






#### AFL9 Play off Semi-final BBSE 2-15 - 0-14 St.OP/ER

Conditions were perfect out in Martin Savage Park, in fact the crisp Autumn day added to the atmosphere. Lads were focused, the warm up was intense. The objective was simple, qualify for the final. From the off the management could see the hunger from the team. The ball was contested in the middle of the park by Vinnie Moran. Abley assisted by Enda Daly, Boden were on the attack. The ball was fed into the forward line, with Colum Reade latching on to a pass. He calmly passed off to young Donal Mccarthy, who sent the ball back across the face of Plunketts goal. Laurence Murphy was first to react, jumping high to fist the ball into the back of the Plunketts net. Game on. The Boden forward line were working hard to close down the oppositions attack. Vinnie latched on to a loose ball and calmly sent the ball high for a point. Murphy was playing a masterful game, turning his marker inside out time after time. His hard work resulting in another two points. Then came a turning point. Plunketts were awarded a penalty. Alan Keane in goal positioned himself perfectly, up steps the Plunketts player who let fly with a rasper of a shot low into the corner. Keane read it perfectly and got down to his right with such speed that he came away with the ball and set up a Boden attack. Bradley was first to react and after some neat play sent the ball over for another point. Indeed the entire Boden defence were immense, Brian Fitzgerald was out in front winning ball time after time. Anthony Manning was using his pace up and down the wings, supplying the forwards with some excellent ball. Fran Cooney was another outstanding defender, a joy to watch in the tackle. At half time the score was 1-9 to 0-4 in Bodens favour. The message at half time was simple, up the intensity. We could not afford to think we had this game sewn up, Plunketts would come out of the traps flying and we had to contain them in the first ten minutes. Plunketts didn't disappoint either after the break. Our defence were under huge pressure, indeed Cormac Smyth acted as a sweeper at times. The opposition tagged on four unanswered points, game definitely on. Young Mccarthy was also helping out in defence at times such was the pressure. I knew all we had to do was tag on a score of our own and we would settle down. Laurence Murphy was that man to step up, collecting a long ball in, turning his marker and sending the ball high for a point. Alex Murphy weighed in with a point of his own, he was unplayable at times. But Plunketts got it back to within three points at one stage. Cormac Smyth went over on his ankle and was replaced by Jamie Kavanagh. The occasion did not faze Jamie one bit, out in front looking for ball after ball. He outmanoeuvered his marker, got into space and collected a pinpoint ball from Moran . He passed the ball to Cooney who ran of his shoulder and calmly sent the ball over the bar. Jamie was instrumental in Bodens second goal. He unleashed a shot and Donal McCarthy managed to somehow latch on to the end of it to send it into the Plunketts net. Marcus O Byrne came on and settled into the intensity of the game with ease. The final whistle was met with a huge roar after this hard fought victory against an excellent Plunketts side. The fact that they beat us by a big margin in the league a few weeks back did not matter a jot now. 

**SAOR Training for Ballyboden Mentors Juvenile to Minor** 



#### So what is SAOR?

SAOR, meaning "free", is the acronym for Support, Ask & Assess, Offer Assistance and Refer and is used to describe a model of brief intervention. A brief intervention is any intervention that involves the mimimum amount of time to support a change in a particular type of behaviour. A brief intervention may simply start through a conversation where a problem is identified and the individual is motivated to make a change in relation to the problem behaviour.

While the use of SAOR is designed to guide GAA coaches through a short supportive structured conversation with a player that may be engaged in harmful drug or alcohol use the communication and listening skills acquired through the training can be useful in a variety of training.

SAOR can work especially well with juvenile members in GAA clubs due to the relationships and strong bonds that exist between players and coaches. As coaches we regularly ask our players to leave their life issues in the changing room but for some players this wont be possible. If a player is experiencing difficulty in their lives this can manifest itself both physically and mentally and it is better for a coach to be armed with the skills to deal with these issues if and when they present themselves.





Ballyboden's gym is now fully refurbished. The club has gone to a lot of expense and time to bring facilities up to a standard to match any club in Ireland. With over 800 adult players in the club, its important we get off to an organised start. Next week, we will be starting off with induction sessions for senior team players initially in all codes in the club. Each player will have to go through an induction on the safe way to utilise the equipment at his or her disposal. It is planned to roll out the induction to all adult players in the club.

It is also planned that a schedule of organised team session slots will be issued for all adult teams.

Outside of scheduled slots, it has been agreed by the Executive and the gym committee that players will need to pay an additional 50 euros per annum which will go to maintaining the upkeep and standards within the gym. If you want to use this facility, you will be provided access through your Ballyboden membership card and you will log on to an app, which will highlight slots available for booking. For fully paid up adult players to join the gym is easy to do.

For fully paid up adult players to join the gym is easy to do (After induction session)

- Download the app.
- Pay the 50 euro contribution with a credit or debit card.
- You will then be set up with an account.
- Your membership card will automatically be activated and you will receive a mail alert.
- You then simply select a time slot on the app, and swipe in with your membership card when you arrive.

• All attendees outside a team session must have checked in on the app, and swiped in at the door.

The gym committee which is made up of two players from each of the four adult sections has been setup to ensure that we organise ourselves to utilise this fantastic asset in a safe and respectful way e.g. respect for others using the gym as well as keeping the exercise areas tidy and clean.

The club has agreed to licence out the use of the gym, primarily in the mornings to Gary Downey of Body Design Fitness (BDF).
