Minor A Footballers Suffer First league Defeat

Ballyboden's Minor A footballers suffered their first defeat of the season in the League against Na Fianna in Sancta Maria Sunday 24th March. In a closely fought game, Na Fianna finished on top by 2 points with the aid of a strong breeze in the second half. Colm Basquel got the home side on the scoreboard with two early points. Na Fianna got into the game with a brace of points themselves. Some good interchange play by the forwards ended with Adam Carney scoring a point off his left foot and this edged the home side ahead. With the aid of the wind, it was clear that Boden needed to build up a good lead at half time however Na Fianna stood defensively strong. Two excellent saves by their goalkeeper coupled with some hard physical tackling kept the scoring to a minimum and Boden finished the half 0-6 to 0-4 ahead.

Boden got off to a good start in the second half with scores from Conor Deane and a Colm Basquel free however Na Fianna hit back with 6 points on the trot as the away side started to dominate the midfield exchanges as well as taking advantage of

some poor kickouts and defending against the strong wind. A wonderful passing move started by Boden's David Gilheaney ended with a goal by Warren Egan after 43 minutes. This had the home team right back in the game as the intensity of the game increased. The closing quarter featured both goalkeepers pulling off two excellent saves each which kept their respective teams in the game. However Na Fianna outscored the home team 5 points to 2 to finish up winners on the day.

The ongoing efforts to form strong links between the juvenile and adult playing sections in the club have been of huge benefit to the U15 boys hurling team.

Conor McCormack came along to assist the lads for 'a few weeks' two years ago and was such a success that he is now an essential part of the mentoring team for the age group. The gain for the young



players has been enormous, having regular training from a senior inter county player has given them a level of coaching expertise that is unrivalled. The link back to the adult section is also there to be seen, with the juvenile players taking an active interest in going to see senior league and championship fixtures and feeling a real link to the team with 'their coach' playing a starring role.

Seahan stands 648m high, just above Bohernabreena, overlooking Glenasmól. It is the nearest mountain to Dublin City, is rich in megalithic tombs and is part of the Kilbride Circuit. Seefin, Seefingan and Corrig are her sister mountains and all are popular with hill walkers. Our walk on Wednesday took us onto the Kilbride Circuit. To the North, from a snow capped Seahan, Howth looked splendid under a ray of bright vellow sunshine. The mountains to the



South, stood ever imposing under a blue sky streaked with Black, Grey and Orange clouds, casting shadows of light and dark over the hilltops.

We stood in 9 inches of snow, on top of Seahan, in awe of the beauty and colour of this spectacular vista. Our trek through the snow was challanging in the very cold weather conditions but it was so worthwhile.

Tibradden to Fairy Castle was a tough trek on Sunday. The biting cold wind, grey sky, snow and ice had cast a bleak and desolate feel over the landscape.
