Comóradh an Chéid 1916-2016 - Launch draws full house



Bhí Áras an Club lán go doras chun Clár Comóradh 1916-2016 a lainseáil. The honour of launching the programme fell to Club Chair Brendan Moran who remarked that he "counted 24 separate activities" on the published programme with more to be added. He commended the Committee under Chair John Kirwan for the manner in which the programme had been compiled and encouraged members to give it their full support.


The origin of the commemoration was traced by Seán Ó Conchúir who recalled explaining the concept, along with Tomás Ó Reachtabhra, to the Chairman late last year. Brendan Moran gave his blessing and then as Seán recalled "rith sé an doras amach"!!.

A detailed explanation of the rationale behind the club's connections with the period and the influence the events had on four GAA clubs - Ballyboden Wanderers, Rathfarnham St Endas, Brothers Pearse and Ballyboden St. Endas was traced by John Kirwan. Linkages with St. Endas Park, An Claidheamh Soluis, and the historic connections with key figures like Pádraig Pearse and Eoin MacNeill were referenced.

Gerry O'Sullivan commented that the Brochure detailing the events which cover Léachtanna, Ceol, Drámaíocht, Ócádí Searmanais, Siúlóidí, Cluichí agus an Teanga was designed by a Brazilian girl Mariana Reis de Almeida - a connection entirely appropriate given the part Roger Casement played in addressing issues of slavery and human rights abuses among the native populations of that country.

Over the coming weeks - beidh go leor imeachtaí ar siúl and members will not only have the opportunity to commemorate the events of 1916 but also have an enjoyable and informative learning experience.

First event of Commemoration Programme - 1916

Dé Céadaoin, 17ú Feabhra, maidin úr álainn chuireamar tús le Comóradh Éirí Amach na Cásca. D'fhág an bus an club ag timpeall a naoi a chlog ar maidin agus thug an tiománaí aghaidh ar Dhúnlaoghaire áit a dtáinig na Sherwood Foresters i dtír ar an gCéadaoin 26/04/1916.

Some soldiers thought they were in France. We followed their marching route to Dublin guided by Seán O Gorman who ably informed and amused us with his rich descriptions of events. We stopped for refreshments at the Punch Bowl(Seamus won't forget that) and visited Dev's former home. We stopped at the commemorative monument to the 3rd Brigade, in Ballsbridge. We listened in awe as the events at Mount St. Bridge were vividly described. D'fhág Fintan Walsh bláthfhleasc ansin. The following was written on a card: "I gcuimhne ar na hÓglaigh chróga a fuair bás ar son Saoirse na hÉireann agus orthu siúd a fuair bás gar don droichead seo i lár Seachtain na Cásca 1916, ó mhuintir Bhaile Buadáin Naomh Éanna." We passed the site where Boland's Mill once stood and where De Valera was Commandant. From there we proceeded to the Hermitage and were brought by tour guide Alan on an excellent tour of Scoil Éanna which Pádraig Mac Piarais founded. Eventually we returned to the club at 4.30pm. Bhíomar tuirseach, traochta i ndiaidh an lae ach "bfhiú go mór an tairbhe an trioblóid". Buíochas do Kay Murry agus Fintan ó na Seanóirí agus do Sheán ón gclub , is do Sheán Ó Gorman ár dtreoraí.

A performance of grit and determination gave Boden the best possible start to their league campaign. The conditions were poor with a very strong breeze. The ground underfoot was soft and energy sapping. We played the first half with the wind and started well with Ruairi Hestor opening the scoring with a well taken point. A Dylan Walsh point followed by a Mikey Dunne free and a long range point by Hugh Keller put Boden into a well-deserved, four point lead before the visitors opened their account followed quickly by a second. The defence played a huge part at this stage with resolute defending and a wonderful close range save by Jack Kelly prevented numerous goal scoring attempts out. Boden then finished the half stronger with a well taken goal from Keith Sweeney and a fine point by Eoghan Monahan as he latched onto the breaking ball from his own knockdown. The second half was where all the courage and commitment showed. Playing into that strong wind was going to be tough and this was proven so. Nh. Olaf applied the pressure with the wind at their backs and kicked seven point to Boden's two to bring themselves to within two. However Boden were not to be out done. A goal by Mikey Dunne completed a sublime move down the right with great support play by Keith Sweeney and Hugh Keller through Ross McCormack onto Dunne who fired in from a tight angle. However that never say die attitude of Reddy, Bobbett and fine defending by Kennedy kept out the goal threats keeping Olaf's opportunities to two points. Minor C Football V Ballinteer St John

