A goal either side of half time decided the outcome of this league final against a determined St. Brigids, played on the all-weather in front of a sizeable travelling support. Accurate passing was the making of both goals, the first an assist from Collie Durkin standing on the side line to the feet of Fionn Maguire. He had the time and composure to beat the goalkeeper. The second was a more elaborate score. Ronan Skarkey to Mattie O'Sullivan, strike to Aiden Dundon, pass to Durkin in space. Collie went on a solo run to the 21 and placed his strike to the onion sack, a classy goal.

The opening quarter was none too inspiring as both sides warmed up and found their feet. Brigids started the scoring with a point from Fox, easily their most impressive performer over the hour. Michael Griffin responded after Niall O'Neill was upended. Eamonn Gorman was in the wars after being chopped, Griff did the business. 2 to 1. ### Ballyboden 10-8;Castleknock 1-1

Over three months on from their first game against Ballymun, the group stage of the Minor A championship concluded on Sunday last. Having lost to Thomas Davis in the second round, Ballyboden required a win of 32 points over Castleknock to proceed to the semi-final, a tall order in the middle of November. Pundits at the Gala Ball the night before cast doubt on the chances but they hadn't reckoned on the character of this team under Manager Liam Deane. Originally fixed for Somerton, a late fixture change saw the game moved to Porterstown. The Minor As were aware that only a 5 star performance would see their season extended. Before the game, the focus was good and rousing speeches by team trainers Fergal Brennan and Ciarán Doyle saw the lads primed for action.

Warren Egan opened the scoring with a point, followed by another from Adam Carney. However, a string of wides early on proved worrying. Conor Deane settled the nerves with a goal after 4 minutes and Ballyboden started to dominate exchanges.

When word came through from chief scout Jim Keane in Kiltipper that Thomas Davis were racking up a big score against Raheny, the message went into the forwards that only goals would do. As soon as they heard the message, they turned on the gas. Goals from Adam Carney (2), Barra McGarry, Colm Basquel and a second from Conor Deane saw Ballyboden head in at half time 6- 5 to 0-1 ahead. The only blemish on the first half was some wayward shooting and a missed penalty.

Playing down the hill in the second half it was expected that Ballyboden would kick on. However, they hadn't reckoned on a resilient Castleknock team who improved as the game went on. Further goals from Barra McGarry, Conor Deane, Colm Basquel and Brian Bobbett sealed victory. A late goal from Castleknock meant that Ballyboden had to keep the focus until the end to ensure that the 32 point margin was maintained. In the end they won by 34 points, a tremendous achievement at this time of year.

All in all, this was a very good team performance, with cohesive team play and intense tackling. Although the backs were not under huge pressure, Darragh Maguire and Stephan Ward stood out. Ballyboden Minor B footballers had a fine victory on Sunday morning out in Ballymun's all weather pitch against Erin's Isle. It was an excellent, tough game of football, played in cold and sunny conditions, with the final score being 5-15 to 1-13. Erin's Isle was first on the scoreboard with a quick point against the run of play. This was followed by a penalty for

Boden, which was expertly taken by Ruairí Kirwan. The reason we were awarded the penalty was because Mark Mc Gee was hauled down in front of goal and, it must be stated that Mark went on to have a phenomenal game after a dodgy start in the first five minutes. The next ten minutes belonged to Boden as we recorded two goals and two points; another goal from Ruairí Kirwan, followed by a beautiful point and fisted goal from Ross Mc Grath. For this latter goal Cian Kelly brilliantly side stepped his marker and floated in the perfect pass to Ross.

