Football News - Seniors through to Leinster semi-final



The weather at the weekend served up a potent cocktail of strong winds and heavy rain but that didn't deter the hardy Boden supporters from turning out in numbers to support our U21's, Minors and Seniors. The U21'S were first up on Saturday with a tough visit to a Crokes side who had the benefit of weeks of preparation over a Boden side shorn of the Senior and Minor players due to their own important matches. The loss of these players proved too much to bear for the squad and despite an heroic defensive effort the lads fell to a very good Crokes team by 1-10 to 0-02.

The Minors took centre stage on Sunday morning in atrocious conditions in O'Toole park against a strong Ballymun side. Despite being behind by 2-04 to 0-02 at half time the lads produced a fightback full of pride and passion that brought them back within 2 points but a classy Ballymun had an extra gear when needed to claim the Championship by 5-04 to 2-09. The disappointment of the Minors defeat wasn't dwelled upon however as the busses were loaded up with supporters for the Seniors' trip to Drogheda for their Leinster QF against St.Pats of Louth. The van selling a hot cuppa on the way in was the most welcome sight after the O'Toole park deluge I can tell ya! While outnumbered the Boden support was as vocal as ever as the lads ground out a hard fought victory in difficult conditions by 1-08 to 0-07. They now go on to face St.Lomans of Mullingar away on the 22nd November. Thanks to all who support our teams over the weekend and thanks to our reporters who provided the below.

Boden made to work in Drogheda

Ballyboden St Enda's progressed to the semi final of the Leinster Senior Football Championship after a hard fought four point win over Louth champions St Patrick's in Drogheda on Sunday.

Conditions were far from ideal on a wet and blustery day in the Wee County, contributing to

an error strewn and low scoring game.

Colm Basquel's 35th minute proved decisive as Boden were pushed all the way by the massive underdogs.

From early on it was clear that the Louth side were intent on frustrating Boden, setting up with 13 men inside their own half for large parts of the opening half. Playing against a strong wind in the opening half, Boden struggled to carve out scoring opportunities early on against their defensive minded opponents.

When they did create chances, Boden's accuracy was found wanting as Conal Keaney and Declan O'Mahoney shot wide early on.

St Pat's centre forward Karl White put the Louth side ahead when he took advantage of some slack Boden marking and curled over an easy score. He soon doubled their lead with an easy free after eight minutes.

Midfielder Paddy Keenan's wind assisted monster score from well outside the 45 gave the Louth champions a three point lead with nearly a quarter of an hour gone.

It had been a scrappy opening quarter, with handling errors all over the pitch and with space at a premium.

Similar to St Vincent's in last week's Dublin decider, Boden had worryingly failed to score in the first 15 minutes of the game, but finally did so in the 16th minute when Keaney turned his man and curled over a left footed effort.

Keaney's score signalled a period of dominance for Boden, during which they drew level with two Andrew Kerin scores, one from play and one from a free.

It was during this spell that Boden created the only goal chance of the half. Basquel, Aran Waters and Sean Gibbons combined well to send Michael Darragh Macauley through on goal, but Pats' goalkeeper Sean Connor smothered his effort well.

The Louth side had the last say of the half in injury time, when corner forward Daniel O'Connor curled over nicely from an acute angle to send them in leading at the break, albeit by the narrowest of margins.

But a one point deficit after playing against such a strong breeze was by no means a disaster for Boden and there was plenty of optimism among the Boden faithful that they would kick on when playing with the breeze in the second half.

And that is exactly what they did in the early minutes of the half. Kerin first brought them level with a free, and from the resultant kickout Boden got the game's only three-pointer. Connor's short kickout was telegraphed and the razor sharp Darren O'Reilly beat Pat's corner back Kevin Toner to the ball. O'Reilly fed Basquel, who fended off a challenge before finishing brilliantly to the top corner from the edge of the large square.

Their goal was nearly cancelled out instantly, when Boden 'keeper Conor Dooley, deputising for Paul Durcan, allowed an underhit free to squirm between his legs. Somehow the ball held up in the muddy goalmouth and failed to cross the line and Boden averted the danger.

Boden failed to build on the momentum the goal had given them and the game descended into a 15 minute lull, during which there was only one score, a Paddy Keenan free that cut the deficit to two points.

It was a stop start period where whistle happy referee Patrick Maguire penalised minor infractions on both sides and killed the games flow.

Boden seemed to be tiring as the game went on and it seemed as though their tough schedule was catching up on them. This was their fourth consecutive weekend of championship action and all of those games had been physically demanding.

