Leinster Senior League

Ballyboden Senior Hurlers qualified for the quarter final of the Leinster League Division One competition on Saturday afternoon after a good tussle against Kilkenny's Young Irelands that ended in a draw.

On a very firm pitch in Glynn-Barntown, Boden were out of the traps early and built up a nice three-point lead with well-taken points by Niall Ryan and Simon Lambert. Young Irelands got into the match shortly after that and at the quarter hour, the sides were tied on 4 points each. Eoin Small and Dean Curran were clearing good ball from defence and it was after one such clearance that a fine move ended with a Niall Ryan surge forward and a fine shot to the net for the opening goal of the match. This gave Boden a slender lead at half-time on a scoreline of 1-9 to 10 points.

Boden kept the pressure on after the break and signalled their intent with a fine long-range

point by James Roche. David O'Connor was a constant source of torment for the Irelands defence and it was his hard work that generated many of the placed ball opportunities for Lambert. Luke Corcoran was showing well at full-back and with Eoghan O'Neill's distribution from puckouts, Boden looked to have done enough to land the win. However, in the closing minutes a free was conceded on the edge of the D and the resultant free was fired to the net by the Young Irelands marksman. Final score Boden 1-17 Young Irelands 1-17. Thanks to Glynn-Barntown for hosting the match, a fine pitch and for their hospitality on the day.

BBSE 314 Na Fianna 1-18

Ballyboden overcame a determined Na Fianna side at a wet and windy Sancta Maria to record their second victory of the season. The foundations for the win were established in the first half when playing against the strong breeze Ballyboden went in at the break only 3 points behind on a score of 2-3 to 0-12. The scores from Na Fianna were kept to a manageable level thanks mainly to the heroics of goalkeeper Conor O'Donoghue who pulled off 2 outstanding saves within the first 10 minutes and to add to his performance O'Donoghue converted a penalty after 13 minutes to give his side a two point lead. Na Fianna regrouped after this and mainly through a succession of Seán Currie frees they kept their noses in front. However, a goal from Kevin Desmond after 23 minutes put Boden in a very favourable position coming up to half time. Desmond's goal was the culmination of a soaring catch from wing back Conor Kelly who delivered to Conor Fallon who in turn set up Desmond. 2 points from Micheál Murphy just before the break gave Na Fianna their 3 point lead at half time.

A Conor Fallon free from the 65 meter line just on the resumption deceived the Na Fianna keeper to end up in the net to put Ballyboden level. Na Fianna had a great chance to go ahead again in the 35th minute when they were awarded a penalty. Once again keeper O'Donoghue pulled off an outstanding save from Currie. As conditions deteriorated Ballyboden pushed out their lead to 5 points through some excellent scores from Ciarán Cashman, Rob Donohoe, Ciarán O'Reilly a Conor Fallon close in free and a couple of long range efforts from O'Donoghue. A goal in the 45th minute by Murphy kept Na Fianna within sight of victory. From there to the end a slugfest developed in the poor conditions but to their credit Ballyboden prevailed to record a precious 2 points.

Ballybodens exciting start to their 2017 season came unstuck in Marlay Park on Sunday with a loss to their neighbours Ballinteer St Johns.

Despite fielding a strong side Boden never got going in this game. Played on a heavy pitch, the Boden players were outplayed by their opponents. The fact that they didn't have to play that well must have been even more annoying for the visitors who finished the game with a numerical advantage. Pretty much anything that could go wrong for Boden went wrong. A mix up in the goal mouth of farcical proportions allowed the home side to boot the ball past the Boden keeper of the turf. At half time it was 1-08 to 0-04 points to the home side. At least 5 or 6 ball ended up in the thankful arms of the home sides goalkeeper and this more than anything must have infuriated the Boden supporters.

With a wind advantage in the second half Boden were just as wasteful, losing possession and giving the ball away repeatedly. AFL 8 Junior B vs Na Fianna Sunday, 19th March 2017 Result: 3-08 to 1-05

The JBs kept the bandwagon rolling with an emphatic win in the league away to Na Fianna. The clouds were gathering as we left PUM and by the time we arrived at Collinstown the heavens opened and a force ten gale only added to the occasion. Certain players were asked by management to play out of their normal positions due to injuries and team-mates away. Our rock in the half back, James McTiernan was drafted into midfield for example. Having won the toss and selecting to play with the wind at our backs the game got under way. James was once gain winning ball abley assisted by young Kavanagh. Our forward line were out in front feeding off some excellent balk worked in from the industrious midfield. Keane was in great form, making some crucial saves time keeping us in it. At one stage it was a 3 point game.
