### **Football News**

A busy week on the football front with all four adult teams in League action on Sunday. Before we get into them, congratulations to U21 Dublin players Robbie McDaid and Sam Molony as they easily outclassed Carlow (2-28 to 0-03) in the QF of the Leinster Championship, they now face Longford in the semis. Staying on the Dublin theme well done to our Dublin Senior trio of Declan O'Mahony, Dara Nelson and Michael Darragh Macauley as the Dubs put in a strong performance to beat Kildare by 1-22 to 1-12 in the National League in Croke Park.

On to our own games and the Seniors put in a great performance in defeating Thomas Davis by 1-24 to 2-09 (see report), the Inters came up short against Na Fianna, going down by 2-11

to 0-05 (see report). The Junior A's kept their fine form going also against Na Fianna and won by 2-14 to 1-11 (see report) while the Junior B's lost out to St.OP/ER by 1-09 to 0-10.

### Seniors 1-24 Thomas Davis 2-09

The Senior footballers, stung by their opening defeat to Jude's, were looking to get their season up and running at home to Thomas Davis on Sunday morning. Conditions were perfect and a good crowd anticipated another exciting local derby. Despite a lengthy injury list and a young looking starting 15, Boden were quick out of the blocks and controlled the early exchanges with strong running and quick ball into the forwards. However Davis' were the first to register a score though and against the run of play grabbed a goal out of nothing. The home team responded well with a point by Ronan Cleary and a well taken Ryan Basquel goal. Boden began to click into gear and went on a scoring spree for the remainder of the half with an impressive 0-14 but Davis' clung on with 1-05. The half time score was 1-15 to 2-05.

Nine points up but the job was most certainly not done and the second half began with a score for the visitors. Again the response was swift and waves of Boden attacks kept the scoreboard ticking over, Davis' backs growing increasingly desperate and conceding a number of frees duly dispatched. Foundation Award Coaching Course - March 4th, 6th and 8th 2014

The Foundation Award is the introductory award for coaches of Gaelic Games. The course is aimed at beginner coaches and enables participants to assist a coach in the organisation of activities to develop hurling or football.

The course is normally seven and a half hours in duration and covers four key modules, as well as introductory and conclusion modules. These four modules are:

- Introduction to Games
- Skill Development
- Movement Skills
- Coaching Children, Youths and Adults
- Coaching Competencies to be developed

By the end of the course participants would be able to:

- Assist a coach in organising a programme of games and skill development activities appropriate to each participant's needs and abilities
- Identify the skills of hurling
- Assist a coach in organising progressive activities (drills and fun games) to develop five key skills
- Assist a coach in organising progressive activities to develop movement skills appropriate to Gaelic Games
- Assist a coach in organising and managing players for an effective practice session
- Build Rapport, Observe, Analyse, Explain, Provide Demonstration and Provide Positive Feedback to players

Most of the Ballyboden St Enda's Academy and U9-U13 coaches have undertaken this course though the club was aware that there were still some mentors who had not yet completed it.

As a club there is a big emphasis being put on the development of our coaching standards and this course is the minimum qualification the club would expect all our coaches to have. The course was open to mentors across all sections, Football, Ladies Football, Hurling and Camogie from the Academy through to U9 -U12

Paul McLoughlin, aided by Brian O Regan ran the course over two evenings, Tuesday and Thursday of last week and Saturday afternoon and all sessions had to be attended. The training sessions were held in the hall in Ballyboden St Enda's club.

All Coaches received a Ballyboden Coaching Top on completion of the course. 24 people attended the course including a number of Transition Year students who help out at the Academy every Saturday morning.


