
The Plough in the Stars - 1 week to go!

Other members of this sub group include Ned Flood, Teresa Molohan, Mark Fee, & David Sweeney. We will be starting this week to complete a Functional Movement Screen on all boys & girls born in 1998(next years under 16's). The results of this screening will help us design a suitable flexibility and mobility programme for these players to carry out over the winter and reduce the chance of injury for the players next season.
