Hiney explodes into action and earns Junior B Hurlers qualification for Q/F (The Long Fella Reports)

Boden goalkeeper, Dave Kelly was next to step up, or to put it correctly, step aside and block a near certain goal, with his nether end.

A Cian Hiney goals fiesta was started when the Parnells custodian was caught in possession away from his chamber and the score was off a solo and a tap-in! This was just the appetiser to an evening of great scores, Hiney the scorer of nine in total, the bulk of them, goals. Throw in the marksmanship of Aiden Horgan, Declan Keating, Cummins, Mark Judge, Alan McGrath, Conor Maher (more accustomed to stopping goals), Ronan Dooley, Tom Sweeney and Minor player Luke Corcoran and the result was predictable.

Boden had defensive qualities too, and Shane Guest never put a foot wrong at the heart of the backline. Dooley covered the breaking ball very well and laid on a number of fine opportunities for a “hungry” attack. His 90 yard point was a cracker.

Parnells had some early opportunities and Ciaran Farrell pointed well from frees and play. Another to shine was John Sheeran, the scorer of a superb point early on. He gave the sizeable home support a moment of levity, looking towards the line and asking “do you want to buy me?”

Squad coach Mick Keville was well pleased with the showing, however conscious of that more competitive games lie ahead. Team managers David and Gerry Doyle will hope to bring the team to a higher level over the next few months.

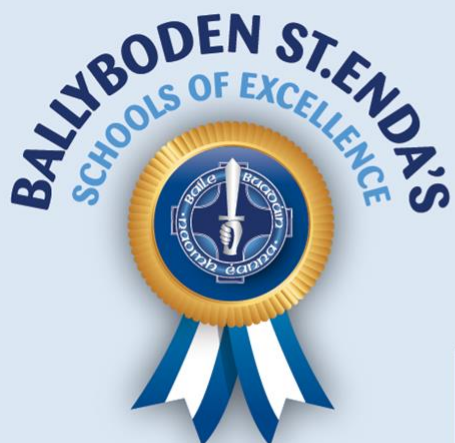
