U16A Ballyboden St Endas v Good Counsel

After a long summer the U16 Ballyboden Camogie players came back looking forward to the Championship season. It was going to be a tough start playing Good Counsel, a team which have had the upper hand over Boden at this age group for the last few years. However, the Boden girls were up for it having beaten Brigids the previous week with a stellar performance.

The match could not have had a better start with Boden taking the upper hand in the first 3 minutes with a goal and two points lead. Fantastic work right across the field. Good Counsel got back into the game taking some fine points from outfield, but the Boden girls battled on. The action was immense right across the field with no quarter given, the scoring at either end keeping the game broadly level. At half time there was two points separating the teams – with Counsel ahead. However, our girls felt that this could be the game where they came out on top. However, it was a bit like Galway against Kilkenny, despite the girls putting their bodies on the line, Good Counsel put two quick points on the board with a goal to follow. For the first 10 minutes of the second half the ball just didn't break for our girls. However, we then had a purple patch with a superb goal by Eimear which brought it back to a four point game. The Counsel keeper was outstanding, matching our own Ally in goal in how she kept the ball out of the net. The Counsel goalie stopped a certain goal by throwing her body in front of the ball with their backs then making a great clearance. It felt like the final turning point in the game as a goal then would have left a point in it. At this point the Boden girls could not give any more and Good Counsel added a couple of late scores to emerge victors.

U14A Raheny 0-1 v Ballyboden St Endas U14A 3-8

Saturday saw our U14A camogie team travel northside to face Raheny in the first round of the championship. It was a match we would have been expected to win, but we knew from previous meetings with them that we never get anything easy in St. Anne's Park, and with Cuala and Plunketts also in our group, we knew that a win was a must.

The match began at a good pace with us doing the bulk of the attacking, but a combination of poor shot selection, bad luck, and solid defence and goalkeeping by Raheny meant that the scoreboard was still blank after 15 minutes. Then a fine long range point from Olivia settled the nerves, and was followed up by a few more. At the other end of the field, Raheny were limited to 1 point, but they showed themselves to be quite dangerous on the counter attack, and were very unlucky when one effort for goal went just outside the upright.

At half-time, the score was 0-6 to 0-1 - a healthy enough lead, but nowhere near safe.

In Aussie rules, the third quarter is traditionally referred to as "the championship quarter", and so it proved here, as the girls took the game to Raheny, and rattled the net three times in that period. We also tagged on a couple of points before the end to run out fairly comfortable winners on a scoreline of 3-8 to 0-1.

It was a very good performance, with all 20 players giving their all. While the backline will have busier days, they displayed an exemplary level of concentration throughout. Midfield worked tirelessly and shaded the exchanges for most of the match, while the forward division never stopped trying against a resolute Raheny back line, and improved significantly as the match progressed. Our player of the match was Saoirse Hassett, who gave an exhibition, although she was closely followed by a number of other girls.

Overall then, a very satisfactory day's work, but we know that stiffer challenges lie ahead, and much improvement will be needed before our next championship match in 2 week's time. However, this team has character in abundance and will doubtless be up for the challenge.

Possession was hard earned at midfield and lots of chances were created in the first half that we failed to convert, but Rebecca McDonald did manage to put one in the net to give us a narrow half time lead.

Our defence led by Sarah Reynolds in goal was excellent with late substitute, Ciara Dowling making some key clearances.
