On a perfect, sunny afternoon, Ballyboden Senior B hurlers took on St Patricks in Wicklow in the Leinster League semi-final on Saturday 27th April. Brendan Treacy had Boden on the board quickly as he sent over a nice point from the centre half forward position. The hosts responded quickly with a brace of pointed frees before Finnian McDonagh finished with a powerful shot to the net after good work by the full forward line. St Patricks responded well again and levelled after 10 minutes. However a second Boden goal from Naoise Green gave Boden a lead they would not subsequently relinquish. While St Patricks enjoyed plenty of possession, with some good puckout ball won, in the second quarter, they were wasteful with the final shot and tallied four wides in this period. Boden tagged some good scores and went in a the break 2-8 to 0-8 ahead.

The hosts piled on the pressure at the start of the second half but could not make the breakthough. Aiming for goals, they were twice set back by magnificent saves from goalkeeper Niall O'Neill. These were important as St Patricks had the momentum outfield at this point. Boden began to recover and with Naoise Maguire and Naoise Green going well in midfield, resolute defending by Ronan Cleary and Darragh O'Gorman, they created enough chances for the forwards - Emmet Carroll picking off a brace of points were a feature. Into the last quater and Boden appeared to have weathered the storm. Their fitness levels appeared better and this was particularly evident as Dermot Coffey finished to the net after a strong, mazy run from midfield. James Roche found space in the closing minutes and raised the green flag three times to round off a good team performance - **final score Boden 6 15 St Patricks 0 09**.

On Saturday, Na Siúltóirí took the tourist route along the Dodder into St James's Gate, the traditional starting point of the Camino for Irish Pilgrims.Clad in hiking boots, rusksacks on back and our Credencial (Pilgrim's Passport) in hand we headed off along the river with one mission in mind, the Camino stamp on our passport.
