


Preparations are well under way for the big day out in Croke Park on St Patrick's Day. Could you please note the following important dates and times.

Comóradh an Chéid 1916-2016



The prospect of Home Rule (or Rome Rule as they saw it) and the return of a Parliament to Dublin greatly alarmed unionist opinion in the country. Ironically it was a Dubliner who was to personify their resistance. Born at No. 4 Harcourt Street, Edward Carson came from a well-to-do family of four boys and two girls and was educated at Portarlington School, Wesley College, Dublin and Trinity College, Dublin where it is said he played "hurley". However this was not akin to the game we excel at in BBSE – the game being much closer to hockey.

A barrister, Carson, had gained considerable fame for the successful manner in which he defended the Marquess of Queensberry in 1895 against whom the writer Oscar Wilde had brought a libel action. The case bankrupted Wilde but marked Carson as a powerful orator and excellent legal mind.

In 1910, he became leader of the Irish Unionist Party and aided by Captain James Craig, the son of a County Down whiskey millionaire, they began to mobilise unionist/protestant forces behind a campaign to thwart British Government plans to introduce Home Rule. While it was Edward Carson's wish that all of Ireland should remain within the United Kingdom, events and demographics made it clear that it was Unionist Ulster that was at issue.

As the prospect of Home Rule advanced with the passing of the 1912 Government of Ireland Bill, Unionist opposition stepped up considerably. In Easter 1912 (9 April), the Leader of the English Conservative Party Bonar Law addressed a rally of over 100,000 in Belfast committing his party to defying the rule of Parliament. Some weeks later, he added "I can imagine no length of resistance to which Ulster can go in which I should not be prepared to support them." The last previous occasion when a crowd of that size had gathered in Belfast was for the launch of the Titanic on 31 May 1911 – ominously the Titanic would sink a week after Bonar Law's address with the loss of 1,517 lives.

The defining moment came on 28 September 2012 when 237,368 men and 234,046 women separately signed the Ulster Covenant, many in their own blood, committing themselves to use "using all means which may be found necessary" to defeat Home Rule.

In January 1913, the Ulster Volunteer Force (UVF) was formed and by the end of the year

had enlisted 90,000 part-time members. Gun running began and included the importation of 25,000 weapons through Larne in April of the following year raising real fears of a civil war on the island before the outbreak of World War 1 in July 1914 eased that concern.

Uniquely for a political figure, Edward Carson would witness the erection of a massive statue in his honour on the avenue leading to Stormont Castle in Belfast. But when the time came in 1921 he turned down the offer of becoming the first prime minister of the northern state. He did offer though his fellow unionists the following piece of advice "From the outset let us see that the Catholic minority have nothing to fear from the Protestant majority.....While maintaining intact our own religion, let us give the same rights to the religion of our neighbours." Did his advice fall on deaf ears?

Did you know? 2,000 people from Dublin, who could prove they were born in Ulster, signed the Covenant – it's possible to see who they were on www.proni.gov.uk.

Fresh off the back of a season opening win two weeks ago, 22 eager panelists (out of a total 23) assembled on mother's day with high hopes of putting in another good performance. GP Moran's are effectively an A team with some top quality players. However unluckily for them the later throw in time meant they could only field 13 players. This created a headache though for the Boden management team with 9 subs eagerly on the bench waiting for the call!

From the throw in it was clear Boden again would not be found wanting and within a minute were ahead thanks to a super opening goal from Rory Hennessy. GP Moran while shocked bounced back quickly to record a goal of their own. Points for Boden from Jamie Kavanagh and Cillian O'Connor restored the lead. Further goals from Jamie Kavanagh, Rory Hennessy and Cillian O'Connor and a point from Conor Mealy put Boden into a 10 point lead with 5 minutes remaining in the first half. GP Moran's in fairness did not drop the head and drove through the defence to win a penalty. Wonder keeper Jonathon O'Donoghue did yet again what he is renowned for and stopped a bullet, but unfortunately Moran's were just that split second quicker to the rebound and scored a crucial goal. Another point from them on the stroke of half time brought what might have looked like an unassailable 10 point lead back to a nervy 6 points.

Half time team talk acknowledged the great work done in the first half and reminded the lads that "the clock was back to zero!".

The second half was a roller coaster with GP Moran scoring a goal and point to bring the gap back to just 2 points. Nerves frayed on the sideline, Boden steadied with a critical point from "leftie" Cillian O'Connor which brought it back to a goal. But Moran's pointed again to keep the pressure on. Then up popped Jamie Kavanagh to drive home a cracking goal, only to be followed shortly after by Man of the Match, Cillian O'Connor securing his hat trick and game over. Despite a late consolation goal from Moran's, the match was completely sealed by Peter (Potsie) O'Toole chipping the keeper for a cheeky goal!

