# Feile U14B Division 3 Winners



In a memorable weekend our U14 B Ladies won the Dublin Feile Div 3 Cup.

We met at 8.45 am on Saturday morning and headed to up the road to St Annes who were the hosts for Feile for this division. The team were well kited our in their new gear and the mood was good heading off.

We faced a group with O'Tooles, Peregrines and Beann Eadair. Both O'Tooles and Peregrines were unknown quantities as they did not have team playing U14 league football. They both had teams in U15 and U13.

We kicked off with OTooles and we had the wind and the big slope on the hugh St Annes main pitch. We had to battle hard but ran out five points winners 3 - 3 to 2 - 1. It was good to start off with a win and gave the girls added confidence. Matches were only 15 mins a half and the pace of the game was fast and furious.

Our second match was against Peregrines. ereguines had put nine goals past Beann Eadair, so we knew we were in for a hard match. The standard of football in this match was very high. The pace was relentless in this match. Peregrines attacked with vigour and pushed forward through driving runs from their two strong mid fielders. The girls hung in, chased their players and began to match Peregrines.

Aisling Byrne got a great goal which gave the team good confidence. With 2 mins to go , Peregrines kicked in a ball to our goal which looked as if it would drop into our keepers hand, but it hit off one of our half backs and went straight to the net. Peregrines ran out 4 -6 to 4 -2 winners.

In the third match we played Beann Eadair who had drawn their second match with O' Tooles. We started off strong and let 3 -1 to 3 points at half time. With a strong wind Beann Eadair started to pick off a number of points on the trot and gained momentum. We moved a few players around and this helped to step the tide. The game ended in a draw and we were relieved.

In the Semi Final we played Parnells. Monicas and Annes were also in this group. Monica were fancied to win the Feile as they had 2 Dublin U14 A players and were putting up cricket cores against opposition in their league. Annes were also strong contenders. Monica beat Annes by a couple of goals. In a big surprise Parnells beat Monica's and qualified for the semi final.

The semi final was played on the smaller pitch. The girls gave it everything in this match. Tackles and challenges were strong from both sides. Our link play was very good in this match and the girls gave a really strong performance As they say goals wins games and we got three in this match. We won the match 3 -2 to 1- 4.in a cianly fought match.

The girls were tired after four tough matches but were feeling great inside having mde it to the Final.Peregrines were hosting all eight Finals on Sunday. Our match was down for 1pm and Peregrines had come through their semi final with Monicas. Peregrines led 5 -3 to no score at half time Monicas got 4 goals back in the second half to their credit.

We leaned the lessons from our first match with Peregrines. It always great to reach a Final but to get over the line in a Final at any level is always difficult. You need at least 10 players getting the better of their opponents. to win the match. In this Final all 21 players played a hugh part in our victory. Rarely has a team played in a Final when all players played to the top of their ability.

The girls left their best performance for the Final. The standard of play from our players was of the highest order. The girls contested vigrously for every ball and used it well when they won possession. All the backs stuck like glue to their markers. Our mid fileders had to compete against a very strong Peregrines due and chased every ball. Our half forwards show well for the ball and used the ball well when they got won possession. We kicked low into our full forward line who ran out and get a bouncing ball. Goals win games and we got three. We were close to goals on three others attempts.

Peregrines pushed froward more in the second half but our backs held firm. We played the wings when we got possession and used in wisely and played the ball into our half forwards who delivered good ball in to our full forward line.

The pace of this match was hetic. The standard of play was very good from both sides. Boden were roared on a hugh Ballyboden support. At the final whistle Boden were the winners with a score 3 -3 to 1-3. A big thanks for to Peregrines for a very competitive game.

Playing down the hill and with the help of a slight breeze, a strong start from Ballyboden saw them produce their best 1st half performance so far this season. With Mark Fitzgerald leading from the back Boden produced some good team play to earn their half time lead of 1-5 to 0-6.

Two points from Adam Carney, the first a converted free kick from wide on the left after a foul on Justin Owens and the second from play after again good set up work by Owens settled the side early on. A well taken goal from Brian Devlin from a Carl Molony pass after a fine piece of team play mid way through the half saw Boden extend their lead. A point from Gavin O'Gara from distance (estimated by Gav to be about 80 metres.....and that was just the height!!) was added to by Barry Higgins after patient play down the right and a converted 45 by Carl Molony completed the first half scoring. Boden had the opportunity to extend the lead further but failed to convert another goal chance after an excellent driving run from Dara Kilduff.
