Ballyboden St Endas bring the Feile na nGael 2015 Cup home

Our U14 Hurlers began their epic journey on Saturday morning heading over to Silver Park where Kilmacud Crokes were hosting Division One Feile na nGael, 2015. In a group, which consisted of hosts Crokes, Lucan Sarsfields and St Vincents, Ballyboden's 1st match kicked off at 10.30am against the Northsiders, St. Vincents. Played under what can only be decided as horrendous weather conditions, the game ended in a draw, ... 1:03 apiece. Wind and heavy rain persisted throughout the morning making playing condtions very difficult however Boden prevailed winning their next 2 matches, beating Lucan Sarsfields (0:09 to 0:02), followed by Crokes (3:05 to 2:03) in their final game to top the group with St Vincents taking runners up spot.

A well deserved rest for the lads that afternoon gave them time to dry off and rest ahead of their Semi Final when they returned on Sunday morning to Silver Park and saw off the boys from Whitehall Colmcille's. In what were more favorable weather conditions, Ballyboden won comfortably with a scoreline of 0:7 to 0:2.

1st break of the game was a Boden one down the left wing with a magnificient point from play, at tight angle, which set Boden on their way, followed soon after with a Charlie Harper goal. Castleknock tried to move the ball up into their forward line only to come up against a very strong Boden defence who kept Castleknock scoreless in the 1st half.

The second half saw Ballyboden playing with the benefit of a slight wind. Castleknock had a period of dominance early in the 2nd half but were unable to convert scores save for 1 point. BBSE continued to tack on the scores, putting the game beyond Castleknock's reach. With an emminent victory in sight, Ballyboden was able to empty the bench giving everyone the opportunity to play their part in this great day.

All in all, it was a tremendous team effort with so many great individual performances that are too numerous to name each player.

Kilkenny's Erin's Own take the Cian Durkin Cup

The Ninth Annual Cian Durkin Memorial Tournament took place on May Bank Holiday Monday.

The tournament, for U15 hurlers, celebrates the life of Ballyboden hurler Cian Durkin tragically taken from us in 2006 aged just 15yrs of age.

This year, the club welcomed teams from five counties, Oulart-the-Ballagh from Wexford, Toomevarra from Tipp, Erin's Own from Kilkenny and Ballygunner from Waterford joining

Mallow from Cork who have played every year of the tournament. We are very grateful to all the clubs for their enthusiastic involvement in the Tournament, particularly Mallow, who hosted Cian as part of the Ballyboden team at National Feile all those years ago.

We would also like to recognise Oulart-the-Ballagh's participation in light of their own recent tragedy. Their current U15 team also suffered terrible loss this year. Talented hurler Conor Byrne died in a motor accident just months ago and was a member of the Oulart team that played today. A poignant reminder of of how short life can be.

The Tournament began with two groups of three and Boden found themselves pitted against Oulart and Ballygunner.

The first match against Oulart started well. Early goals from Luke Dwyer and Cillian Kirwan saw Boden into a healthy early lead that they never relinquished. Strong performances in defence led by Captain Conor Kelly limited Oulart to just the occasional chance. At the other end of the pitch, Dillon Dunleavy's high fielding and fine general play saw him get another goal and in the end Boden ran out comfortable winners.

Watching on for the second round of matches Boden saw Ballygunner run up a big score against Oulart and knew that the deciding game in the group was going to be a much tougher affair than our opener.

A tight match throughout, Ballygunner were ahead by a point at half time. Boden fought back and spirited performances throughout the field saw them turn the tables by the final whistle, winning by the narrowest of margins - enough to see them through to the A-Final against Erin's Own from Kilkenny.

So the full line up would be:

Toomevarra v Oulart-the-Ballagh in the Plate Final Mallow v Ballygunner in the Shield Final Ballyboden v Erin's Own in the Cup Final.

A great match in the Plate Final ended in a draw with Oulart eventually coming out on top after extra-time on a scoreline of 5-8 to 1-14.

In the Shield a strong first half performance from Ballygunner saw them race ahead to a big half-time lead. Mallow gave it their all in the second half but had left themselves too much to do. Ballygunner ran out 3-13 to 2-07 winners in the end.

Finally, the stage was set for the clash of the two top teams - Boden against Erin's Own. As so often in the past Boden didn't make it easy on ourselves conceding an early goal right from the start. But with a mountain to climb, the boys started climbing. Playing against the breeze they battled hard and went in at half-time with a manageable four point deficit.

A long ball into the Erin's Own square had the defence under pressure and in the battle for position between forwards and backs the ball appeared to fly straight to the net. The gap was down to the minimum and Boden were flying.

After that there were chances but Erin's Own tacked on a couple of points and with time running out, Boden were forced to chase the game....a couple of handy point chances were spurned in the hunt for goals and in the end the clock ran out with Erin's Own winning 1-10 to 1-06.

It had been a great game in front of a great crowd at Pairc Ui Mhurchu and all agreed that it

had been an impressive performance and unlucky result against a strong Kilkenny outfit.

In the clubhouse afterwards, Juvenile Chairman, Jerry Corcoran, thanked all the clubs for their participation and presented the trophies alongside Cian's uncle Shane, the Boden and Dublin senior hurler. Paul O'Brien, Cian's Dad, made an emotional and powerful speech remembering Cian and explaining how important the Tournament has been in celebrating his life. He also announced that next year, 2016 the tenth anniversary of Cian's death, will be the last staging of the Tournament.

All that remains is to thank all involved in staging this year's successful event, first and foremost the club, Cian's family and the whole Durkin clan, the under-15 mentors and parents, ably overseen by Ultan MacMathuna, who did a great organisational job and laid on great hospitality for the hundreds of players, mentors, parents and supporters from all six clubs.

Finally thanks, as ever, to U15 team managers, Niall Desmond and Martin Kenny for their great work.
