It is with great sadness that the first football report of 2017 starts with the tragic news that our esteemed colleague, Adult Football Secretary, Padraig Cullinane passed away on Monday night. Football Chairman Eoin Dunne has penned the following sentiments which are echoed by all those who knew Padraig and everyone associated with the club.

We have all been deeply shocked and saddened by the sudden death of Padraig Cullinane on Monday evening last. Although a proud Corkman, Padraig adopted Ballyboden St Enda's as his club when he moved to live in Knocklyon, and for the last 30 years he was a proud supporter our teams across all codes and age groups. In more recent years Padraig made a huge contribution to the development of football in the club, in his role as Secretary of the Adult Football Section. Like every member of the club, he rejoiced when we achieved the ultimate success of the Senior All Ireland football glory on March 17th last, and well he might – he played an important role of bringing about this success through his years of work and commitment to football in Ballyboden St Enda's. Padraig was a true GAA man, but more importantly he was one of life's true gentleman, a man who was unfailingly kind and courteous, always willing to help, no matter what the task. Intensive training has begun for the new U11 boys as they eagerly anticipate a fresh season of competition.

Since its inception and launch as a registered charitable organisation in 2004, UCDVO has extended its activities to projects in India, Haiti, Nicaragua, Tanzania and Uganda and employs two full-time staff to co-ordinate its activities.

To date, 1294 volunteers have engaged in environmental, educational, healthcare, construction and computer training projects in disadvantaged communities overseas.


Through links with the Irish Embassy in Dar es Saalam, UCDVO established a partnership with a Tanzanian NGO called TanzEd and began it's first project in Tanzanua in 2009. This year the lads will be working on Computer and English Education and also Library development projects for 4 weeks.
