Boden did lose a couple of key players due to injury and this appeared to affect the flow of their game.

Second half saw St. Maur's start strongly and lady luck favoured Boden when they failed to

convert a spot kick hitting the bottom of the upright. However, they did manage to grab a valuable goal with about 12 mins remaining which appeared to give them the confidence that they could win the match. Boden at the other end were guilty of missing very scoreable opportunities. It took a great point by the ever present Bob Dwane and a further score by Collie Basquel for Boden to create some daylight between the teams.
