BBSE 2-26 St. Kevin's 1-20

Ballyboden Senior B hurlers limed out in Sancta Maria on Saturday 30th August in the quarter final of the Championship against Kevins. With a strong panel from which to choose, manager Ciarán Maguire sent the team out full in the knowledge that they faced a determined side that would ask questions of the home team.

Kevins, playing with the wind, started well and a goal by their wispy corner forward gave them a 4 point lead after six minutes. Boden kept in touch through strong running by Austen Lynch and a brace of Niall Ryan frees and upped the pace of the game shortly after when winning a batch of puckouts through Peter McEvoy and Jamie Desmond. Points by Colm O'Neill and Chris Lambert were answered by Kevins and a key score came in the 20th minute when Paul Doherty broke through for a goal that put Boden one point ahead. Desmond, Keith McCarron and Eoin Small were winning good ball towards the end of a well-balanced half that left the score at the break at 1-9 apiece.

The intensity of the match went up a few notches in the second half as a semi-final prize was in sight. Captain Darragh O'Gorman repelled a number of Kevins attacks as each team made huge efforts to gain the upper hand. With Ryan's departure through injury, Boden kept the scoreboard ticking over through the assured free-taking of O'Neill with goalkeeper Conor Dooley chipping in with a brace of long-range missiles. The battle to gain the upper hand was reflected on the scoreboard with the team level seven times throughout the second period. With five minutes to go, Boden were a point to the good. Kevins refused to yield and nudged ahead as the attendance anxiously checked the clock. As the game moved into injury time, Boden won a free at half way. Dooley took the responsibility and cleanly fired over the equalising point to send this epic tussle into injury time. Score at full-time Boden 1-17 Kevins 1-17.

Into extra-time of two ten-minute halves, Boden's subs began to make their presence felt. Paddy Ryan was winning great ball in the half-back line and Tom Hanafin was doing well under the puckouts. An inspirational point from Kenneth Wigglesworth after a catch and 25m run sent out a strong message and moments later, daylight was finally put between the teams when Naoise Greene sent the ball to the net. This gave Boden a five-point lead at the break. The water bottles had been refilled at this stage and were needed as the heat of evening sun began to take its toll. Boden's superior fitness levels came to the fore in the final ten minutes and with Kevins registering only one additional point, Boden pulled ahead to finish on a scoreline of 2-26 to 1-20. The semi-final opponents are as yet unknown but this match will certainly have proved useful for the squad in their preparations over the coming weeks.

Dublin U16 Hurlers in Tournament Win

Dublin win The Tipperary Supporters Club Under 16 Inter County Hurling Tournament, formerly known as The Arrabawn Tournament.

Dublin's U16 Hurlers epitomised the development of hurling in the county as they captured their first ever All-Ireland U16 John Doyle Perpetual trophy on Saturday 30th August in Dundrum, Co Tipperary.

The A tournament in its 27th year and has been sponsored by The Tipperary Supporters Club since 2006. The competition has official recognition from the GAA as the All Ireland U16 Championship and it is organised and run in County Tipperary in August each year by Tipperary GAA Bord na nÓg. This year saw 11 participating counties and they were divided into 3 groups. Its a competition that Dublin have never won until now! Dublin were hosted by Clonoulty-Rossmore GAA in West Tipperary, eleven miles from Cashel.

First match was at 10.30am against Clare and Dublin won with a scoreline of 2:7 to 1:6. 2nd up was Wexford which was a tight, tense affair with Dublin prevailing 1:7 to 1:4. The final group game against Offaly was more one sided and Dublin won-out well with a scoreline of 7-10 to 0-5. As Dublin topped their group, they had home advance for the semi final where they met Waterford, who had played their group stages in Dundrum in a grouping which saw them play Galway and Limerick. The game was tight at the offset but once Dublin settled they took the upper hand winning comfortably with a final score of 3:9 to 1:4. It was then off to Dundrum to face Kilkenny in the final at 5.45pm.

In the final, Dublin went 0-4 to 0-0 down in the first half of 15 minutes and at half time were still trailing Kilkenny by three points. Dublin came back fighting and had levelled the game by the full time whistle which took the game to extra time (5 minutes a side). Dublin went ahead with 3 points early in the 1st 5 minutes and held that lead til the final blow of the whistle. Dublin 1:9 Kilkenny 0:9
