## **U14 Skills Wall Competition**

U14 and U13 hurlers took part in a hurling ball wall competition on Thursday 28th March to test their skills in striking, catching and accuracy. Mentors Paul Kelly and Joe Lalor kept order with support of time-keeper Harry Reddy.

Players were tested in two separate disciplines. Firstly, they were required to strike against the wall and catch as many times as possible in 60 seconds. Secondly, they were awarded points for



number of strikes hitting painted targets in 60 seconds. Total overall score from both tests were added up to identify overall winner.

# Na Siúltoirí Buadáin

Djouce Mountain from Crone Wood is very popular with hill walkers. Its terrain is diverse and challenging, its scenery splendid and it is part of The Wicklow Way. The trek through Crone Wood and it's forest trails are gentle and inviting and lead to an elevation with spectacular views over the Powerscourt Estate and its magnificeint Waterfall.

In contrast with the milder weather of the lowlands the arctic weather conditions on Djouce Mountain set a huge challenge for Na Siúltóirí on Good Friday.
