Football News - Minor Football Championship

What a weekend again of sport. They say 'two out of three aint bad' and so it was with our minor footballers this weekend. Both Minor A and B teams won their respective matches while the C team were unlucky to lose by two points to St. Pats Donabate in a close encounter.

Ballyboden's Minor A's got off to a winning start in the A minor championship yesterday in Sancta Maria overcoming the young guns of Ballymun by 6 points. The visitors got off to an ideal start, aided by a strong wind, scoring a goal from a penalty after just 1 minute. After 3 minutes Colm Basquel was hauled down and he pointed the subsequent 14m free. This helped settle the home team down. Ballymun were happy to sit back, backing the defence with 10 players, and hitting Ballyboden on the break. A number of turnovers of the ball by the Boden defence however kept the pressure on Ballymun and eventually Boden's attacking approach paid off and the teams went in at half time on level terms .

The second half started with Boden piling on the pressure and dominating possession. However, the blanket defence approach appeared to be working, frustrating the home side into kicking a series of wides. It took a Colm Basquel point

to break the ice and from there the Boden lads pushed on and scored 6 unanswered points in the last 20 minutes of the game to finish comfortably ahead. Well done to the lads on the result and to Ballymun for the stern test they put up. The Boden boys will learn a lot from the performance and from playing against a packed defence. Next up is an Away championship game to Thomas Davis on Sunday 22nd. September at 10.30 am, Kiltipper Road.

It was somewhat easier for the Minor B's out in St. Anne's against Clontarf. They got into their stride straight away dominating both halves with a good all-round team effort. The next round of games take place on the morning of All-Ireland football final day 22/9/13.

breaking ball. Ben McEntee and Donal Butler in particular, worked in the middle third. A second goal by Naoise Greene after a strong run by McEntee left the half time score 2-5 to 1-4 in Boden's favour.

Aware that Kevins would start strongly in the second half, the Boden defence were on high alert. This was typified when Conor Dooley made a superb save within two minutes of the restart. Darragh O'Gorman and Jamie Desmond organised the defence well and Boden tacked on a series of fine points. Ronan Cleary did a great sweeping job in the half back line and Naoise Maguire tidied up any loose ends in the middle of the field. James Roche and Conor Dooley kept the scoreboard ticking over with some well taken frees.

In the last quarter, the Boden subs added strength to the home team and in the end they ran out winners on a scoreline of 4-17 to Kevins' 2-4.


Finally congratulations to our Senior Hurling team who won the All Ireland 7's last Saturday, Well done Lads.
