## Na Siúltóirí Buadáin

Leaving behind the stark rugged mountains of North Wicklow Na Siúltóirí opted for the more gentler hills of the Kyle Loop, overlooking Tinahealy in South Wicklow on Saturday.

Tinahealy, destroyed in the 1798 Rebellion, rebuilt in the early 1800's by Earl Fitzwilliam, is today a vibrant market town a rural gem in the valley of the river Derry. It is the Southern Gateway to the Garden of Ireland and the Wicklow Way passes through it.

The morning dawned bright and beautiful and full of Spring renewal and awakenings. Fresh green shoots on the trees, blooming daffodils and new born lambs. The local farmers, helping each other in true community spirit with the busy lambing season, took time out to greet and chat with us as we trekked along their lands, an insight into the friendly hospitable nature of the community.

The Kyle Loop is approximately 18km of farmer's lanes, forest trails and rolling hills, perfect practise ground for those of us undertaking 'The Camino' in May. We rested and took on board some sustenance on a grassy hilltop overlooking the town.

From our vantage point the perfect picture of a snow capped Lugnacoille guarding the sun filled valley was truly breathtaking.

The area is steeped in GAA history. Jim Hmphrey, the quiz master posed a question....'Name on the memorial, along the Kyle loop with association to the GAA'? The prize.....A Pint. No Takers. The answer.....Luke O'Toole. Luke was General Secretary to the GAA from 1901 – 1929. He is credited with the introduction of county boards across the country.

A big thank you to Jim for leading us on this terrific trek in South Wicklow.

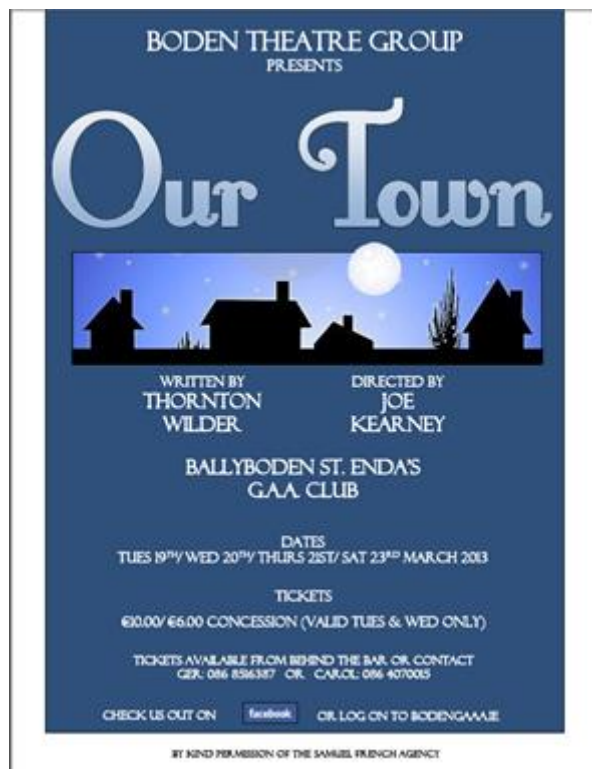
