'We're not at the promised land yet but it's within our sight'.....so said Coach Gavin Duff when addressing the victorious Ballyboden Minor 3 hurling team following their semi final win over St Patricks of Palmerstown in the County Minor D championship. Following an early pitch inspection the match started on time and Boden opted to play with the wind. The early exchanges were tense and scores were hard to come by, however Ross 'The Gallery' McCormack lobbed in a high ball which deceived the Pat's goalie and boden were a goal up. Within a few minutes Bodens sticky left half back Jack Basquel was withdrawn with a back injury (the 'bad back' syndrome seemingly genetically linked to generations of turf cutters from Mayo). Luckily he was replaced by the captain Eoin 'Steady' Fetherstone who himself was carrying a hand injury - but drove on never the less. As a unit the backs and mid-fielders (Ryan 'Speedy' Bradshaw, 'Red' Hugh O'Kelly, Adam 'Duracell' O'Neill, Oisin 'The Tiger' Murray, Eoin 'Cool' Dennehy, Kevin 'The small farmer' McGrath and goalie Matthew 'Des' Nolan were under constant pressure all through the 2nd half but like 'Horatio on the bridge' they defended manfully.

The forward were beginning to show more for the ball with direct route hurling - ball in as quick as possible to the full line – Ross 'The Gallery' Mc Cormack scored another goal from a great dive and flick. Conor 'The Tan' Fallon was hitting over some fine points from play and dead balls, Joe 'Tricky' Duff was moving well along with Sean 'The Assassin' O' Gorman and Jonathan 'Bold Boy' O' Donoghue, James 'The Politician' O'Reilly and Tim 'Hong Kong' Chung (who replaced Mark 'Grand young-fellow' Agnew at half time – who ran himself to a stand-still).

With 10 minutes to go the score was level and the wind coming off the mountain was only

The boys in the striped jerseys drove on relentlessly and scored another goal and for good measure tapped over a few nice points. James 'The runner' Kinsella came on for 'The Politician' and ran the legs out of the St Pats lads. When the final whistle was blown Boden were 5 points to the good. By 1.45pm the jerseys were washed and out on the line — ready for the final.
