneath some very relevant points. Its important all members are fully aware of new procedures.

- Unfortunately a small no of mentors/members are abusing our excellent facilities both in Ballycullen and Sancta Maria. Dressing rooms are been left in unfit state, doors left open and even gate to Orchard(SM) left swinging in the wind on one occasion(no reason to go out there but why not lock gate after you!.)
- 2. Due to CCTV(with time and date) and the vigilance our our security group we have identified the teams responsible and we will be communicating directly with them.
- 3. We have decided not to make this public for the moment or apply any sanctions but a stiff warning will be issued. However we will continue to monitor both locations closely and a 'name and shame' policy will be implemented on next offenders and further sanctions will be approved ,if necessary, by executive.
- 4. New procedure as follows now in place: A cleaning schedule has been placed in home dressing rooms and each team will be responsible for sign off after use for home and away. It was strongly suggested that Captain/Vice captain of each team should be responsible. Also we need to encourage players to have more pride and responsibility for club facilities. Mentors should also txt NS (0872933829) or JR (0872542214) in advance of using if in unacceptable state. The last thing on leaving dressing room is to sign off both home and away. Please do not forget, you are the last person responsible.
- 5. In Ballycullen we have a further problem with Graffiti and we have now identified some individuals and their 'TAGS'. This information has been passed to Gardaí.
- 6. On match days in Ballycullen please be extra vigilant as we understand cars are been tampered with.
- 7. In the interest of security can you please make sure all dressing rooms and lock ups are fully secured before your match or training begins. Experience has shown us this is a time we are most vulnerable.
- 8. It is all our responsibility to change the mindset and culture of some of our members.
