#### Boden qualify for the MINOR A Semi after a 2 12 to 0 11 win over Clontarf

Octoberfest has arrived and championship matches come thick and fast. A workmanlike performance, particularly in the second half, helped Boden to overcome a spirited Clontarf, our visitors to Sancta Maria, on Sunday morning.

'Tarf belied their pointless position on the table, by opening in rampant mood. Johnny Mullins, Brian Mullins nephew, attacked off the 65 and arrowing one over at the all-weather end. Garrett Crowley responded with a free, after Darragh Maguire was fouled, and was again on target, after accepting a gift on the 40. But up pops Mullins again, hitting a beauty on his favoured left side, followed by a free from Cian O'Flaherty. Boden's Cian Murray cleared his line, found Conor Deane, who was upended illegally and Crowley did the rest.

Whistleman, J.C. Ryan got busy in the office following some robust exchanges, booking players from both sides. Ciaran O'Brien pointed after an assist from Murray, 4 to 3. Deano found Cian Mellett and he got a beauty from the 40. Now enter the Clontarf talisman, Mullins, and a goal chance, but he fluffed his lines, escape for the home side. The next four scores were shared, Cian Kelly and Mellett for the home side and two frees for the sea-siders. Now, Clontarf's best chance, a penalty, after Ruadhain got in close and personal with his marker, ball in hand! Andy Lyons saved the shot and the clearance led to Rian Cannon slotting one over. Half time, Boden one up, 8 to 7.

Boden opened the second half with the wind and a free by Crowley. Another free, indirect this time, was planted into the dangerzone and after "ping-pong" in the square, Maguire prodded the ball to the net. 1.9 to 7pts. But Clontarf were not finished, Foley found O'Flaherty and he pointed a great score from the 60. He and Crowley shared points, before Mellett found Cannon and he got a beauty from about the 50. Boden had a series of goal chances, before the most unlikely of them went to the net off a shot from Deane, a rare mistake from the 'Tarf custodian.

Overall, Ballyboden will be happier with the result more than the display. Clontarf will rue a host of missed chances and their failure to press our defence.

#### **Senior and Intermediate Championships**

A mixed weekend for our top two teams as the Championship brought success and failure. On Friday our Inters faced a tough task against Fingallians in their semi-final in Parnell Park in poor conditions. In an error strung game both sides found it difficult to take their scores but crucially when all was told Fins were a little more accurate. The first 20 minutes was played predominantly in the Fins half with Boden well on top but it counted for nothing because after those 20mins we found ourselves a few points down. Score while you're on top a wise man once said and in truth we failed to do that. The game was fairly even though right up to the last minute of normal time and it took a Carl Molony point to take the game to extra time. The loss of Cormac Smyth to a black card at the end of normal time had a big impact as Fins grabbed a quick fire goal and a point in the fiirst few mins of extra time and we never recovered from that despite the players giving their all and the game ended 1-10 to 1-05. Well done to the management and players for their efforts in reaching the semi-final.

Attention then turned to the Seniors who started as favourites against Lucan in O'Toole Park on Sunday afternoon. A large crowd turned out to witness a steady if unspectactular win to

set up a semi-final tie against the All-Ireland Champions St.Vincent's. See report from GrassrootsGAA below.

#### Ballyboden St. Enda's 0-14 Lucan Sarsfields 0-9 By Cilian Murphy

Ballyboden St. Enda's produced a workmanlike performance to defeat Lucan Sarsfields in O'Toole Park today and progress to the championship semi-finals where they will meet St. Vincent's in two weeks' time. Boden led by 0-10 to 0-4 at half time having played with a strong wind and down the slope but their tactic of playing a sweeper and keeping the ball was ultimately what eased them over the line. Their defence was on top for large periods of the game, rarely affording the Lucan forwards any time on the ball to pick a pass or slot over scores. Some positional changes were noticeable on the Lucan team with Peter Kelly handed the man-marking responsibility of keeping Conal Keaney quiet, which for the most part he succeeded in doing. Somewhat more surprisingly, Stephen O'Shaughnessy was deployed as a link man at centre forward for Lucan. Johnny McCaffrey operated as a sweeper at the back for his side while Emmet O'Conghaile moved between midfield and full forward to great effect, particularly in the first half. And it was Boden who stamped their authority on the match early on as they raced into an early four point lead through Declan O'Mahoney (2), Andrew Kerin (free) and Ryan Basquel (free). Sean Newcombe responded for Lucan on 13 minutes with a neat effort after good build-up play from Johnny McCaffrey and the impressive Brendan Gallagher. Gallagher was getting on a huge amount of ball in the first half but his side saw very little in the way of scores from that possession as Boden made it difficult for Lucan when they got into the scoring zone. The Rathfarnham men then rattled off a further three scores in a row through Basquel (free), Sam Moloney and Kerin once more, as they raced into a 0-7 to 0-1 lead after 18 minutes. Emmet O'Conghaile took the game to Boden throughout and he pulled a score back for his side on 19 minutes. His powerful running and ability to break through the tackle could well see him involved more heavily with Jim Gavin's Dublin squad next season. Despite being against the strong breeze, Lucan were enjoying plenty of possession but their shooting let them down as they racked up seven wides in the first half alone. The game went into a bit of a lull leading up to half time with both sides trading a couple of points apiece through Gallagher (free) and O'Conghaile for Lucan and Molony and Kerin (free) for Boden.

