Captain Kevin Desmond led the team up the steps as the boys were presented with their medals and to cheers Kevin lifted the trophy and gave a wonderful speech.

It was then back to club then where La na Club had been on. Given a Garda Escort the victorious convoy arrived amid beeping and cheering to be given a tumultuous welcome. There were more pictures with the trophy and speeches by Andrew Coffey, Peter Hanrahan, Sean O'Neill and of course Derek Ward.

The day had started off with a Semi Final against Castleknock in front of a large crowd at Pairc Uí Mhurchú. The boys started well with a point from Conor Woods. Then John McGinn (who had scored 1-11 in Saturdays game) had to go off injured. The boys battled on and Enda Cashman added two further points. Castleknock struck back with a point before Conor Woods scored his second point of the day. Castleknock then struck for a goal and then two further points pushing them into a two point lead. Luke McDwyer got a point and Ballyboden went into the break a point down 0-05 to 1-03.

The Ballyboden started to get a grip on the midfield area with Luke Grady, Enda Cashman,

Inters 6-18 V O'Dwyers 1-07 Report from GrassRootsGAA.ie

Ballyboden St Endas brushed aside O'Dwyers with ease in this Intermediate Football Championship match in Balgriffin on Friday evening. The game was effectively over as a contest after ten minutes with the Rathfarnham side 3-2 to no score up. O'Dwyers had to endure wave after wave of Boden attacks, while at the same time struggling to get out of their own half or put any sort of cohesive play together.

Truth be told, the scoreline should have been even worse for the Balbriggan men with Boden guilty of some second half profligacy in front of goal, understandable in the circumstances given that they were so far in front. O'Dwyers never got out of first gear but credit must be given to Boden who were extremely impressive in the way they dismantled their opponents. They attacked at speed and with precision, more often than not picking the right option when in possession. The defensive side of their game was equally impressive, with their tackling from number 15 right back to number one suffocating their opponents and forcing turnovers which gave them an excellent platform to attack from.

The opening five minutes of the match hinted that we might have been in for a competitive encounter, with both sides moving forward at pace and tackling in packs in equal measure. Indeed, the scorekeeper wasn't called into action until the fifth minute when Boden showed their first real glimpse of attacking prowess. The men in blue and white were awarded a free in the middle third as a quick long delivery found GrassRootsGAA Star Man Carl Moloney; the corner forward turned quickly before unleashing an unstoppable looping effort over O'Dwyers netminder Peter O Donohue and into the far top corner. Boden were on the goal

trail again a minute later when Molony caught another long delivery in, laid off to Dara Kilduff, who played a neat one-two with full forward Justin Owens before palming to the net.

O'Dwyers were stunned and appeared rooted to the ground all over the park. Boden tagged on a minor through Owens before they struck for their third goal on nine minutes, centre back Sam Molony's point effort somehow finding the net after a scramble in the O'Dwyers six yard box.

Dara Kilduff finished off the five minute rout with a fisted point on ten minutes to leave the score at 3-2 to 0-0. A period of six minutes elapsed with no scores being registered by either team. You knew it just wasn't going to be O Dwyers' day when Liam Prout's effort from a free struck the post on 13 minutes.

When Boden did rediscover their shooting boots they were relentless. Seamus Keane started off the barrage of scores with a palmed goal after the keeper had parried a Collie Dunne effort. Six further unanswered points for Boden through Dunne (2), Owens (2), Keane and Carl Molony saw them lead at the break 4-9 to 0-1, O'Dwyers' score coming from a Liam Prout free on 30 minutes.

With the game over as a contest, the calls from the O'Dwyers camp at half time were about showing pride and winning the second half. Although they did manage to up their game on the restart, it just wasn't enough as Boden surged forward at any given opportunity. The Rathfarnham side had registered four further points before O Dwyers scored their first minors from play, both from the right boot of David Smith. Boden substitute Conor Dooley then notched up 1-1 in the space of a minute, as the game turned into a procession. In the final quarter, both teams amassed 1-4 each as O Dwyers succeeded in restoring some pride. Boden will be a tough team to beat in this championship and no team will relish the thought of meeting them in the next round.

O'Dwyers will now look to refocus and they will certainly have better days this season.