In fairness to GP Moran's their 13 lads dug deep and played right to the final whistle. However the fresh Boden bench was able to make changes not available to Moran's. As well as great play from all our scorers there was excellent performances all around the pitch including:

- Jonathon O'Donoghue in goal with at least 4four certain goals saved
- James Hanrahan doing the simple things really well at corner back and clearing his lines confidently and effectively.
- Dara Kelly continuing those darting runs from half back and creating chances for the forward line,
- Marcus O'Byrne and Calum Gray leaving nothing behind in midfield with every blade of grass (plastic!) covered.
- Eoin Ward for exceptional tackling and never giving up in chasing back.
- Conor Mealy for clever running into space and winning and distributing quality ball.
- Ciaran Healy at full back marshalling (AKA roaring at!) his defence and indeed the forwards!
- Donal Kelly running riot in the forwards only to be asked to step into corner back position following an injury which he did with consummate ease.

Ultimately this win was the result of the work put in by all 23 panelists over the last 7 weeks and the will to win permeates throughout. Competition for places is hotting up and players on the bench on Sunday are now rightly "putting it up" to the management for game time!

Plunketts Second half haul overpowers Senior B Hurlers – Long Fella reports

A rasper of a goal from Liam Corbett midway through the second half decided the outcome of this high tempo game, the opening fixture of the league. The score put Plunketts into a lead of four and paved the way for a series of fine points, many from out the country. The visitors to the all weather at Sancta Maria were full value for their nine point win and the performance must have pleased their management, coming off the back of the 2015 season when then they captured the Senior B Hurling Championship.

Boden opened the brighter and the new management team under the guidance of Emmett Carroll must have been well pleased with the early salvo, a goal and a point from John O'Driscoll and a free from Austin Lynch. Plunketts got off the mark with a couple of frees from Corbett, easily the best performer on the park, and a goal from corner man Michael Walsh after he profited from some loose defending. Referee Karl O'Brien made his presence felt with some strict management and dished out the weight of his tongue for incidents of "guff" and the like. Unfortunately Boden's contribution in this area was deemed to be sanctionable and a red card reduced the home numbers to fourteen.

Despite the numerical disadvantage Boden finished the first half on the up and further scores from Sean McDonnell, Lynch and two monsters from Darragh O'Gorman and Eoin O'Neill added gloss to the score board. Plunketts kept in touch with some good scoring, Corbett being their main contributor. Half Time had it at 1.7 to 1.5 in Boden's favour.

The second half opened with some loose play and a few close encounters, again dealt with by the referee with the yellow. The visitors Conor McDonnell, fresh from Third Level College success during the week, got onto some decent ball and as well as his "bread and butter work", he added two class points. Boden were well in the game and kept the high tempo going. In the mix was a class save from goalman Keith Robinson, after Plunketts Michael Walsh was again left with acres of space.

The Corbett goal came with about a quarter of the game left and opened up the game to the best of Plunketts work. The introduction of Aaron Coffey for Boden gave the inside line a big lift but his final passes into the danger area failed to find the eager hand. Plunketts continued to feed their midfield and send some fine balls over the blackspot. Tim Sweeney, anchoring the Boden defence showed some fine touches and one in particular stood out, leaving a couple of the visitors spreadeagled on the artificial turf.

A measure of Plunketts dominance over the closing minutes was that they kept Boden scoreless to their own haul of five points.

Ballyboden Senior hurlers posted a fine win on Sunday 6th March in the first round of the Division 1 League away to St Vincent's.

In calm conditions and on a decent surface, both teams took a while to get going with the exchanges tight in the opening quarter hour. After a few wides to each side Boden's wingback Dean Curren sent over a fine long-range point to start the scoring and by the end of the first quarter the visitors had the lead – 3 points to 2. Boden were winning good puckout ball with James Madden and Conor Robinson to the fore. A positional switch saw Madden push further up the field and he was on the end of a fine passing move that allowed him fire low and across the Vincents' keeper to raise the first green flag of the morning. Minutes later, Madden again found himself in an advanced position. This time though, he was in heavy traffic and somehow held off a number of tackles before sending the ball to the net for a second time – a super score born of determination and strength. Further good work was being done outfield – Matty Weldon again popping up regularly to win breaking ball – as the sides traded points, mainly from the accurate free-taking of Paul Ryan of Boden and Tomás McGrane of Vincents. Half-time score: Boden 2-8 to St Vincents 0-6.

While the goals gave Boden some daylight, they were conscious that the lead was not significant and started the second half brightly with the first three points. Centre half-back David Curtin led the team with some fine catches and distributed the ball well. The full back line of Leddy, Desmond and Travers mopped up most Vincents attacks and the home side were mostly limited to scores from frees. With about ten minutes to go, Conor McCormack, who had a fine game throughout, scored Boden's third goal and this, allied to late points by Ryan left the final score Boden 3-16 St Vincents 0-12.