The last fifteen minutes of the first half were completely dominated by Erin's Isle. They succeeded in scoring seven unanswered points – four of these being from frees – and were denied a goal from close range by Josh Kane, through a superb gallant save. At half time the score was 3-3 to 0-9 in favour of Boden, but our players trooped off the field quite worried. The second half however saw us return with extra vigour and confidence – thanks to the increased combativeness of our half backs, half forwards and midfielders. We now scored nine points on the trot, to Erin's Isle one point. The scores came from Liam O' Flaherty (3 points), Cian Kelly (2 points), Liam Mullen (1 point), Liam Stafford (1 point) and Ruairí Kirwan (2 points). Our team work, work rate and accuracy of passing were greatly improved. There are not many clubs in Dublin, never mind the country and even in the world that can boast being able to field three minor football teams. There are even less that can boast to having their third team in a county quarter final having qualified from a group of one team clubs. Ballyboden St Endas can make that boast however. And so it was that our Minor C heroes took to the synthetic field on Alfie Byrne Road to take on a Vincent's B team last Sunday morning. Apart from a low sun in the sky, it was a perfect morning for battle. Possibly a little nervous from analysing their achievements to date, our lads took a while to settle and to adjust to the very fast pitch on which they were playing. Vincents were to score first, despite plenty of possession from 'Boden. The half back line of 'Boden began to take a hold of the game however with Charlie Mc Partland, Tommy Burke and Colm Corrigan all making penetrating runs into the Vincents half. Able support was provided by the midfield of John Murphy and the vibrant David Leach

Clever ball was played into the full forward line by the half forward line of Eoin Cashman, Karl Weldon and Aidan Mellet. Eventually the scores started to come, first from Mikey

Dunne at full forward and a second from Weldon after a superb run through the Vincents back bone. Corner forwards, Kevin O'Flaherty and Laurence Murphy had to go searching for ball out at the 40 but did so well to keep pressure on the home team. This Vincents team were no push overs however and were much more economical with their attacks. Their only three attacks in the first 20 minutes reaping the same number of scores. The 'Boden full back line had little or nothing to do in the first half but Mssers Bobbet, Mac Mathuna and Manning mopped well when required.

Disaster was to strike towards the end of the first half as centre back Tommy Burke landed badly while contesting a ball which led to the ball breaking to a Vincents player who was able to convert a goal. Another quick point and a goal before the half time whistle let Vincents thinking they were home and dry while 'Boden were left wondering how they were behind after working and playing so well. Good defending from Dylan Walsh, keeping the Marino men's' playmaker at bay meant that Vincents' first attack of the half came after 17 minutes. Regrettably it was to result in a goal. They came at 'Boden again and could have pulled away had it not been for some short kicking on their part which landed into the safe hands of 'Boden keeper Stephen McGrath. With the clock running down, 'Boden again pressed forward with Jamie Ryder, Brian Gillespie, Jamie Hutchinson and Sean Durkin using the ball well for our forwards to create and convert a brace of scores and keep this quarter final alive. A further attack was stopped illegally at the Vincents' 21 yard line and up stepped Aidan Mellet to take the free. It was one of those where 'we need all three!' A blistering shot from Mellet could only be parried by the Vincents' rear guard. That man Dunne popped up to collect the rebound and blast to the roof of the net. This ensured a grandstand finish with a full field solo run from Gavin Morrell being one of the highlights. It was unfortunate that the last piece of action saw Vincents get a fourth goal which would be a contender for 'Scaldest goal of the decade' as it meant the score line was far from a reflection of the close game that had preceded.

The legendary American Football coach Vince Lombardi once said 'We didn't lose the game, we just ran out of time' – this is something the 'Boden players can say to themselves after Sunday's outing.

And so a season which began back in late January under the guidance of Manager Brendan Gillespie and mentor Dermot O'Reilly, later joined by Cormac O'Farrell, came to a close. It was a season that had more highs than lows, more wins than losses and one would hope with many a lesson learned. Thankfully many of the players will be minor again next year. Captain Anthony Manning, Brian Gillespie and Colm Corrigan will now be graduating to Adult football where many a football adventure lie ahead for them – we wish them well. As one of the players pointed out in the dressing room after the match, seeing as we were the only C team in the county and by extension the country, to qualify for a quarter final that must make this team the greatest Minor C team in the world – never a truer word said!!!
