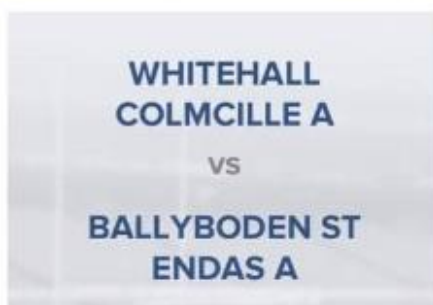

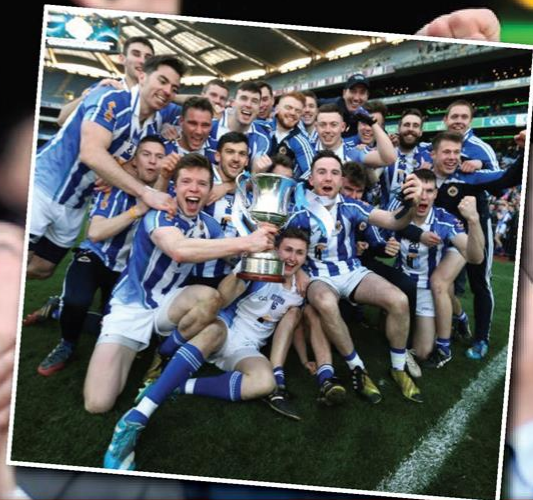
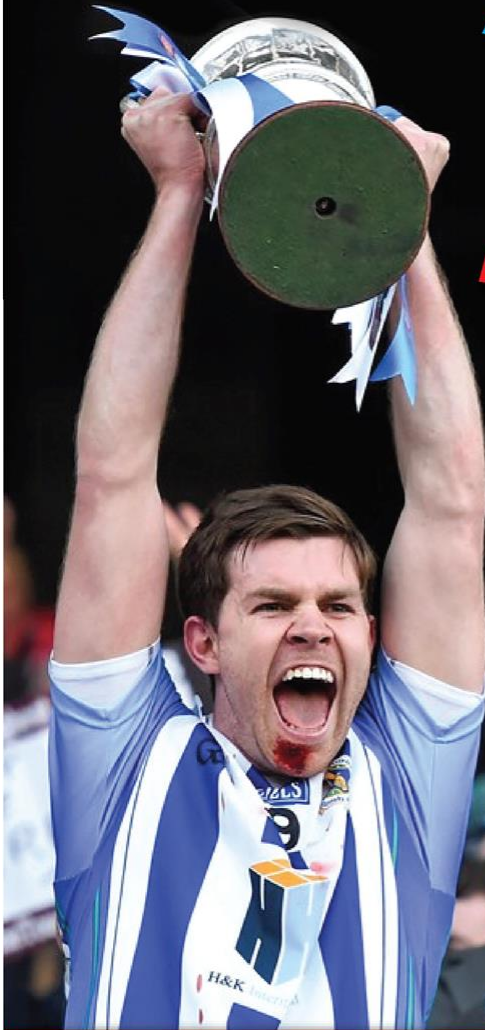

Ballyboden St Endas 1-11:0-12 St Bridgets Venue O'Toole Park

The Intermediate team had their second championship game of 2016 last Thursday evening against St Bridgets in O'Toole Park.

Boden won the throw in and attacked. We played the ball quickly, with good movement and Colm Dunne scored a good point. Bridgets won their kickout and Boden broke up their attack and went forward, but that move broke down. Bridgets attacked and kicked a wide under good pressure from our defence. Josh Kane's kickout found its target and Boden attacked, but were forced wide and Colm Dunne kicked wide from out on the right.

Both teams were struggling to keep possession, as the defences were tackling hard and putting shooters under pressure. Alan Flood scored two points to have Boden 3 to 1 after 16 minutes. Feargal Clancy got a great fourth point for Boden with his left foot. Boden were threatening the goal and could have had two goals, but poor decisions or a last pass going astray kept the scoreline down. Alan Flood scored a great team goal after 26 minutes to put Boden clear of Bridgets. He had already got his third point before that. Bridget's came back with two points to leave the score at halftime 1.05 to 5 points to Boden.

Boden brought on Eoin Crowley for Darragh Kilduff at half time to centre-forward with Feargal Clancy moving to wing forward. The second half started with Boden winning the throw in, with Eoin Crowley getting on a breaking ball from our midfield. Seamus Keane got the first score of the second half. It became a typical championship match with both teams working hard and mistakes from pressure, costing both teams. Bridgets hit a lot of wides, but were keeping in touch. Feargal Purcell got our seventh point. Alan Flood then got our eight and ninth point of the game, but Bridget's kept in the game. It was 1.09 to 10 points with ten minutes to go.

Karl Molony came on for Colm Dunne with Alan Flood moving to wing forward. Darragh Kilduff came back on for Conor McCormack who had a great game, working hard and getting on a lot of ball, creating a lot of scoring opportunities. Feargal Purcell got his second point with a good fisted point, that gave us a three point lead. But Bridget's kept coming back and reduced it to two points with five minutes to go. Darragh Kilduff then got a good score to make it a three point lead again. Bridget's got their twelfth point to reduce it to two points again. Then they hit another wide, as Boden closed out the game. Bridget's kept coming at Boden, but couldn't get away from their markers. They finished with 12 points, but had a good few wides from the pressure they were put under by the defence. Alan Flood had a great game scoring 1.05 in total from play.

The game finished 1.11 to 12 points in favour of Boden. A good day out for the squad, with hard work and skillfull play being rewarded, improvement is needed though to get through the next round in August.

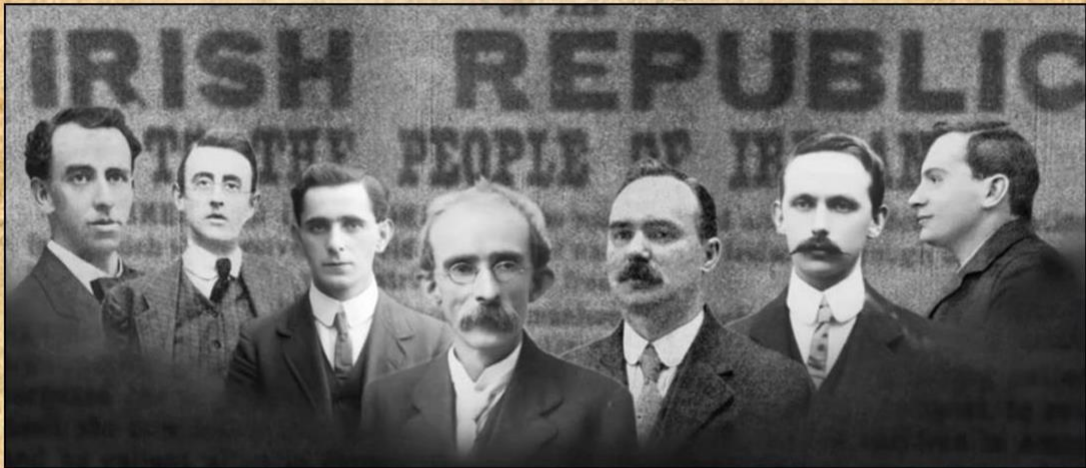
