Hurling News - Senior A Hurlers open Championship with a win

Ballyboden 0 22 Oliver Plunketts 1 10

A fair sized support took to the terrace for this opener in the Senior Championship at a chilly O'Toole Park on Friday evening. The sides seem to meet regularly at this stage of the campaign, so there were few surprises awaiting the players.

That said, there is always a 'first time to make your debut', as the American baseball player Yogi Berra used to say and Rob Leddy, fresh from last years minor side, fitted this billing nicely, proceeding to give a steady account of himself on a fair surface for hurling.

The opening half was a truncated affair, with a number of frustrating stoppages for injuries on both sides. Paul Ryan was an early departure. But not before contributing three points, the last of them a beauty. Plunketts kept in touch with good scores of their own, Liam Corbett and Aiden Baird with the best of them. Paul Doherty added further to the Boden tally and centre back David Curtin pointed some frees.

Boden's midfield pairing of Finn McGarry and James Madden grabbed a measure of control over the second quarter and both chalked up scores. Another to shine at this early stage was Niall Ryan; his running was causing some concern to the Plunketts rearguard. Dublin forward Niall McMorrow always looked a threat and he announced his presence with some good distribution.

The second half was a step up on the opening thirty and within a minute McMorrow flashed a quick point over the black spot. However by the fifth minute Plunketts had created the only two goal chances over the hour, but the experience of the evergreen Malachi Travers and the assured Dean Curran held a firm line and thwarted the threat. Boden added a series of decent scores through Madden twice (the first of these was the score of the game from all of 70 metres), Ryan again, Shane Durkin and Doherty. 16 to 6.

Game over! Well not quite! Plunketts came back with a Murray point and a fine goal from Michael Walsh. Murray added again to the Plunketts total, and brought their tally to 1.08. The flow came to a halt with a fine score from David O'Connor, and another from McMorrow off his left, a fine response. The game petered out with further broken play and some solid defending from in particular Stephen Hiney and Travers. Both even had the time to charge upfield and point from around the forty.

Best for Boden were Travers, Curtin, Madden and Ryan, though a case can be made for several others. The downside was the increasing injury list, the high wide tally and the failure to create goal opportunities.

Goal Fest in Senior B Championship...Wordsworth reports from Sancta Maria

If it was goals you wanted, Sancta Maria was the place to be on Sunday morning 24th April
as Ballyboden Senior B hurlers commenced their championship season against St Sylvesters.
Boden signalled their intent early on and were a goal and a point to a point ahead on ten
minutes, the goal coming from Dublin star Conor Dooley, finding himself further upfield

than usual these days. A key feature of the first quarter was some excellent half-back play,

particularly by Keith McCarron who won a brace of Sylvesters' puckouts and sent the ball back in to his forwards. In fact, all Boden lines were going well, including keeper Keith Robinson, who made a fine save and when the full forward line found space they punished the men from Malahide. One such move found Jonathon O'Driscoll in space and he picked his spot to put the home side 2-4 to 0-3 ahead on 15 minutes. Whenever Sylvesters did attack, Tim Sweeney was solid as a rock at the back, ably assisted by Darragh O'Gorman, Eoin Small and Jamie Desmond. A series of frees kept Sylvesters ticking over and at half-time the score was Boden 2-8 to Sylvesters 0-8.

A comfortable lead but no complacency was the message for the second half. Boden got the message and had the first three points of the half thanks to a free & 65 by Dooley and an O'Driscoll point. Naoise Maguire, Matty Weldon and Adam Jermyn were toiling well in the engine room and the supply continued. Sean Mc Donnell, a half-time substitute, was one such beneficiary, when he latched on to a good clearance and drilled the ball to the net after ten minutes. Sylvesters had to go for goals at this point and they were successful in the next attack. A magnificent Finnian McDonagh point from the right sideline and a Dooley free had Boden ahead by nine as the final quarter beckoned. Another Dooley 65 and an Austen Lynch point improved the point difference but then Boden lost concentration and leaked a second three-pointer. Immediately from the puckout, the ball went to Eoin McKenna in space – he took a few strides forward and gave the keeper no chance. Matty Weldon won the resultant puckout and fired the ball in to space. Jonathon O'Driscoll was again on the same wavelength, timed his run well and with the most delicate of flicks, sent the ball over the advancing keeper. Sylvesters policy of seeking goals again proved successful in the final few minutes as they found the net twice but Boden had the final say with a closing point by Weldon to leave the crowd warmed on a score of Boden 5-19 to Sylvesters 4-11


