


Bereavement - Hickey

St. Vincents take the opening points in AHL

A breezy sunny Sunday morning greeted the hurlers of St. Vincents and Boden for this opening AHL1 fixture of the season at Sancta Maria. Both sides fielded without some regulars, but it was the visitors who seemed the least hindered by the encumbrance.

A competitive affair was ultimately decided by the better inside play from the St Vincents forwards. They bagged a goal in each half, and Boden's response from points was insufficient to keep apace with them. Simon Lambert was the home side's top contributor, mainly frees, but also from play.

The visitors were quick out of the blocks with some early points, the best of them from club stalwart Ciaran Hetherington. Boden's Aiden Mellett angled a fine score from a tight angle, and Shane Durkin covered an acre of space to fire a score from out wide. However this good work was wiped out by the Vincents goal, a classy finish from Stephen McGarry, after good work by Connolly. Lambert was a perfect ten from the frees and Durkin popped up again from his defensive position on the Boden forty. Vincents were rewarded with a succession of fine scores from out in the country, floated over off the back of a strong wind from the Western end. Conal Keaney was finding one too many defenders facing him, but he did contribute a fine score from about fifty out. Mellett pointed the last score of the half with another of his specialities to leave the half at 9 points to a goal and 10.

The half time discussion swayed from discussing the Tipp/KK drawn league fixture to an analysis of the future of the Hurling All-Ireland series, and it's response to the Football Super8. A few club veterans were of the view that a new Super2 for the hurling would provide a credible response. Guess which counties these fans may have represented???

The second half was much less fluent than the first, but it followed a similar pattern in that Vincents again bagged the only goal. Boden were again dependent on Durkin, Keaney and Lambert for vital scores, just to keep in touch with the more effective Vincents attacking force. In the engine room Vincents also proved a handful, particularly Rob Sheehan, who kept the ball moving into friendly hands. Boden's Paul Doherty came into the action and pointed an immediate response.

Boden when, with the last kick of the first half, Luke McDwyer finished coolly to the net following a great through ball from Ross McGarry.




