Ballyboden St Enda's Minor B team had a tough enough start in their first Championship match. Weather conditions were quite blustery, but it was a fine and bright morning over in Rolestown. Ballyboden had a good start as Ross McGrath scored a point within the first minute. Fingal Ravens tried to even the score straight away but shot wide. Ballyboden got 3 great points in quick succession, first by Ruairí Kirwan from a free, followed swiftly by 2 from Philip McCormack. Fingal Ravens keeper had trouble making sure of his kick outs and Ballyboden had a couple of chances on goal, one being saved and the second knocked wide. Next kick out was won by Luke and he brought it straight back down passing it to Philip, who got his second point which was followed a few minutes later with a point by Liam. Ballyboden Senior B hurlers bowed out of the championship in O'Toole Park on Sunday 14th September in the semi-final against Setanta.

On a fine, clear day the opening tussles were evenly matched and the sides were level after ten

minutes on a pair of points each, Boden scorers being Conor Dooley from a free and a fine Austen Lynch point from play. Jamie Desmond was having a storming game at centre back, picking up loose ball and winning puckouts with some great catches. Up front, Adam Jermyn and Jonathon O'Driscoll were causing problems for the Setanta defence, particularly on the left hand side. On the quarter hour mark, Chris Lambert won a puckout and ran into space before delivering a shot that was saved by the Setanta keeper. However, Naoise Greene was



on hand to snap up the rebound and send the ball to the net. Setanta, however, scored the next three points from frees to bring the sides level – these were three from a total of eight granted to Setanta on the day. Further points by Greene, Kenneth Wigglesworth and Lambert left one in it at the break – Boden 1-6 Setanta 0-10.

Boden started well in the second half with Desmond and Matty Weldon working hard in the middle of the field. The game followed a similar pattern though and Boden, despite pressure and a few goal chances, could not find the net for a second time. Paul Doherty and a brace of long range points from Desmond kept Boden in touch. Sub Donal Butler hit the post and a few chances from outfield drifted wide as the game moved into the closing stages. Further subs were introduced but unfortunately, could not unlock the northsiders' defence and despite only having a puck of a ball between the teams, the game ended frustratingly on a scoreline of Boden 1-10 to Setanta 0-16.

Afterwards manager Ciarán Maguire and captain Darragh O'Gorman thanked the players for their effort on the day. Boden will always be a hard team to beat and the lads upheld that record throughout the year with some great championship performances – this team will have other great days.


