First up was the excellent mini All-Irelands Camogie on Friday 20 June in which 48 of the 2004 girls participated. The format of the competition really supported the right balance between a bit of competition and the ultimate objective of having fun. Every single girl raised their game when playing for their "county" and any disappointment of losing out in either cup or shield semi-finals was quickly wiped out by the taste of a burger or 99! (parents and coaches can take note of the important things in life here!). The support of parents who came to the club was also evident. On behalf of the 2004 girls a huge thank you to the organising committee for a great evening.

Next up for the same group of girls was the trip to Moorefield GAA club on the Curragh on Saturday 28th June for the first ever Leinster Ladies GAA "get in the game" U10 Football Blitz. Organised by Aisling Hubbard (Games Promotion Officer of Leinster Ladies GAA), 42 teams from eight counties were present (that's over 500 girls). Over the course of six matches our 43 girls (split into three panels who each played six games) played clubs from Dublin, Wicklow, Kildare, Westmeath, Offaly, Meath, Louth and Laois. The challenge set by Aisling was to "get in the game" so participation was the #1 priority. Yet again the Boden girls weren't found wanting. The spirit in which the blitz was played was supported by the fun element in which no scores were kept and out of six matches every girl played at least four full matches thanks to the rotation of the panels. On behalf of the girls and the club our thanks go to Aisling Hubbard and her colleagues for organising a terrific day. We hope this is an annual event in which future U10's from Boden will participate.

On the coach to and from the Curragh the girls were tested on their knowledge of the GAA in a quiz which also challenged them to think about recent camogie and football events in their lives.

The dual approach to this group of girls seems to be serving the club well with almost 100% cross over between both codes. Friendships are being forged that will hopefully drive on the success for both codes into the future.

Paddy Mullen Tournament

Paddy Mullen Tournament - James Stephens GAA Club Kilkenny

Ballyboden's minor hurlers departed the club at 7:45 a.m. on Saturday morning for the annual journey to James Stephens GAA Club, Kilkenny to participate in the Paddy Mullen Tournament. Eight of the best hurling teams from Cork, Tipperary, Antrim, Waterford, Kilkenny and Dublin competed to win the Paddy Mullen Cup. Since the tournament commenced in 1991 Ballyboden won the Cup in 2003 and were Shield winners in 1994, 2001, 2008 and 2011.

First up was Ballyhale Shamrocks. Sean Brennan stepped up the take responsibility for goal keeping duties in the absence of Andy Lyons. Boden knew a strong start was essential and they executed that with style with early points from Ciaran O'Brien, Michael Boland and a free from Garrett Crowley. Darragh Maguire and Cian Mellett netted two goals in the opening half. Boden defence was rock solid and limited Ballyhale to getting their scores in the first half from frees and a 65. Boden led at the break 2-3 to 1-3. Boden continued to dominate every position in the second half. Garrett Crowley gave an exhibition on free taking, knocking over 4 points and a fifth from a 65. The early ball into the forwards paid dividend with goals from Michael Boland, a second from Darragh Maguire and points from

Cian Mellett. The defence worked tirelessly and restricted Ballyhale to scoring 2 points from play in the second half. Full time score 4-12 to 1-5.

Next up was Glen Rovers of Cork who had beaten Mount Sion in their opening game. This was a physical and bruising encounter where Boden stood up to the task at hand. Boden exploded out of the blocks with an opening minute goal from Michael Boland, followed up with a point from Cian Kelly. Garret Crowley continued to excel at free taking knocking over another 4 points and a fifth from a 65. The defence lines led by Ruadhan Fanning at full back and Fergal Murray at centre back were excellent and contained Glen Rovers to scoring three points in the first 20 minutes, one from play and two from frees. Boden were awarded a penalty and Garrett Crowley's shot was saved on the line. Darragh Maguire caused problems for the Glen Rover full back line and sored a goal, kicking the sliotar passed the keeper. Boden led at the break 2-7 to 0-3. The second half continued with high intensity and hard hitting. Glen Rovers worked hard and began picking off points from play and frees. Boden had no intention of relenting their lead and responded with points from Michael Boland, Darragh Maguire and Garrett Crowley. Conor Dean brought the game to a conclusion with a superb goal, final score 3-12 to 2-8.

Boden were set against Blackrock in the final, Blackrock won this tournament four out of the last five years. They had three county minors playing with them and were first out of the blocks knocking over a point followed up with a well-executed goal. Boden stayed in touch with points from Garrett Crowley and Conor Dean and went in at the break one point down, 1-5 to 0-7. The second half continued at blistering pace and the tired and weary bodies of the Boden lads was beginning to show. Blackrock gave and exhibition on high fielding and their defence was outstanding, closing down every Boden attack. Blackrock continued to tag on points and began to stretch a lead. Cian Kelly, Garrett Crowley and Cian Murray knocked over points keeping Boden in touch. Boden got a lifeline when they were awarded a penalty, unfortunately Michael Boland's shot was stopped by the keeper. Blackrock closed out the game with a second goal and were deserved winners with a scoreline of 2-12 to 0-10.

Congratulations to Blackrock of their fine win.

