Hurling News - Senior B Win Championship Semi Final

The Senior B hurlers had a 1 19 to 3 06 win over Naomh Mearnóg to reach the final of the Senior B Championship. Boden led by 0 09 to 0 02 at half time. Mearnóg had a dream start to the second half with a goal shortly after the resumption. They did manage to come within two points but Boden rallied to finish deserving winners. They now face Parnells in the final. The sides met in the Championship opener in April. Parnells won that game by the narrowest of margins on a score of 0 11 to 0 10. The final is planned for on October 13th.

The Junior C team were also in action in AHL5. They were beaten by Clontarf on a score of 2 12 to 1 09 They now need to win their last game V Maur's to qualify for the play-offs. A Championship semi-final also awaits the Junior C team.




Gumshields - Important Notice
