Boden completed the Under 16 2015 Football and Hurling Championship Double and completed the Hurling Double adding the Championship to the League Title annexed recently after a win over Na Fianna.

Last Saturday afternoon in O' Toole Park, Cuala started the Hurling Championship Final on the front foot and in the early exchanges had Boden under pressure. A couple of early points had them off to a flyer and Boden were struggling to get into the pace of the game. The breeze, though marginal, was holding up some high balls and coupled with a low sun the Boden defence was under pressure and were grateful to some last ditch defending and tidying-up work from Cathal Creed and Man of the Match, Thomas Glynn. A Shane Kennedy free had Boden on the board but Cuala continued to press. Some wayward shooting from Cuala, particularly from placed balls, was keeping Boden in it. The game changed halfway through the first half when following a great run, a strike from wide on the right hit the upright and James Madden snapped up the rebound to goal. Boden upped their game from there. Madden repositioned to the 40 plucking a puckout from the skies and drove the score of the game over the bar from 60 metres. Conor O'Donoghue, the Boden keeper and Captain landed a monster free and further points from Kennedy and Nugent had Boden out to a six point lead at the break a lead that hardly reflected the pattern of the game and the huge effort that Cuala had put in.

Boden opened the second half brightly and the introduction of Kevin Desmond gave a renewed focus to the attack. Desmond pointed and despite Cuala responding, a Ben Kelly goal driven to the roof of the nets put Boden ahead by 9 points. Cuala continued to press but the Boden defence held firm with Creed, O'Neill and Normile doing sterling work closing down any space in front of goal. Conor Fallon, Jamie Dooney, Mark McNamee all joined the

fray together with Karl Reddy, who was recovered from a shoulder dislocation. Shane Kennedy added a third goal putting the result beyond doubt with five minutes to go.

With the final play of the game, James Madden drove a fourth goal to the nets from 25 metres to secure a memorable victory. The scoreline flattered a little and in no way reflected Cuala's effort over the hour but as the maxim goes goals win games and Bodens ability to finish their chances was the difference.

The win completed a memorable juvenile career for this talented bunch of 1999 boys hurlers.

Many thanks to the large numbers of families, friends and supporters who travelled to O' Toole Park on Saturday afternoon to cheer on our boys and watch them raise the cup.

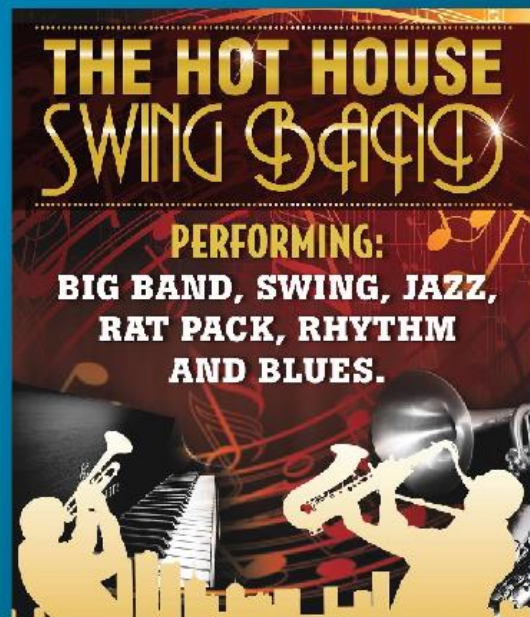