Result Boden 3-9, Ballinteer St Johns 1-9

The Minor C team started 2016 with a panel of 23 players taken from last year's U/16B team and last year's Minor C and D teams. So while there are new faces to get to know, the journey to gelling as a team is well and truly underway.

The lads approached their opening league match with confidence having put in excellent preseason preparations thanks to the "dream" team of trainers Aaron O'Reilly and Joey Marrinan. Aaron and Joey have challenged the lads to raise their game in all aspects (participation at training, attitude, commitment and workrate) and the response has been remarkable. Attendance at training sessions has been excellent and three challenge matches against good opposition over the last two weeks gave the team a good sense of the pace and fitness required.

Deciding to play into the teeth of a roaring gale, Boden started well with midfield pairing of Marcus O'Byrne and Calum Gray working extremely hard to move the ball into our forward line. With wind behind Ballinteer launched long balls into the Boden defence who defended like tigers. When the high ball did bounce in behind defenders our man of the match keeper Jonathon O'Donoghue was on hand to mop up or pull off one of his trademark stretching saves.

Despite a horrendously strong wind the short game practiced in training worked really well for Boden and the patience was rewarded with an excellent move starting in defence and worked up the pitch to the hands of Jamie Kavanagh. Jamie sold a beautiful dummy sidestepped the next defender and finished off a great move with a cracking goal

Ballinteer in fairness regrouped and slotted over a couple of good long range points. With a few minutes remaining in the first half Boden started another move deep in our own defence which was worked out to the left half forward Conor Mealy. Conor beat his man and then saw our No.5 Dara Kelly on the right wing storming up the pitch like a train. The inch perfect pass meant Dara didn't have to break stride and duly dispatched a bullet to the top of the net. Jack McCaffrey eat your heart out!

Points either side of the goals from Dara Kelly (that man again!) and Sean Byrne meant we went into halftime leading Boden 2-2 Ballinteer 0-6

The second half started well with Boden using the wind advantage to play good long ball into the full forward line. Calum Gray pointed excellently to extend the lead. "Top of the forty" man Cillian O'Connor and his sweet left foot pointed some excellent scores from frees and play. We were keeping Ballinteer at distance but in fairness to them they worked good possession to score two unanswered points. It was now obvious that the wind was not going to be the ultimate decider in the second half. Further pressure from Ballinteer drove possession into the square and a "rogue" foot tripped the oncoming Ballinteer forward to leave the ref with no option but to aware the penalty.

Despite Jonathon's presence in goal even Paul Durcan could not stop the drive to top left corner – game on and Ballinteer back to two points.

Boden drove on and a crucial point from Conor Mealy brought it back to 3 points. But that was still only one score in front and Ballinteer pushed back up in numbers to find that crucial goal. Last ditch, bodies on the line defending told those watching this Boden team was NOT going to be beaten. Wing forward Jamie Kavanagh (who covered more distance than any player on show from either team), turned up on his own goal line to stop a certain goal!

Never panicking Boden worked the dis-possessed ball back out and a long ball caught the full back off guard as Boden full forward Cathal McCarron peeled away from his marker to leave only himself and the goalkeeper in the game. Cathal dispatched the goal with consummate ease – game over!

A great win for the lads with strong performances in ALL positions and great start to the league campaign but played in the spirit of a championship knockout!




Ballyboden Juvenile Boys Physiotherapy Information
