As Páirc Uí Mhurchú is out of action, this home match was played on a splendid pitch in Abbotstown, with a stand for the small number of travelling supporters. Na Fianna played

with the wind in the first half and for most of that half it was the Conor McHugh show. The Dublin senior panellist was popping over points for fun with his left and right feet. In the first four minutes four points were shared by the teams with Collie Basquel and Stephen O'Connor scoring ours. Ryan Basquel scored next and then Na Fianna took over, popping over five points in the next 10 minutes without reply. Things could have been worse. On 10 minutes, Na Fianna broke through for a great goal chance but the ball hit one post, crossed the goal mouth, hit the other post and back out into the grateful hands of one of our backs to clear the danger.

Goals win matches! We score 7 times, concede 4 scores – but we lose!

Our girls opened their championship campaign in Cherryfield on Saturday against near neighbours Ballinteer St. John's. Our lead up was far from ideal, as we lost both Erica Tobin and Saoirse Fitzgerald to injury in the previous week.

The overnight rain had all but ceased, and the pitch was in excellent condition, and a sizable crowd gave plenty of vocal support to both teams. These two teams had already drawn in the league and another epic contest was expected. The two teams did not disappoint in that regard.

The match began at a frantic pace and no quarter was asked for or given, with the two teams going toe to toe like two Olympic boxers. 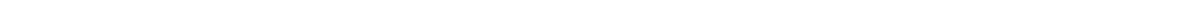
