Congrats to Bodens Conor Deane

To pinpoint a date that set in train the events of Easter Week 1916 is extremely difficult. Suffice to say for the purposes of this short note that almost from the moment the Irish Parliament voted itself out of existence in 1800, constitutional and revolutionary movements took root trying to reverse this decision.

The Act of Union which came into effect in January 1801 saw the closure of the Irish Parliament in College Green in what is now a premises of the Bank of Ireland and brought Ireland into the United Kingdom. The decision of the Irish Houses of Commons and Lords to vote themselves out of existence must rank as some sort of world first. But it wasn't of course without some considerable persuasion and corrupt practices instigated by the London Government of William Pitt who had been greatly disturbed by the rebellion of the United Irishmen in 1798 and the continental threat from Napoleonic France. For the next century and more, the repeal of the Act of Union by constitutional or other means became a common discourse in political and revolutionary circles - Robert Emmet, Daniel O'Connell, Charles Stewart Parnell (a patron of the GAA), the Young Ireland movement of Thomas Davis, the Fenians, and on into the 20th century the Irish Parliamentary Party (IPP) under John Redmond continued the agitation.

Bit by bit, the IPP exploited its strategic position vis-à-vis the Liberal Party Government in England. Two Home Rule Bills were tabled by Prime Minister William Gladstone - a passionate Home Ruler. The first in 1886 failed in the House of Commons; the second in 1893 passed in the Commons but was overwhelmingly vetoed in the House of Lords but the third bill introduced by Prime Minister Henry Asquith was passed in 1912 (a year which saw Pádraig Pearse speak in favour of Home Rule from a platform in Sackville Street now O'Connell Street) with the proviso that the Lords could only delay its enactment until 1914.

The bill provided for:

A bicameral (two houses) Irish Parliament to be set up in Dublin (a 40-member Senate and a 164-member House of Commons) with powers to deal with most national affairs; A number of Irish MPs would continue to sit in the Parliament of the United Kingdom (42 MPs, rather than 103).

The abolition of the Dublin Castle administration, though with the retention of the Lord Lieutenant.

But the actions of an unknown 19 year old Bosnian Serb by the name of Gavrilo Princip would have unimaginable global and national significance. The assassination of the heir to the Austro-Hungarian throne Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria and his wife, Sophie in Sarajevo on 28 June 1914 was one of a complex series of causes that lit the flame to World War I which forced the British Government to shelve the implementation of **the Home Rule Act of 1912.**

Did you know? the estimated circulation of 10 national newspapers in Ireland in 1916 was 332,500. The largest was the Irish Independent on 100,000. The current estimated national circulation is about 600,000 in all of Ireland.

Hurling News - Senior Hurlers start with a win

Ballyboden Senior A hurlers got the season underway on Saturday 27th February and welcomed Tullaroan from the Marble County for round one of the Leinster League. Boden started brightly and a goal by David O'Connor from a very tight angle was the highlight of the first quarter that saw the home team lead 1-4 to 0-4. Good puckout ball was being won and this provided a good platform for the forwards. The ever-industrious Matty Weldon was to the fore in the middle of the field ably assisted by the man with the famous name, Liam McCarthy. Most balls that found their way past midfield were hoovered up by Malachy Travers who made sure the Tullaroan attack had to work hard for chances. Further points from Paul Doherty, Finn McGarry and the ever-reliable Paul Ryan kept daylight between the teams. Tullaroan were limited to scores mainly from the placed ball, including a fine strike by their full-forward after 25 minutes that found the Boden net. Half-time score : Boden 1-14 to Tullaroan 1-7.

The home team were in no mood to relax at the start of the second half and had signalled their intent with a fine goal by Paul Doherty after three minutes. Further points by Eoghan O'Neill, O'Connor and Ryan gave Boden a healthy advantage and one they would not relinquish. Tullaroan probably had their best spell at this point and launched quite a few attacks, with Kilkenny legend Tommy Walsh in command. The full backs Jamie Desmond and Rob Leddy were in no mood to concede however and along with the excellent Conor Robinson at wing back put a stop to most of the Tullaroan threats. The last quarter saw Boden add a series of fine points and victory was sealed in the closing minute by a trademark Paul Ryan topspin shot to the net from a close-in free. We had a lot of help on our journey, so thanks to:


