[&]quot; It is with great regret and sadness that we inform you that Ballyboden St Enda's member Eoghan Culligan was one of the six people who tragically lost their lives in Berkeley, California earlier today (12th June 2015).

Eoghan has been a member of Ballyboden St Enda's since childhood and was part of the Minor A Championship team that were beaten by Castleknock GAA in the county final of 2011. He continued to play football with both the Intermediate and Junior teams. Eoghan was very popular with his team mates and this tragic news is keenly felt by all members of our Club, but especially by those players and mentors who knew him well.

We would like to extend our deepest sympathy to his parents Gerry & Marie and to his brothers Stephen & Andrew and to all the extended Culligan family.

May we take this opportunity of extending our sympathies to all the families of Eoghan's friends who also lost their lives in this terrible tragedy and to wish those who are injured eventual recovery to full health.

Senior A team victors over Judes

The Senior A Hurlers made the short journey across to Tymon Park on Saturday afternoon to play St. Judes in the league. They received a warm welcome from our close neighbours. The game was certainly keenly contested and unfortunately tempers boiled over at times and to the dismay of the Boden supporters, resulted in two Boden players receiving red cards.

Boden started the game with at a cracking pace with the two Davids, O'Callaghan & Curtin putting over a point each in under two minutes. One minute later Conal Keaney rattled the Judes net with a rasper of a shot. Things were looking good for Boden despite playing uphill. However, Danny Sutcliffe was making his presence felt and Judes put two points on the board. The Boden supporters could be forgiven for thinking that we were on our way to victory, when Paul Ryan pointed from a free and a minute later Collie O'Neill stuck the ball in the Judes net for goal number two and we were still only 12 minutes into the game. Over the next ten minutes both teams registered 3 points each, the Boden scores coming from Paul Ryan (free), Collie O'Neill and Eoghan O'Neill. Then with the score at 2 06 to 0 06 in favour of Boden, the game suddenly changed as Judes got completely on top and rattled off four unanswered points to leave them just two down. Judes, now in control of the game, pressed home their advantage. It was their turn to shake the Boden net and take the lead as halftime approached. Two more points for Judes left the score at 2 06 to 1 12 at the break.

The point scoring in the second half was even with both teams registering seven a piece. However they say that goals win matches and that man David Dotsy O'Callaghan certainly proved that to be the case as he found the St. Judes net three times in the second half despite very very close attention from the opposition. In a game that initially looked like a cake walk for Boden, then began to look like a disaster, we finally finished with an amazing win on a score of 5 13 to 1 19.

The real positive from the game was that when our backs were well and truly to the wall, the team showed tremendous spirit when it would have been very easy to drop the heads. Another positive was the good performances of young Rob Leddy, new boy Michael Clifford and Eoghan O'Neill who has recently returned from injury.

Senior B Championship

Ballyboden Senior B hurlers travelled to Broomfield on Saturday 13th June for their third Championship match of 2015 against St Sylvesters. On a bright evening and a very good playing surface, the home team were off to the brighter start registering 1-1 before Boden got into their stride. Indeed, it was strong running from midfield by Ronan Cleary that yielded the opening point. Despite a reasonable supply of ball to the forwards, the Sylvesters' defence repelled most attacks and they led at the quarter hour by five points. Keith McCarron was winning good ball in the middle of the field and another run by Cleary saw him finish with a fine shot to the net. Just before the break, a high ball was sent into the Sylvesters' full forward and following a good catch the ball was fired low to the net. This was a setback for the Boden challenge and left the half-time score of Boden 1-5 to Sylvesters 2-7. Boden started the second half well with good work by Austen Lynch and Finn McGarry in the forwards, both of whom scored. Indeed, this was Boden's best spell in the match and after James Roche picked off his first point of the day McGarry found Conor Dooley in space and he had time to pick his spot in the net. This brought the teams level on 2-9 apiece after 12 minutes. Dónal Butler and Darragh O'Gorman were putting a stop to most of the home attacks at this point. However, the home team rallied and together with some long stoppages for injury, Sylvesters regained the momentum from Boden. Four unanswered points created a gap and with Boden taking on some long range efforts that drifted away from the target, Sylvesters held on to claim victory. Last Friday 12th June, some of our Boden hurlers and footballers presented their county in the Annual Friendship Cumann na mBunscoil Games.



A big congratulations to the Ballyroan Boys' N.S. on their recent Hurling Win in Croke Park. Many of the team are Boden players.



Boden First Aid Training Courses

Dear Members,

Over 3 consecutive weeks Frank O'Connor has provided training to over 40 members of our Club on how to deal with Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SDA) . Frank provided this series of courses in a very professional manner, with a great emphasis on practical exercises, which the members attending found very useful and informative. On behalf of all members who attended the training courses (including myself) I would like to thank Frank for the expertise he provided and for the enthusiastic manner in which he delivered the course content.

"Around 13 people die every day in Ireland as a result of sudden cardiac arrest, however some of these lives could be saved if more people knew CPR, and had access to an AED.

SCA (Sudden Cardiac Arrest) can affect people of all ages, including babies and children. Cardiac arrest refers to the sudden loss of function of the heart. It occurs when there is an abrupt disturbance in the heart's rhythm, causing the heart to stop beating. A person whose heart has stopped beating will fall unconscious and stop breathing normally. If they do not get immediate medical assistance, sudden cardiac death will follow. Some 5,000 people die as a result of this every year in Ireland. CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) is a first aid technique which should be administered as soon as possible to a person who has suffered a cardiac arrest. It can increase a person's chance of survival by keeping oxygen and blood circulating to the body's vital organs.

Death due to sudden cardiac arrest that is witnessed is preventable in many cases. Now that we have 3 x AED's (Defibrillators) within Ballyboden Club-playing pitches, one each located in: Club House, Ballycullen and Santa Maria and can be accessed by all recently trained personnel. They can immediately treat a player or spectator who experiences a sudden, lifethreatening SCA. This prompt action will result in a higher survival rate and giving the best possible outcome for the casualty."
