Minor Championship

Ballyboden Minor Bs had a fine victory over Parnells on Sunday morning on the Prunty pitch in blustery, breezy conditions. The opposition began well and put Boden's backs under pressure. But as usual, James Mc Donnell, Oisín Tobin and Oisín Carolan were outstanding in defence. However a great point from play by Ruairí Kirwan against the wind gave Boden and the game its first point. Boden continued their work rate and excellent passing, which led to Cian Murray passing a delightful ball to Rob Leddy who punched the ball past the Parnell's keeper for the first of Boden's goals. Parnells had some fine forwards in particular their full forward, who could skilfully score from frees and from play. Mark McGee and Sean McDonnell took their chances from play and each scored a point, under great pressure, against a strong wind. The points continued, all from play, from Ruairí Kirwan, Conor Kennedy, Mark McGee, Liam O' Flaherty and an on-form Rob Leddy. The great fielding by Luke O'Donoghue and excellent passing by Cian Murray aided to the flow of points. Parnells battled on, with one of their full forwards heading at speed to Boden's goal, but Josh Kane pulled off a spectacular save.

The second half saw Parnells coming out stronger against the wind. However, Boden quickly found their form, with scores from Mark McGee and Rob Leddy. The Move of the Game came from a brilliant kick out from Josh Kane to Liam O'Flaherty, who caught the ball high above his head and soloed forward to set up Rob Leddy for his second goal. Great battling from Rossa Lynch and Liam Stafford helped Boden continue their run with a points from Cian Kelly and Liam O'Flaherty and a goal from Ruairí Kirwan.

Ballyboden St Endas 6-12, St Pats Palmerstown 2-5.

The big question being asked of the Ballyboden St Endas Minor Cs in Palmerstown this morning was whether or not they could repeat their exploits against Cuala of a fortnight ago. By 12.15 this morning – the answer was an emphatic 'Yes!' Although missing a few

key players due to injury and Bank Holiday commitments, 'Boden fielded a strong 15 with the help of some under 16s. A strong wind prevailed which was with 'Boden in the first half but it was St Pats who attacked and scored first. Thankfully, 'Boden responded well with a well taken point from the sublime left of Eoin Cashman. It was then the turn of Jamie Ryder to step up as our utility man, playing full forward today, scored 1-1 in the next five minutes. The goal coming after some great team work from Aidan Mellet and David Leech. When asked afterwards what contributed to his focused play, Jamie reckoned 'it was an early night and the extra hour in bed this morning with the clocks going back!' A quick break up the pitch saw St Pats get a goal back. That was the last bit of space they saw in the first half as Tommy Burke sacrificed attacking duties to shore up the defence at number 6 and hoover up any further St Pats attacks like a Blue and White striped Dyson! With Gavin Morrell and John Murphy working hard in the middle of the park, along side dynamic Captain David Leech winning scrappy ball, 'Boden found their half forwards in lively form and soon began to really take a grip of this tie. The clinical Kevin O'Flaherty clipping on 1-3 in so lethal a fashion that he could yet be offered a part as a hit man on Love/Hate. A further classy point (they must get it from the mother!) came from the quick thinking of the Murphy boys, Laurence finding John with a short free which the latter pointed with aplomb. As expected, St Pats now playing with the wind, came out all guns blazing. Kick outs from goal keeper Stephen McGrath were, as always, accurate and clever into the wind. Thus ensuring that the St Pats pressure was kept to a minimum. Balls out off defence were carried into attack by the hard working Charlie Mc Partland and Patrick Munnelly. Any score from St Pats was answered with interest by 'Boden, another four goals coming in the second half. An athletic volley from the lively Aidan Mellet would have won many an award. It was to be out done by a fine effort from John Murphy who lobbed the keeper from 40 yards out after spying him off his line. At least that's what he said! Gillespie and Creegan again came in to make a contribution which should not be underestimated. And so it is down to a final group game against O'Tooles in two weeks time. A win should see this ever evolving team into the semifinal which is well deserved after the work and performance on display in Glenaulin Park, Palmerstown this morning and indeed all season. 

My Gaa Journey Book Launch by Dara Ward

U14 Footballer and Colaiste Eanna student Dara Ward launched his second publication last Wednesday, 22nd October, in the clubhouse. The evening was well attended by Dara's proud family, team mates, club members and some Boden and Dublin senior players.

Endorsed by the Gaa, it includes a message from GAA President Liam O Neill and words of wisdom and advice from GAA greats such as Brian Cody, Henry Shefflin and our very own Michael Darragh Macauley amongst others, as well as snippets from each mentor from U9 up to U15.

The memory book, which is in a workbook format, enables Juveniles to record and track their progress from Academy to U15.

There are two pages for each age stage. The first page has space for 2 photos and the second lists a number of questions which have space for the answers beneath. The layout allows the players to record skills learnt, highlights of the year, league results etc which enables children to hold onto the memories that are dear to them as they journey through the GAA experience. The book not only records the activities and details of the sports passage of a young child through to minor, it, in the words of Liam O Neill

" has the potential to store in one place those figures, games, incidents and stand out achievements that help mould us as people. As we know, it is in our early years and our early experiences where memories begin, where we find our heroes, and where we continue our own journeys in life. Throughout this time we grow, learn, and appreciate sport in different ways, and it helps define our developement, the characters we become and the people we grow to be".

Dara has designed the production of his book in such a way that it can be customised and published to suit any individual GAA club ,who wishes to introduce the book in their clubs.

A percentage of all profits go straight to the GAA club and a third goes to Colaiste Eanna's charity, The India Immersion Project.

The project has been entered into this year's Colaiste Eanna's Student Enterprise Awards. Dara is no stranger to Student Enterprise Awards having been awarded third place nationally which he represented his county in the All Ireland leg earlier this year for another project.