The Boden squad had nothing left to give after 120 minutes of intense high standard hurling. Each and every one of them can be immensely proud of their outstanding performance and for the manner they represented Ballyboden St Endas.

I have no doubt the top level of hurling played during this tournament will stand to the players in their championship preparation. Ten of the squad are eligible to participate in this tournament next year.

The Boden Munster Team had mixed results, losing the first game against a very strong Dicksboro outfit before beating Athenry and then drawing with Eire Og from Kildare. The team lost the final by a single point to fellow Dublin team Na Fianna.

The strong combined results of both Boden teams also ensured qualification for the "Club of the Day" final against the holders Naas. Naas took the honours in the combined scores games.

Hats off to Naas for organising such a fantastic event and ties with the club remain strong with former Boden men Martin Kelleher and Mick Maher involved in the organising committee.

BBSE Winners of U16 Hurling All Ireland Blitz 2014

BALLYBODEN ST ENDAS - WINNERS of the CARLOW TOWN HURLING CLUB, ALL-IRELAND UNDER-16 BLITZ 2014

Once again, the cream of Ireland's emerging young hurling talent was on display in Carlow town on Saturday last, June 28th, when Carlow Town Hurling Club hosted their annual All-Ireland under-16 blitz on a magnificent sunshine filled day.

This annual event is split into 2 draws, the 'A' draw for Division 1 clubs and 'B' for Division 2 clubs, from all around the country.

Ballyboden were drawn in Group 4 of the 'A' draw at Graiguecullen GAA Club and faced stiff opposition in Camross of LAOIS, Cuala of DUBLIN and the Clare County Champions, KILMALEY. There was no back door option here, only the winning team would advance to the All-Ireland semi-final stage. No Pressure.....

Despite nervous starts in the morning, Boden had good wins over both Camross and Cuala (as did Kilmaley) so it was going to be down to the Clare champions and ourselves to see who would advance and who would be on the long road home in the afternoon sun.

Kilmaley got off to a great start and it looked as though we were in real trouble as they moved 4 points clear before we scored our first goal. A further 2 point by Kilmaley and we managed a second goal just before the half time whistle to go in all square on a score line of 2-0 to 0-6.

15 minute half's pass by very quickly and we knew we would have to be much better in the second half to have a chance against this superb Clare team who must have been mystified as to why they were not much further ahead. Such is hurling!

The second half started off where it left off however the Boden lads, with the benefit of wise words in the half time huddle from Seamie, Andrew and Conor, hit the ground running this time and scored 4 goals and 6 points, to 2 points from Kilmaley. Kilmaley were rightly shocked and like true champions battled hard to the end but it was not to be for them and Boden advanced (with a final score of 6-6 to 0-8) to the Semi's to face another great Clare Team, CLARECASTLE, (victors in Group 3 over St Aidans of Ferns, Eire Og, Ennis and Old Christians of Limerick) with the winners facing Group 1 winners KILMALLOCK of Limerick who had won their earlier semi-final encounter by a single point (2-9 to 2-8) against Group 2 winners KILNADEEMA-LEITRIM.

The semi-final, played in the sweltering afternoon heat at Carlow Town Hurling Club was another low scoring first half and a stiff test of both character and nerves. Boden left the pitch at the half with the tightest of margins (Boden 1-1 to Clarecastle 0-3). It was all to play for in the second half and once again Boden proved victorious with a final score line of 2-3 to 1-4.

The Final got underway at 5:55pm and it was still very hot out there!

Kilmallock, perhaps with the benefit of the additional rest time, were much quicker to the ball and were 3 points ahead before we registered our first point. After that it was score for score up to the half time whistle with Kilmallock going in at the break with a slender lead of 0-6 to 0-5. The water break and half time words were to again reap their reward as the lads exhibited the character, the will and the courage needed at times like these as they summoned the very last bit of energy they had to push on and record a fantastic and inspirational victory of 1-9 to 0-9 over a very fine and understandably very disappointed Kilmallock team.

Over the course of the long day, the Boden lads battled the heat, the opposition, the fatigue and still maintained their composure and belief under very trying conditions.

Throughout the day there were noteworthy performances from Conor O Donoghue, Darragh Byrne, Luke Corcoran, Karl Weldon, Ciaran Crowley, James Holland, Hugh Keller, Shane Kennedy, Cillian Byrne, Mikey Dunne, Tommy Deane, Aidan Mellett, Sean Gorman, Ciaran Ryan, Aaron Coffey, Michael O Brien, Sean O Byrne, Conor Barton and Eoin Monahan.

A worthy mention also to Kilmallock and in particular their young Captain, who despite his great disappointment displayed great dignity and sportsmanship toward his opponents at the final whistle.

Thank you to Seamie O Neill, Conor McCormack, Andrew Coffey, Jerry Corcoran and Alan Mc Grath for preparing the team. To the many parents and supporters who travelled on the day a special thanks.

This victory is a first for Ballyboden St Endas and only the second time a Dublin club has won the 'A' final since the competition began in 1997.

Finally, a special word of thanks to Dan Harnedy and Martin Walsh of Carlow Town hurling Club for organising and managing a very fine event and to Graiguecullen GAA Club, our hosts in the group matches.

Finally thanks to the boys for the pleasure, pride and joy you gave us during our Feile adventure.


