

Willie Phelan Cup 2013

For many years Ballyboden St. Enda's GAA Club and Ballygunner GAA Club contested at senior level for the Willie Phelan Trophy in a landmark annual hurling match on St. Patrick's Weekend in Waterford. This trophy was put up by the Ballygunner club in memory of the late William Phelan, a staunch member of Ballygunner GAA club until he moved to Dublin in the 60's and became a staunch member of Ballyboden St. Enda's GAA club. Willie's commitment to the club was



a constant throughout his years in Dublin until he passed away after a brave battle with illness. Willie's family always played a full part in the life of our club. Liam, the eldest son played hurling with the club for many, many years and Michael, also hurled with 'Boden for many years until he moved out to Canada some years back. Willie's wife Bridie served the club in a myriad of roles from first aider to committee member to sandwich maker!

Recently the U13 hurling team was contacted by Liam Phelan now ironically married to a Waterford woman, living in the county and involved in the Ballygunner club himself. A special day was organised so as the two great clubs could once again play a hurling match for the Willie Phelan Cup (it had been kept shining in the Ballyboden trophy cabinet since 2005). The Under 13 Hurlers enjoyed a wonderful day in the sunny south east this Sunday past in Waterford. A wonderfully skilful game of hurling was played on the Ballygunner main pitch, refereed by inter-county referee Michael Wadding. In fairness there wasn't a dirty stroke in the match and the only pressure on the referee was in keeping up with the fast pace of the game!

After benefitting from a breeze in the first half, Ballyboden led by 3-4 to 1-2 at half time. Our advantage was to be seriously threatened at the resumption of the second half however as the Waterford boys came at us like a train. A massive performance was on display from both sides with the scoring nip and tuck. Luckily Ballyboden edged it at the end to win 3-6 to 4-2. The Ballyboden boys proved their fitness, aggression and agility with an attacking style of play which provided them with the determination to keep the head and persevere in the end. This team is unbeaten in 2013 and they intend to keep it that way for the foreseeable future. Under the watchful eyes of managers Niall Desmond and Martin Kenny they will no doubt go from strength to strength.

The Ballygunner céad míle fáilte was top drawer stuff! The players and parents were treated to a wonderful spread in the clubhouse after the match. Each boy was presented with a pair of Ballygunner socks and a sliotar. After a sterling performance at full forward, Kevin Desmond was chosen by Pat Flynn (Paul Flynn's father and astute hurling analyst) as Man of the Match and was presented with a lovely trophy. Matthew Nolan, captain of the 'Boden team accepted the Willie Phelan Cup and gave a wonderful cúpla focal to the crowd assembled in the clubhouse.

After a few pucks in the indoor hurling arena at Ballygunner (I kid you not – an indoor hurling pitch!) we upped sticks and headed for Tramore where the boys got the chance to show off their narly surfing skills. Tired and exhausted they just about managed a bag of chips and a burger before spending their last few shillings on the Hurdy Gurdys in Tramore.

It really was a fantastic and memorable day for parents, mentors and boys. Our sincere thanks go to the Phelan family and to the good people of Ballygunner - a great parish and a great club. We hope that this is now the start of a new annual tradition between these two great clubs for the honour of wining the Willie Phelan Cup.