The half time score-line read, Ballyboden 0-10 Lucan 0-4.

Many were expecting Emmet O'Conghaile to be stationed on the Boden six-yard box for the second period, given that Lucan had the benefit of the hill and the wind. However, the positional change never materialised and Lucan were somewhat toothless in attack as a result. Boden played the wind and hill far more appropriately than Brigid's had done in the first match by carrying the ball and keeping possession rather than playing high aimless balls into their forward line. Indeed, Conal Keaney got the first score of the second period following a spell of possession where the ball had passed through the hands of at least six Boden players. Brendan Gallagher pointed a free for Lucan on 38 minutes to punctuate a lull in scoring that had descended on the match like a winter's fog. Sam Molony scored his hattrick of points on 42 minutes with a superb long range effort after being teed up by Declan O'Mahoney and Aran Waters. There were no further scores for eight minutes as both side's defences held the upper hand. O'Conghaile was the man to break the cycle with a fine individual effort on 50 minutes, taking his man out of the game with a dummy on his right before turning back and swinging over a sublime effort off his left.Brian Collopy was another man taking the game to Boden with vigour and he was rewarded for a lung-bursting run when he was awarded a free on the 45 metre line. Brendan Gallagher stepped up to reduce the deficit once more. The anticipated onslaught from Lucan never materialised as the game

petered out with a series of frees scored by both teams.

Boden ran out 0-14 to 0-9 winners and they will meet St. Vincent's in Parnell Park in two weeks' time.

Best of luck to all of our teams in these vital games, PLEASE support our girls as they try to bring home some silverware!


#### Senior 1 Championship Ballyboden St Endas Senior A 2-13 Na Fianna 0-7

The club has almost 80 boys competing on its 4 under 12 football teams. Last Saturday saw the conclusion of three of the teams fixtures. Under 12 is the first competitive year for the boys and marks the end of the "Go-Games" program for this group. Our four teams play in Divisions 1,4,7 & 9 and have all enjoyed an excellent season in very competitive leagues.

#### **Under 12A - Division 1**

It only seems like yesterday, when 18 boys were put together to play in the grading games with the ultimate aim of competing in Division 1. In fact, that was last February and the year has just flown by. The goals set out by the mentors at the start of the year were to play as a team, enjoy yourself and to learn new skills along the way.

As it transpired, after a solid and consistent season, we set out, for our final game, to St. Patrick's in Donabate today in the shake up for a shot at the play offs.

The 2nd half found us playing up the hill and into a strengthening wind which meant that our 3 point cushion wasn't going to be enough unless the boys upped the performance levels. And upped the performance they did! Our lads dominated Castleknock from the first minute of the 2nd half to the last and recorded an excellent 4-12 to 3-05 victory on the day.

The win was built on a superb defensive performance with Sean Dempsey in goals putting in a superb display. Adam & Daragh at full back contested every ball and our half back line of Yan, Kevin and Luke worked up and down the field really well. Thankfully our forwards managed to convert almost every chance they got with the excellent Eamon O'Brien scoring 2 excellent goals and a string of superb points. Eoin McWeeney, Rian, Matt and Sean O'Donoghue all chipped in with excellent scores as well. The midfield of Behailu and Jack was immense from start to finish - both performances worthy of a man of the match award.

Throughout the year this group have shown huge determination in all their games and have displayed a commitment to improve week on week. Last Saturday was no exception. It was an excellent performance all round with the boys wrapping up the season with a performance that their application and dedication deserved.

#### **Under 12C**

The U12C football team finished off a successful league campaign with a trip to St Patrick's Donabate on Saturday morning. An early start found us on the fine Ballymastone GAA grounds for an 11am throw-in where the chilly winds gave way to fine sunny playing conditions. Boden started off with the breeze at our backs and it wasn't long before Timmy Cleary started knocking over spectacular points to give us an early lead. Good work in the middle of the park from Seamus Boyle and Dean Jackson helped us break even against a fine Donabate central pairing. The Fingal boys kept chipping away at our lead but goals from the ebullient Timmy and ever-running David Monahan kept our noses in front. Some fine goalkeeping from Cian Tobin initially and later by Senan Woods kept the Donabate lads at bay. The two Jacks (Creedon and Coyle) worked hard in defence and covered a lot of ground to contain the Donabate onslaught late in the first half. At the break the teams turned with
