Senior B's defeated by Parnells in SHC "B" Final

Ballyboden Senior B hurlers fell at the final hurdle yesterday evening against Parnells in the Championship Final in Parnell Park.

On a perfect pitch, the opening exchanges were well-contested and points were traded with *Naoise Maguire* on the mark for Boden. A key moment occurred in the tenth minute when *James Duffy* blocked a



goal-bound shot with his body. This was an example of the never say die attitude of the team and moments later after a series of well-placed passes, *Naoise Green* fired to the net. Parnells hit back strongly, however, and led by a point at the quarter hour. *Ronan Cleary* was in great form at wing back, tidying up a lot of loose ball and with *Stephen Nagle and Jamie Desmond*, were Boden's strongest line. Further points were added by *Dónal Butler, James Roche and Paul Doherty* to leave the halftime score at Boden 1-5 to Parnells 0-11 – a puck of a ball in it.

The large crowd knew a goal early in the second half would be critical for either team and unfortunately it went the way of Parnells and with a quick point, found themselves seven points ahead.

The character of this Boden team shone through and with points by *Maguire* and fellow midfielder *Tim Sweeney*, hit the next three scores. Again, Parnells pulled ahead and again Boden responded with strong runs from *Roche and Finn McDonagh*. Into the closing stages and with the Boden subs adding additional impetus to the Boden attack, Cleary struck for a goal. Three points in it. Another run drew a free and up stepped *Conor Dooley*. It appears the instruction was given that this was the last shot and although the ball ended up in the Parnells net after a scramble, time was up. A heartstopping finish to a well-contested final. The Parnells captain was generous in his praise of Boden as a team and a club and this was appreciated. It is also an accurate assessment, typified by the manner in which new faces were added to the squad this year and were integrated into the team seamlessly. Great credit to the longer-established players in this regard. Let's challenge again next year, lads!

Senior A Hurlers Knock holders Crokes out of SHC

Anyone who thought it was going to easy did not show due respect to Kilmacud Crokes who proved to be worthy county champions in 2012. Johnny Kenny and his team knew that taking this scalp would not be easy and this is exactly how it turned out. O' Toole Park has seldom, if ever, seen such a large crowd and the pitch was in magnificent condition for the game which was played in near perfect conditions.

Two goals from *Paul Ryan* saw Ballyboden St Enda's topple last year's champions, Kilmacud Crokes, in this Dublin SHC 'A' quarter-final in O'Toole Park on Sunday. His second came in injury time as the Boden side did just enough to edge out our great rivals. Crokes had battled back from six points in arrears at the interval to lead heading into the last quarter. Boden led 2-5 to 0-5 at half-time – their goals provided by *Conal Keaney and Paul Ryan*.

However, Crokes took control on the restart with *Dillon Mulligan, Seán McGrath* and Ross O'Carroll hitting points while it was O'Carroll's goal that put his side in front as the half progressed.

But it was not to be for Crokes as Boden finished the better with the accuracy and poacher's instinct of *Pabs Ryan* central to their victory.BBSE breathed a huge sigh of relief at the finish after a titianic struggle. Championship Updates

Minors: Minor ladies ladies played their 3rd round robin championship fixture last Saturday in Swords against a strong amalgamation from Fingallians and St. Margaret's. Despite playing against a side containing no fewer than 9 current intercounty footballers, the Boden girls played with their typical flair and resilience and indeed at one stage it looked like they were going to pull of the shock of the season. However the greater strength of the north Dubliners saw Fingallians/Margaret's prevail on a 5-11 to 2-12 scoreline. This has been a very good championship campaign for the Boden minors who have had only two minors available this years. Indeed of the 20 girls that saw duty on Saturday last, 19 of them are underage again next season - so things augur well for the future.

Their final outing of the season is scheduled to take place next weekend against Kilmacud Crokes

Under 16 Div 1 had a comprehsive win over a strong Round Towers team with a

score of 5 11 to 3 9. They now take on Kilmacud in the Final, date yet to be confirmed.

Under 16 Div 2 The U16B panel put in a great performance to beat Scoil Ui Chonaill in the Div 2 Shield semi final. After missing out on a Championship semi final on score difference the girls were determined to get to a Shield final. Scoil Ui Chonaill are a tough physical team but the Ballyboden girls focused on playing fast attacking football. The first half was tight with Ballyboden leading by 4pts at half time (1-7 v 1-3). In the second half the Ballyboden girls were much more clinical with their finishing and won comfortably by 15pts (4-13 v 1-7). Some fantastic performances throughout the team including Aoife Barnes/Louise O'Meara who shared goalkeeping duties, Katie Cannon at full back, Alannah Nugent & Sophie Curran in the half back line, Laura McCarthy & Ciara Anne Carroll at midfield, Alicia Fitzpatrick scoring 1-7 from centre forward and Shauna Dempsey & Aoife Domican scoring 3-4 between them in the full forward line. The girls look forward to playing Ballinteer St Johns in the Div 2 Shield Final.

The U16C panel faced a talented team from Naomh Mearnog in Div 5. Naomh Mearnog were dominant early on in a lot of positions and took their scores very well. By half time they lead 4-16 v 0-1. The Ballyboden girls were determined to improve their performance in the second half and certainly did that scoring 1-3 v 1-5 for Naomh Mearnog. It was fantastic to field a 3rd team of 15 players at this age group and watch them compete so well. All of the girls played really well in the second half including Abaigael Woods in goals, Grace Hanley at full back, Stephanie Glennon at half back, Ali Clarke & Phoebe Tighe at midfield, Leona Deane & Mary Ruth Healy in the forwards.

This panel of players are showing great commitment training two days a week and are playing very well against the top group of players in all the clubs they compete against.

It should be noted that in Ladies Football no other club is fielding more than one panel at U16, yet Ballyboden St Enda's have 3 panels competing in the U16 Championship. The players on the second and third panels deserve great credit for competing so well in Div 2 & Div 5 against the only teams in the clubs they compete against.

Under 15 Div 1 fixture against Foxrock did not go ahead due to FoxCab withdrawing a number of teams in the Championship. Our 15's now await details of Shield final against Cuala.