Kerin gave Boden a bit of breathing space with eight minutes remaining when he pointed a simple free to stretch the lead to a goal.

Paddy Keenan and Kerin then swapped frees as the game neared a conclusion, with Boden keeping the hosts at arm's length.

Keenan thought he'd equalised in the last minute when he rifled into the net after a quickly taken free. But the referee was not ready for it to be taken and the goal was disallowed, much to the frustration of the home fans. In the end Keenan had to settle for a point, making it a two point game as the game entered injury time.

Conal Keaney settled Boden nerves when he curled over a great score from just inside the 45, and Keaney sealed a Boden victory when he collected Connor's kickout and thumped over a huge 50 yard score.

It was a workmanlike performance from Boden, who did just enough in extremely testing conditions. However, it looks like Andy McEntee will have to sweat over the fitness of midfielder Declan O'Mahoney who limped off at half time. Injuries are beginning to mount for Boden, who lost Ryan Basquel to a broken jaw last week.

For now though, Boden have the chance to recuperate before their semi final showdown with St Loman's of Mullingar in two weeks time.

MINOR A CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL 2015 Ballymun 5-04 Ballyboden St Endas 2-09

Ballyboden went in to last Sunday Minor A Championship decider as rank underdogs and given the pedigree of the opposition that was no small surprise. Boden however had other ideas and despite loosing the game, had a massive say in the outcome right up to the final whistle. Played in terrible conditions Boden decided that they were going to make a real contest of this and were not going to lie down. Playing against a gale in the first half Bodens tally of two points against the northsiders 2-04 seemed paltry, but that was not the case... and did not tell the full story. Boden fought like tigers and proved that its "not the size of the dog in the fight that counts, but how much fight is in the dog" Well Boden had plenty of fight. This game was decided by the weather. Kane in the Boden goals had to deal with a series of very difficult balls, two of which evaded him and ended up in the Boden net. But back came Boden and resumed the onslaught.

The second period opened up with Boden bringing in Ross McGrath to the edge of the square. His opening possession was good but what followed was spectacular. Rising majestically in to the air he grabbed the ball and in one swift movement he released the ball to the mercurial Ross McGarry who directed his low shot neatly inside the post. Game on. Boden now had Ballymun on the rack. But Ballymun were not taking it lying down. They surged upfield and goaled after a Boden defender lost his footing at a crucial moment. Still Boden came back and reduced the defect to a manageable two points with eight on the clock. But what a great side Ballymun are and once again they broke the siege to lift one over Kane and put themselves back in the driving seat. Bodens answer was just as devastating.

Ballymun tried to keep the ball and deny Boden possession, but the tireless Ryan got a hand on the ball and Boden were off and running again. Panic spread the northsiders defence as McGrath once again eluded the defence and set up McGarry the younger for his second goal. Ballymun couldn't believe it. From the kick out McGarry once again took possession and rifle through the defence looking for the net, but his shot sailed over. But time waits for no man and the referee finally blew the long whistle to send the very relieved Ballymun team in to raptures of delight. This was tough on Boden who had fought to the death and never gave up or never took a step backwards. Kane in goals was unfortunate to concede the goals, but his kickouts and distribution was and has become legendry. His kickouts sailed frequently over midfielders and half forwards to the corner forwards. In front of him Holland was peerless, rock steady and excellent going forward. In the right corner Ryan was simply masterful. He had his best game by some distance on Sunday while marking his man out of the game. In the left corner, Mellet was a rock. His stature as a footballer has rocketed this year, Murray exuded class in everything he did and added greatly to the team going forward. Keller played strongly throughout and was instrumental in many of Bodens moves going forward in the first half. Cronin was again the heart and soul of this team, always probing, always available to take the game to Ballymun. His interception in the first half was inspirational and typified the teams commitment.

