Senior Footballers thro to SFC Semi Final

The Seniors put in a terrific performance to overcome St.Brigids on Saturday in Parnell Park in their SFC Quarter-final (See Hill16 report below). They will face St.Vincent's in the semis next Monday at 7:45 in Parnell Park and your support is again vital.



BALLYBODEN ST ENDA'S 2-13 ST BRIGID'S 1-11

A powerful second half display from a tireless Ballyboden St Enda's saw them come from behind to defeat St Brigid's in Saturday's Dublin SFC quarter-final at Parnell Park. Shane Supple's 28th minute penalty gave the Russell Park outfit a 1-6 to 0-7 lead but it was wiped out immediately on the restart when Darren Reilly beat Supple from close range from a Michael Darragh Macauley pass. Boden assumed the upperhand over the following 15 minutes as points from Ryan Basquel ('45'), the influential Conal Keaney and Kenny Naughton had them 1-10 to 1-7 in front by the 43rd minute. The match-winning goal followed when Basquel rounded Supple to angle to the net following good interplay between Keaney and Macauley. It was a score that highlighted the difference between the sides as Boden's forwards combined to more telling effect than their opponents at crucial times of this well-contested duel while in their defence Robbie McDaid did a fine marking job on Dublin senior Paddy Andrews.

This six-point advantage gave Boden enough breathing space to the finish as they progressed to face St Vincent's in their semi-final.

MFC 'A' QF Minor A 1-17 v Na Fianna 1-14

Ballyboden Minor A footballers qualified for the semi finals of the A championship after a pulsating clash with Na Fianna in Sancta Maria on Sunday 20th October. The game itself lived up to the pre match



expectation of a tight encounter to say the least! A large crowd was there to witness the clash and the home support was much appreciated by the squad of players and management. With 18 players on display that have represented Dublin this year, the pace of the game and intensity of the tackles was always going to be high. With less than 2 minutes on the clock, a well contested kick out had Darragh Bolger and two Na Fianna players laid out on the ground. Thankfully all players were able to play on.

Playing against the wind, Colm Basquel got the home time off to a good start with a point after 2 minutes. Na Fianna hit back with 4 points of their own until Tom Hanifin and Brian O Shea stopped their momentum. Just before the end of the half, Na Fianna hit a point of their own. Boden are two points ahead going into the final break. The brief teamtalk is all about pride and passion and 10 more nerve jangling minutes. The early exchanges of the second period are characterized by intense tackling and turn over ball. Then Na Fianna score a dramatic goal. Is the game slipping away? Never!!! Cian Bates returns to the game and as he heads for goal, he falls under heavy pressure and somehow slides the ball into the net. Na Fianna are crestfallen, Boden are ecstatic! The last attack


