Boden Hurlers Leinster Champions for third time



Third Leinster Title for Boden – Wordsworth reports A journey that began on 27th February ended in triumph in Portlaoise on Saturday 11th June when Ballyboden senior hurlers captured the Leinster League title for the third time. This was a perfect afternoon for hurling – dry, bright conditions and a flawless pitch gave the players every chance to show their skills.

Boden started well with Conor McCormack and a long-range Dean Curran point either side of a Simon Lambert free giving them an early advantage. Finn Mc Garry was showing well in midfield and tagged two fine points. A casualty in that first quarter was half-forward Niall Ryan who had to retire injured. This was particularly unfortunate for Niall as he'd been in great form in recent matches and no doubt would have contributed well in this match. A feature of this campaign for Boden was the strength in depth of the squad and in that regard, in came Matty Weldon to replace Niall. He had an immediate impact and in typical fashion, was at the centre of most midfield exchanges, hooking, blocking and securing breaking ball well. Rathnure were keen to use their influential full-forward Robbie Codd as much as possible and paced a number of direct balls in to the square. On one of these occasions a foul was committed and a penalty was awarded. No better man to face a one-to-one situation and Keith Robinson handled the pressure well, pulling off a fine save. At the quarter hour, it was 6 points to 3 in favour of Boden.

Rathnure had the assistance of the breeze in the first half and their influential midfielder Paddy Whitely had a couple of long range points early on. A long ball in after 20 minutes led to the first goal of the match and it went to Rathnure. This briefly gave the Wexford men the lead but they did not take full advantage and had quite a few wides in this second quarter. This was due, in no small part, to the pressure exerted by Boden's defence – particularly Malachy Travers, Eoin Small and David Curtin, whose work rate forced Rathnure to shoot from distance.

With the half-time whistle approaching, Boden had pegged back the Rathnure lead and with three points from Lambert were leading by one. Then a strong Conor McCormack run and some neat interplay with David O'Connor led to a great Boden goal — what a lift for the team before half time — it meant Boden had grabbed the initiative and went to the dressing room in a very positive frame of mind. It was just reward for the hard work being done all over the field. **Half-time score Boden 1-10 to Rathnure's 1-7.**

Points from Lambert and O'Connor at the start of the second half showed Boden meant business. Allied to that were solid interventions by Curran, Conor Robinson and David Curtin at the back. Matty Weldon contributed a fine point and at this stage, manager Paul Carley had started to use the bench. One player that had been introduced, Cian Hiney, scored shortly after coming on and with fifteen minutes to go the scoreline read Boden 1-15 Rathnure 1-9. A good lead but the focus needed to be maintained. Rathnure scored a brace of points but on 48 minutes, the game was effectively sealed. Simon Lambert got the ball in the corner and broke along the end line. The move was stopped but Lambert regained the ball and with a powerful shot, struck low from a very tight angle, into the Rathnure net. A second point from Hiney following a fine move involving David O'Connor and Lambert consolidated the position. Rathnure were forced to go for long-range points to claw back the lead but their shooting was wayward. After a third McGarry point, the final whistle went on a scoreline of Boden 2-18 Rathnure 1-11.

Thanks to Rathnure for a fine, sporting match. Well done to the squad and management team – Paul Carley, Terry O'Neill and Sean Collum – on this victory – a third to add to Boden's Leinster League titles of 2010 and 2013.

Well that would be too predictable and boring so instead we are delighted to report on the huge success of the annual Boden Ladies water sports/football blitz in the torrential rain at Sancta Maria on Friday 10th June!

Despite horrendous conditions, at 5.45pm our leader Donagh made the brave (and lonely!) decision to start the blitz in the sure and certain hope it would "blow over". Alas that wasn't to be as the rain was incessant until the final whistle of the last game (and typically stopped right there and then!) but who cares as the girls forgot completely about the conditions and over the course of 55 games (trivia – only 51 games to be played in Euros 2016!) showed their skills to the fullest. Enjoyment was the order of the day (alongside Dave Mellon's legendary "restaurant quality burgers"!).

From ages U/9 to U/14 the 250 girls were divided into 25 teams with matches played on eight pitches set up on the all-weather and prunty pitches. Irrespective of the weather the ladies section believes it can report that every girl thoroughly enjoyed the evening and with a minimum of 4 matches for each team they were certainly kept busy. Combined with the burgers, Ice Cream Van, Coffee Van, Tuck shop and oh yeah the water, they certainly weren't bored.

There is something really special about the way Boden coaches its juvenile players and it was evident to see the high standard of coaching in how girls are developing in their skills and team play. But it was just as impressive to see coaches and team managers on the evening

making sure of the main priority for the girls – enjoyment. This tournament would not be worth continuing if the girls simply did not enjoy it.

Overall another great Ladies blitz and with such attendance despite the weather it looks like June is now the preferred date in the diary from now on.

U13 William Phelan Hurling Tournament 2016



On the glorious Sunday afternoon of last weekend, the Annual Hurling match for the prestigious William Phelan Memorial Trophy was held on the Prunty pitch.

This match is played in honor of the memory of William Phelan, a great Ballygunner and a great Ballyboden man. William played with Ballygunner in his early years and after relocating from Waterford to Dublin, he became an extremely active member of Ballyboden St Enda's.

William passed away in 1990 aged 58 and a few years later Ballygunner GAA put forward the William Phelan Cup in gratitude for the years he had been involved in the Ballygunner Club's early days.

Originally the Cup was played for between the senior teams every few years. However, due to the number of players from each club's senior team involved with Waterford and Dublin county teams, and the commitment to a long playing season extending into the provincial club Championships, the opportunity of arranging a friendly match with full strength teams seldom arose.

As often happens, life went full circle for Liam, William's son and he reversed his Dad's move of the 1950's and moved from Ballyboden to Ballygunner and felt it was appropriate to re-establish the Cup fixture. Under 13 seemed to be the best age, as it is a Feile and Championship free season. With the venue alternating annually, the Cup match in 2016 was in Dublin.

This is the fourth year of the new underage fixture and the honours are as follows: 2013 Ballyboden 2014 and 2015 Ballygunner

Ballygunners were going for 3 in a row and meant business on their return visit. With the ball thrown in, Ballyboden opened the score with a quickly taken point. The Ballyboden lads were finding plenty of space on the ball and got another couple of points. Ballygunners soon started to come into the game and registered their first score. With a very good full back defense, Ballygunners managed to clear a lot of possible Ballyboden goal opportunities. Ballyboden picked off another couple of points before conceding a goal before half time.

This brought Ballygunners right back into it with a half time score line of 0-6 to 1-1 for Ballyboden.

With the sun blazing down and the humidity hig,h the second half got on its way. Ballyboden started as they left off, winning a lot of ball and finding good space. They registered the next 4 scores with no reply from Ballygunners. Soon after Ballygunners registered a score and the fear was they would come back hard.