But the Duracell Bunny himself O Dea has made this championship his own this year. As Bodens sweeper he is truly a wonder. His speed in his head and on the ground has ensured that Bodens attacks are always launched from the right platform and yet again he produced another fantastic performance. Hester was again the best midfielder on view. Yet another man of the match performance from the captain. Along side him Flaherty was influential. Always moving back and forth between the 21s he dug deep and stemmed the tide in the first half. In the forwards Leddy never shirked his roll and was instrumental in a lot of Bodens best work. Byrne on the other side was excellent and contributed a great score in to the gale in the first half. At centre forward McGarry produced another fantastic game and although just back from a thigh injury, gave everything he had for the cause, kicking some fantastic scores. But Bodens full forward line really clicked last Sunday, The diminutive Dunne was simply inspirational and his work rate and finishing marked him out as one of the most difficult opponents any defender will face. His point from the left measureing the gale to perfection was a delight to watch. Ross McGarry was again the banker when Boden needed scores. In this form he is unmarkable. Always willing to show for the ball and having great speed and agility, he is simply superb at finishing his scoring opportunities. Big Ross McGrath entered the fray last Sunday and his impact was both immediate and sustained for the half. His leap, fetch and pass will go down as one of the best this writer has seen. Simply brilliant to watch. Dylan Walsh added to Bodens power and direct play when he came on and will be a super player in next years championship. Oisin Carolan as in previous games came in and contributed greatly to the cause.

Overall Boden can be very pleased with their season. Short many regulars due to exams, holidays and hurling commitments etc, it had been difficult to get a full team on the park for a lot of the season. But when the championship starts Boden produce top class teams that can compete with the best. This one was exceptional in its own way.

U14 Division 1 Championship Final

Ballyboden St Endas 9-2 Lucan 1-1

All roads led to O'Toole Park last Saturday for the replay of the U-14 A Championship Final. Three weeks previously, Lucan and Ballyboden served up a cliff-hanger with Boden earning a deserved replay with a superlative point at the death, and the big crowd at the Crumlin venue were sure that this replay would also go to the wire. Indeed there is seldom more than a puck of a ball between these two excellent sides. That's not exactly how events transpired on the day, as Boden took control from the outset and never let up till the final whistle. In contrast to the drawn match, conditions in O'Toole Park were wretched—grey skies, lashing rain, and a stiff breeze blowing into the road goal. The sod was consequently heavy, but in the circumstances the pitch was in excellent conditions.

Boden won the toss and wisely took advantage of the elements in the first half. Boden supporters significantly outnumbered the Lucan contingent, and they were given plenty of reasons to cheer as our girls hunted in packs and attacked in waves, putting Lucan defence under sustained pressure. We opened our account with a pointed free from Katie McDonnell, but the Lucan goal led something of a charmed life for a while. However the signs for Lucan were ominous as the Boden attacks continued apace. Finally the hoped for breakthrough seemed to arrive on 10 minutes after a goalmouth scramble, as umpire Tony Hassett decisively waved the green flag. However, all of Tony's persuasive shills and charm did not sway the referee, as she proceeded to disallow the goal after a lengthy discussion with the umpires.

This setback only seemed to spur Boden on, and two goals in quick succession from Hollyn Kennedy and Ciara Woodcock were no more than their efforts deserved. Lucan were finding it extremely difficult to get beyond the middle of the field, but any time they did, they found the Boden rearguard absolutely impenetrable.

Then a point from Erica Tobin and a goal from Alanna McGarry extended the Boden lead. Just before the half-time whistle, a dropping ball into the Lucan square was finished to the net by the captain Muireann Delaney.

The score at the break of Boden 4-2 Lucan 0-0 might suggest that Boden were in firm control, but we were all wary of the expected Lucan onslaught at the start of the second half. Indeed three weeks earlier, Lucan did hit such a purple patch on the resumption that threatened to bury our girls, but we were having none of this time.

On the resumption, our girls took up where they left off. As expected our back line came under more pressure but Lucan found us a tough nut to crack. Then we made the vital breakthrough as Hollyn got in for her second goal, and at this stage Lucan must have feared the worst. To their credit they responded with a goal and a point, but Boden then decided that enough was enough and provided no more opportunities to Lucan. Instead, we controlled the remainder of the game and incredibly added another four goals – from Erica, Blathnaid Slater, Aisling Byrne and Kate McDonald.

That final score Ballyboden St. Endas 9-2 Lucan Sarsfields 1-1. A result that nobody could have seen coming, and it means that the Championship trophy will rest for the year with the Feile trophy in Pairc Ui Murchu.

This was an absolute panel effort, with all 21 girls contributing on the day and in the previous rounds. Lucan will doubtless be back, but as could be seen as the girls celebrated on the final whistle, this day belonged to Boden.

The closing minutes of the contest had some more of the good stuff, a fine goal from Aaron Coffey after he rounded his man in the corner and flashed a shot past the goalman, but also what we were hoping to avoid, an unfortunate injury to O'Neill. Let's hope he makes a speedy recovery and returns for the competition final in the next few weeks.




