# **Important - Membership Card & Bar Pricing**

Every Club member, born before the Year 2000, who has paid their membership fee for 2014, should have received their membership card by now. Cards will not be posted due to costs and will not be available from the bar staff unless by prior arrangement with the Club Registrar.

Existing members should check with playing section officers and team mentors as some cards have been distributed through the sections and have still not been collected by members. If

the card is not with the playing section, you may contact the Chairman of the Registration Committee Liam Carter at registrar@bodengaa.ie, and Liam will endeavour to obtain a new membership card for you as soon as possible.

The membership card in the past has been just that ---- a membership card. However with effect from Monday 6th October, all that will change. From that date, there will be 2 bar price lists introduced by the bar manager Michael Farrell (at the request of the Executive) and the members price (the cheaper one) will only be available to members who produce their membership card to conduct the transaction.

#### The membership card can be activated in 2 ways:

(1) You can go into the bar and give the bar staff member on duty a sum of money (say € 20). This money will be credited to your account on the membership card and you can use it to purchase drink or food, whenever you wish. Every time you make a purchase using your card, your balance will appear at the end of your receipt. We recommend that members avail of the new membership card system in this manner.

(2) Alternatively, if you have no cash value on your card, you can still use it by presenting the card to the bar staff member on duty and paying by cash in the usual manner. This method will also allow you to purchase goods at the member's price.

So please ensure that you bring your card with you when visit the club! If you haven't received your card, please ensure that you collect it in the next few weeks.

## Hurling News - Last min win over Cuala

The story of this game is a story of missed chances. It boiled down to a frantic last few minutes and Cuala spurning a bagful of opportunities to end Boden's run. By then they had a stranglehold on the game, with Boden on the *"backfoot*" and clockwatching!

The title-holders could have wrapped up this tie in the opening 30, but a stack of wides ruined an otherwise near-perfect performance. Paul Ryan showed well for well placed ball and scored from play and frees. Cuala had their chances and through Gough and Connolly, kept in touch. Shane Durkin, Niall McMorrow, David Curtin and Ryan got the best of the scores, and Paul had a good goal chance, but he prodded the ball just past the post. In defence, Jamie Desmond, Stephen O'Connor and James Madden did the business, while on the Cuala side, Oisin Gough was influential.

#### Half Time came with Boden 12 and Cuala 6.

The second period was an altogether different affair with Cuala chalking up five unanswered points. Their corner-man was downed in the inner-sanctum after two minutes, but a poor shot for a goal was saved. That only got their resolve going, and over the next ten minutes they dominated, with Treacy and Cronin breaking ball to create point chances. In defence, Durkin was mopping up ball as fast as it could be landed in his territory, but the real problems were elsewhere for the champions. Boden stopped the rot, when Dean Curran got the ball to Gavin Corrigan, he was fouled and Ryan got a valuable score. 13 to 11. Back came Cuala with a great score from the sixty and with Gough becoming more of a force, he was, strangely, penalised for a throw ball and Ryan punished in his usual style from seventy yards. Madden won a fifty-fifty ball and got it to Collie O'Neill, he passed to Finn McGarry, who pointed one of the best scores of the day.. With 5 minutes left, Connolly pointed from a free to leave just two in it, and with time running out, they got the difference down to just one, a fine shot from mid-field. Cuala now were in the driving seat, but spurned three chances to dump Boden out. Some good defending by Boden ensured that the tie would end on the slenderest of margins.

# **U15 B Football Championship**

#### U15 B Football Championship - Quarter Final - BBSE U15B 3:12 - 0:9 Fingal Ravens.

Following a convincing win over St. Anne's in round 1, the lads came out well prepared for a tough game against Fingal Ravens. "Ravens" were a largely unknown quantity, being a mixture of under 14 and under 16 players as they don't field an under 15 league team. However, the only league defeat our Boden B team have suffered in nearly 16 months was at the hands of Round Towers Lusk who went down by 10 points to Ravens and so the boys knew that there was a difficult task ahead of them. With that in mind, and with the cooperation of the U15 hurling groups the boys put in two fast paced training sessions in the week preceding the game and preparations were as complete as possible. Despite a couple of last minute injury worries the squad was at full strength with the exception of Cathal Creed who was side lined under Physio's orders.

On a perfect, warm morning with no noticeable breeze, Boden got off to a strong start, losing the ball at the throw in but winning it back quickly on our own 45 metre line and launching a promising attack only just missing out to a point in the first minute. Despite some strong tackling and determined play by Fingal it was all Boden in the first ten minutes with the initial pressure being kept up and the first point was scored by Luke Grady in the 3rd minute with his less-favoured left foot. This was followed by points from Conor O'Donoghue (2) and Jason Francis before Ravens finally found a way through and won a free which was duly slotted over at around 12 minutes. A minute later Ravens closed the gap further with a well taken point by their strong full forward – one of very few opportunities their forwards were able to capitalise on in the first half thanks to a masterful display of defending by the Boden backs. Further points from Eoin McGarvey (2) and Ryan Bradshaw followed, increasing the lead to 5 points before a great move, started by Adam O'Neill who chose to keep the ball in play rather than let it go out for a Boden sideline ball on the half way line, followed by two pinpoint passes and a very clever lay off by Shane Garvey, was finished off calmly with a

#### goal by Joey O'Sullivan to end the first half with a score line of 1:7 to 0:2.

As expected, there was a backlash to be dealt with and Fingal came out fired up and very strong in the 2nd half, with some well worked positional changes, and scored 4 points in quick succession within the first 5 minutes. The Boden lads looked less confident and not as organised as they were in the first half but within ten minutes of the restart had once again found their rhythm and had neutralised the very effective changes made by the North County men at half time. Once they settled, Boden struck back with 2 more points by Eoin McGarvey and Joey O'Sullivan. At around the 45 minute mark Boden substitutes were brought in to the game and almost immediately had an impact. Cillian O'Connor, just a few minutes on the pitch, scored a goal to put us firmly back in control. Boden were well ahead by now but both teams continued to play with fire and determination. The intensity of tackling never abated and nothing was easy. Fingal kept the pressure up and scored another 3 points but Boden's trademark teamwork in passing up the pitch for the full 60 minutes ensured a couple more points from Eoin McGarvey and Luke Grady, and a goal from Ciaran O'Meara which he made look very easy with a cool finish. A fantastic point from Ciaran Cashman bursting through from half back ended a great match with a well-deserved win for Boden.

# Final score 3:12 to 0:9 to secure Boden's place in the semi-final away to Castleknock on October 12th.

This Boden team plays as a unit and although the scoring players are all named above, the result was due to a 100% team effort with all 15 players on the field working together towards a common goal.
