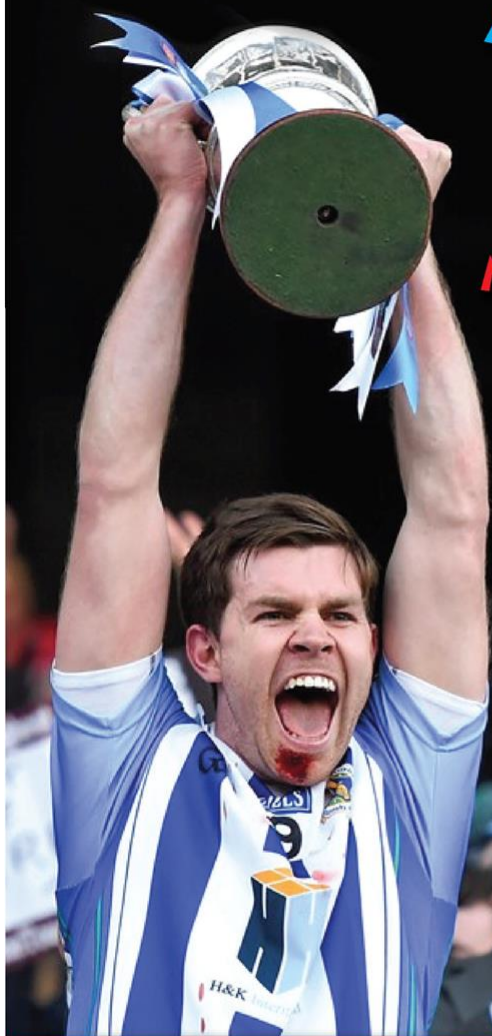

A more accomplished third quarter from St. Judes was enough to bag the league points in this AHL1 game at a well attended Firhouse Rd. on Tuesday evening. The joust was generally an entertaining affair, except for the lack of any goal opportunities over the hour. The visiting support was in a buoyant mood after a recent home win over their regular rivals Kilmacud Crokes.

Boden, fielding without a host of regulars, got off the mark in positive mood and by the fourth minute had chalked up three unanswered points. Judes free-taker Larkin got his side off the mark

with the first of eight frees. Boden kept the scoring going through Simon Lambert, Dean Curran and David O'Connor, and by the quarter led by 7 to 2. However, this lead was quickly whittled down by Jude's, Larkin from frees and two fine efforts from Maguire and Joyce. The Boden response came from Niall Ryan, his second point from play. Half Time had it Boden 0.8, Jude's 0.6.

Again it was Boden who opened up the brighter for the second thirty, a fine point from play off the Ballycahill stick of Ryan. The Jude's response was a game changer; they rattled off six points on the bounce and staked their claim to the honours, Larkin with four and Joyce with a brace. They held a lead of three entering the last ten minutes. By this stage the Boden game plan seemed to have evaporated to a large extent and was dominated by a selection of balls to Conal Keaney, although constantly marked by two Jude's defenders. The alternative strategy of finding the corners was only marginally more profitable than the former plan. Scores came from Fin McGarry, Ryan and Keaney twice.

With time running out the contrast in strategy was obvious, Jude's happy to take the points when offered, Boden now looking for the goal that would get them back into contention. That opportunity never came and referee Karl O'Brien blew his final whistle with the visitors to the good by three.

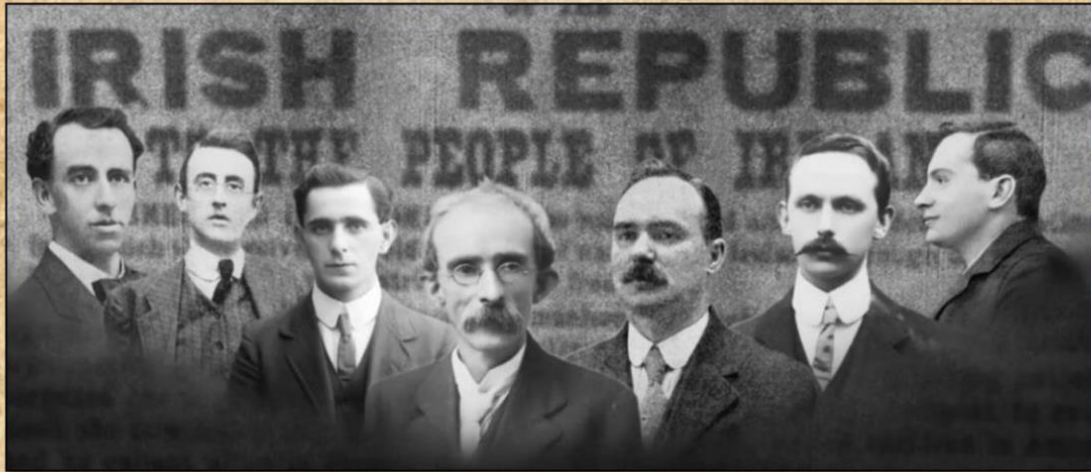
