Minor A League Sunday 10th July 2016 Ballyboden St Enda's 2-16 Cuala 0-7 Le Fear Bog Reports

After an anaemic performance against Lucan Sarsfields the previous Wednesday evening, Ballyboden Minor A turned on the style to record their 9th straight win in the Minor A at

Sancta Maria. Throughout the season players plucked from the younger ranks have produced performances way beyond their tender years. On Sunday last it was the turn of young Luke McDwyer who scored a goal in each half and embellished his performance with a further point in the second half. Conor Barton was unerring with his frees and one 65 and this helped the Boden lads to lead at the break by 1-9 to 0-4 having played with a gentle breeze. Ballyboden produced probably their best hurling of the season so far when they turned around to face the mountains and play into the breeze in the second half. They completely stymie any challenge from the Dalkey boys. They manged to score 1-7 into the breeze with Barton continuing his accuracy, scoring 3 further frees in that second half. However, this win was fashioned on the physical bedrock of half back trio of Tommy Glynn, Cillian Byrne and Ciaran Ryan. James Holland was also herculean in the middle of the field and he also made a 2 point contribution. Aidan Mellett also deserves a mention as his hard running at the Cuala defence caused them all sorts of difficulties. Mellett also struck for 2 points. On Wednesday 20th July Ballyboden will travel to St Vincent's, a match which is sure to test their title credentials.

Senior A team topple Na Fianna – Wordsworth reports

Ballyboden Senior hurlers welcomed Na Fianna to Pairc Ui Murchú on Saturday 16th July for the next round of their AHL1 campaign. The early start meant the teams had good conditions with the surface in great shape. Na Fianna had the breeze in the first half and took advantage with more long range shooting evident in the first fifteen minutes. The sides were level at that stage with three points each – Boden's scores coming from Eoghan O'Néill and a pair from Simon Lambert. Eoin Small and Malachy Travers were linking well in defence and prevented any real threats to the Boden goal. Na Fianna then took control of proceedings and reeled off five long-range points. Finn McGarry recovered well from an injury mid-way to get on a lot of ball in midfield and with Shane Durkin, sent the ball well into the forwards. However, the Na Fianna defence was on top in this guarter and chances were few. Right before half-time, a nice flowing move led to Ronan Cleary placing the ball over the bar for a fine score from the left wing. Half-time score Boden 0-4 Na Fianna 0-8. The home team made a great start to the second period and reeled off five points in ten minutes - Durkin, Conor Dooley, Conal Keaney (2) and David O'Connor being the marksmen – to signal their intent. It was evident that the workrate of all lines had increased and this showed in the intensity of the match. After Na Fianna levelled Boden struck for the only goal of the match – a fine strike by Keaney. Eoin Small again dominated the back line, ably assisted by David Curtin and Stephen Hiney. Na Fianna came within a point on a couple of occasions but could not regain control. O'Connor and Dooley put in some fine blocks to prevent the ball going to the Na Fianna forwards, so real chances were limited. A brace from Finn McGarry were a highlight of the second half. Boden rounded off the scoring with a couple of minutes to go with a fine point from out on the left from substitute James Roche, returning from a long injury.
