Football News - U21 Footballers through to Champ Final



Boden 2-09 Crokes 1-07

The season kicked off in earnest over the weekend with a fine win by our under 21 footballers in the semi-final of the county championship against Kilmacud in Pairc Ui Mhurchu. Whatever was said to the lads at half-time (and the full story has yet to be revealed) needs to be bottled and may need to be used for the final. It is heartening to see a performance where the team struggled to find their form early on and yet managed to dig out a performance against a strong Kilmacud side (especially going into the second half 3 points down against the wind). They out scored their opponents in the second half 2-3 to 0-1, holding Crokes scoreless for the last 25 minutes.

In the first half Kilmacud raced into a 4 point lead and were up 5 point to 1 after 15 minutes. The lads found it difficult to overcome the Kilmacud sweeper defense system early on. However this team knows how to dig deep and points from Dan Buckingham (2), Conor Dooley, Sam Molony, Barra McGarry and Colm Basquel saw the team claw themselves back into the game. Just as we thought we were gaining the upper hand, Kilmacud breached our defense for the first goal of the game. It couldn't have come at a worse time - just before the half time whistle. However this is where all good management teams earn their crust and our lads surely did!!.

Second half saw us start poorly again, conceding the first point and nearly letting Crokes in for a second goal. A great save by Dara Gogan (one on one) and the comeback began. This was followed by a Boden penalty – the Crokes full back fouling Conor Dooley. Conor had the confidence to take the penalty himself and score he did (the definition of all good penalties!!). This was followed by a Barra McGarry point. And then the key score of the game. Barra was on the end of a wonderful move up the pitch and finished the move with a well placed shot to the net. Points by Conor Dooley and Sam Molony rounded off a fine win.

To football news in general. All our teams are back in pre-season training. The Adult 1&2 panel structure is up and running. However we are not quite there yet. We are still looking for at least one additional resource. The panel is busy integrating gym with outdoor training sessions in preparation for the season ahead. In addition, the success of the 21's while placing its own demands has facilitated valuable internal training matches between all concerned thanks to the cooperation of both Management teams. The Adult 3 panel is also up and running. And while we didn't lose John Mulligan to the Donegal county team (despite the strong rumour), the panel is looking for a trainer. Again anyone interested, let us know and we can discuss further. The Adult 4 panel are busy with their pre season gym and outdoor training. They have a full management team in place now and will no doubt be challenging for honours once again this year.

Our minor management teams are coming together slowly. We anticipate 4 minor teams this year which is a credit to the Minor and Under16 management teams from last year. Minor 1, 2 and 4 management positions are filled. However we are still looking to complete the Minor 3 management team. The season is a long season ahead with a lot of competing demands for the lads. The management of the season's time-table will be vital to ensure the lads reach their potential.

Best of luck to all our players and management teams in the year ahead – whatever it takes.

Well done to Michael Darragh and the Dublin Seniors this weekend on their O'Byrne Cup success. We hope this is a good omen for things to come this year.





Advice for Mentors of Club Injury Procedure Juvenile Boy's 9-16 years.

If an injury occurs during a match report the injury to referee to be sure he/she has a note of it for inclusion in match report. Take details of injury yourself and make sure it is recorded at the time.

Advise parents /guardians of our procedure in dealing with an injury.

Always fill in a Preliminary Injury Form available to download from club website.

Injuries of (€100 and under) and Physiotherapy claims (form on website) do not go through the insurance procedure. They are dealt within the club. Also there is a separate form for Physiotherapy claim.

If the injury is more serious at that stage please fill in a GAA Injury Claim Form also on the website.

If a mentor or parent/guardian has any issues or questions about any of the above please contact (details below).

Please note all documents mentioned above are available to download from the club website on the right hand side, the fourth option down under Useful Links- Gents Injury Forms-Juvenile Procedures.

U16/17/18 Hurling & Camogie Pre-Season Coaching Prog Week 2

Session Number 2 of the above Programme took place on Friday last with a particular focus on game time Work Rate and Tackling while re-capping on Session 1 focus of Effective Striking.

Coaches David Sweeney, Darragh Spain, Richie Sweetnam, Conor McCormack, David Curtin, Sorcha Farrelly and Emmet Carroll delivered an excellent session to a healthy turnout of players



on the night, which included pitch and skills wall activities. While this was ongoing, an additional Programme element was introduced for the benefit of other hurling and camogie mentors in attendance. Programme co-ordinator Paudie O'Neill formally involved this broader group by outlining the coaching aims, objectives and approaches, as the group observed from the margins of the activities.

This Pre-Season Hurling/Camogie Coaching Programme continues over the new two Friday evenings involving players from:

- · The 2015 U16 hurling squads
- · 2015 first year Minor hurlers (last year's U16's)
- · 2015 Camogie Squads in final year at U16/17/18

The ambitions and objectives of the Programme are to:

- · prepare juvenile players for the transition to adult levels;
- enable players to perform to their optimum level in the coming season;
- \cdot create a forum for coaches within the Club and to develop a common coaching approach to achieve these other objectives.

All current hurling and camogie mentors are welcome to attend the remaining two coaching sessions to observe and pick up some ideas on a games-based approach to coaching. The key focus of Session 3 on Fri next, 30th Jan, from 19:00 to 20:15 at Sancta Maria will be on Aerial Play, including Catching, Batting and Knock-downs. The session will also integrate elements from previous weeks on Striking, Tackling and Work Rate in a games-based context.

Dublin Sth Colleges 3-14 Dublin Nrth Colleges 1-16 (after extra time)

Dr Croke Cup, Group Schools Final, Parnell Park, 8pm January 26th.

The cream of Dublin underage hurling was on display on Monday night in Parnell Park when Dublin South Colleges played Dublin North Colleges in the Leinster Senior Colleges Schools Group Final.

Ballyboden was represented by Robert Leddy, Aaron Coffey and Aidan Mellett.

Dublin North Colleges overcame Wexford Schools on a scoreline of 2-12 to 0-14 and Antrim Schools by 0-20 to 2-7 to reach this stage of the competition. Meanwhile Dublin South had a 1-17 to 1-15 win over Laois schools to progress.

Dublin North, in Sky Blue, took an early lead with a free converted by Colin Currie but it wasnt long before the Southsiders settled into their task and were leading 3-06 to 0-08 at the break.

As expected in the second half, Paul O Brien's lads closed the gap to three points by the 45th minute and looked set to snatch victory when North Captain Matthew Oliver goaled three minutes from time to propel the lads into a 1 point lead only to have substitute Rian Doyle slot over the equaliser to force the contest into extra-time.

Dub South raised their game in extra time to go ahead and South finished on top prevailing by 4 points. In a show of unity, both squads did their post match cool down together and all gathered together in a huddle around incoming Minor manager Johnny McGuirk for a few words. South Dublin go on to play Good Counsel from Wexford in the Quarter Final next Saturday 31st January in Carlow.
