Ballyboden senior hurlers travelled to Blunden Drive on Sunday 26th March 2017 for their Division 1 League fixture. As both teams had lost in round one, this was an important opportunity to put points on the board. Both sides fielded strong line-ups as referee Declan Moloney threw in the ball in bright spring sunshine.

Points were traded at the outset with Shane Durkin first off the mark for Boden followed by Paul Ryan and Simon Lambert. However, the key score of the quarter arrived on 15 minutes when a high ball in to the square was met by Aidan Mellett and finished to the net. This gave Boden some daylight that they would not relinquish. The work-rate was good throughout the team with great hooking and blocking displayed by the visitors. The second quarter was evenly balanced and the sides went for the break on a scoreline of Boden 1-8 to O'Tooles 0-5.

The home side started well in the second half and benefitted from the easterly breeze that reminded those present we are still in March. Stephen O'Connor was going well in midfield and a few nice points were scored, notably for Boden by Mellett. However, a lapse of concentration at the back allowed a long-range free to find its way to the net and this gave the home team a lift. Boden's response was good however, as they responded with the next two scores. A magnificent save by Keith Robinson deflected a goal-bound shot over the bar. This was important because O'Tooles were closing in on the lead with ten minutes to go. Despite missing a number of key players through injury this was a very positive performance from the Boden boys who were on the wrong end of a two point defeat by Lucan on the Prunty pitch on Sunday morning. Boden started brightly and opened the scoring with a fine point from Eoghan McGarvey following a strong run from midfield by Ronan Wallace. Soon after fellow midfielder Rob Donohoe dispatched another effort over the bar to give Boden an early two point lead. Boden were playing well but were caught by two sucker punches which resulted in two green flags being raised within the space of a couple of minutes in favour of Lucan.

Boden's response was immediate and Ciaran O'Reilly finished to the back of the Lucan net following a defence splitting pass from Ross McGarry. McGarry followed this up with three successive points which Lucan responded to with three points of their own. With half-time approaching Boden were down by a single score however the team began to find its rhythm and scored two well worked team points finished by neatly by Eoghan McGarvey and Luke Grady to lead by a point at the half-time by 1-7 to 2-3.

Lucan were quick to start the second half and scored two early points to lead by a point mid way through the half. Boden's response was swift and equalised with a well taken point by Jack Basquel followed with a Ciaran O'Reilly point. Lucan levelled soon after and then had a man sent off as a result of a second booking. However this seemed to inspire the opposition and despite both sides trading points it was Lucan who finished the stronger with two late points to run out 2 point winners.

This was a much improved team display from Boden who will take a lot of heart from this performance into the next game against Thomas Davis.

Although she was not able to take any further part in proceedings, happily the prognosis is good – no serious damage done. Then a wayward clearance from our defence was punished by their attack, to leave the score at the break NF 0-1, BBSE 0-0.

The second half began in similar fashion. Now it was Na Fianna's turn to send a wayward clearance which was snapped up by Michaela and put over the bar for the levelling point. 
