

Senior Match report. Boden 3-11 St Vincents 1-11

On Sunday our Seniors travelled to newly crowned All-Ireland Club Champions St. Vincents in their third League outing. Before the match began the Ballyboden men showed their class with a guard of honour in recognition of Vincent's achievements the previous week in Croke Park, it was really nice to see. The game



began with the wind in favour of the home team and they started the brighter and raced into a 2 point lead in the opening minutes. Ryan Basquel pointed from a free in the 4th minute but it wasn't until the 28th minute that Boden got another score as Vincent's raced away into a 0-07 to 0-02 lead. A number of missed frees was proving costly but we ended the half strongly with a dynamic Michael-Darragh MacAuley run who provided Ciaran Archbold with the games opening goal. Half time score 0-07 to 1-02 to the home side.

At the start of the second half Vincents extended their lead with another two quick fire points before a Basquel point and a Andrew Kerin goal reduced the deficit to the minimum. Boden were now in the ascendancy and another 4 points from Kerin and a Tom Hanifin goal put Boden 5 points to the good. Vincent's did manage to get a goal back but it was too little too late as further scores from Basquel, Kerin and Robbie McDaid ended the contest at 3-11 to 1-11 in Bodens favour. Some might argue Vincent's were suffering from a few well earned celebrations but great credit goes to the Boden management and players for a morale boosting victory in what is always a difficult place to pick up points. Inters Match report. Boden 3-6 St Vincents 1-13

The Inters came up just short in this evenly contested contest in Sancta Maria. Playing into a stiff breeze in the first half Boden were well in contention approaching the break. A well taken goal by Carl Molony following excellent play from Fergal Haran and David O'Brien had the score tied at 1-2 v 0-5. A loss of shape and concentration in the final 5 minutes of the first half allowed St.Vincents add 1-2 in this period (HT 1-2 v 1-7).

The 5 point deficit was reduced to 1 point within minutes of the the start of the 2nd half mainly through a well worked team goal finished by Darragh Kilduff. St. Vincents steadied and extended their lead to 4 points by the addition of 3 unanswered points with 15 minutes to go. Boden responded and levelled with a second Darragh Kilduff goal and a Justin Owens point. St. Vincents edged ahead again in the final 5 minutes and despite numerous opportunities to win the game Boden's lack of composure in finishing off these chances ultimately cost them the points.

Despite an encouraging start where the Boden midfield dominated an early gilt edge goal chance wasn't taken that would be an ominous sign for the remainder of the game. Boden showed some desire in the second half but it just didn't happen. An interesting highlight was the Parnells corner back receiving a second yellow from the referee and despite no sign of Kieran Gibbs stayed on the pitch. When this was pointed out to the ref, Parnells shrewdly made the substitution. The Boden performance was probably typified by a late 45 narrowly missing Ned in the bar (it was that wide!) Hopefully this match was only a blip as the potential within this panel is very strong and it is expected the next league game will banish the hangover...
