Boden send message to Champions – Wordsworth Reports

It is not every day you get to line out against an All-Ireland winning team and an even rarer occasion when you cross the finishing line ahead by four points. That is exactly what Ballyboden Senior hurlers accomplished on Saturday evening 29th April in Parnell Park. This was a first round opener in the 2017 Championship and Boden, playing with a strong breeze, started well with points from Paul Doherty and a brace from Simon Lambert. A couple of wides were also registered before Cuala got on the scoreboard and this was an encouraging sign for the blue and white supporters in the crowd. More encouraging still was the level of workrate shown by Boden that seemingly took them to the breaking ball first and when possession was lost, the intensity with which the forwards in particular sought to recover the ball. This yielded spectacular results at the start of the second quarter when Boden rattled off five points without reply from play – Niall Mc Morrow, James Roche, Aidan Mellet, Lambert and Conal Keaney – all contributing fine points from distance. This proved to be a significant spell for Boden and gave them a cushion that they would not subsequently relinquish. Cuala pressed hard but the defence led by Shane Durkin, Cian Mellet and Stephen Hiney in particular, limited the Dalkey men to long-range points and the occasional free. When the sides went in at half-time with Boden ahead by three (0-10 to 0-7), we looked forward eagerly to the second half.

"Nothing is so contagious as enthusiasm" wrote Coleridge and this was very evident in the third quarter. While the scoring was low, the effort and quality of play was excellent by both sides. Lambert, Keaney and Kenneth Wigglesworth in particular led the team with fine puckout wins, interceptions and passes. Into the final quarter and the effort expended began to take its toll, with a few injuries, particularly in the forward line. Cuala had inched their way back with a series of frees from marksman David Treacy also at this time. On came Niall Ryan, Eoghan Ó'Néill and David O'Connor and they certainly made their mark. All three contributed points and O' Connor showed for three excellent puckout wins when the pressure was on towards the end. A high ball into the goalmouth as the match entered injury time fell for Keaney – no better man to find himself with an opportunity like this and the ball nestled in the Cuala net. Shortly thereafter the final whistle went and Boden had prevailed on a scoreline of 1-18 to 0-17. A very satisfying result and on now to the next round on Friday 5th May against Crumlin.

Plunketts too strong for Boden in Senior B Championship – The Bishop Reports

St. Oliver Plunkets/ER 1 16 Ballyboden 0 13.

Perfect weather conditions on a firm surface greeted the adult hurlers of Plunkets and Ballyboden for this Round 1 tie in the Senior B championship on Saturday evening. Both sides gave the modest crowd a sporting contest, with some skilful individual displays. From the throw-in, it was obvious that the more physically strong visitors would prove difficult to overcome. That said, it was Boden who were quickest out of the traps; they led by three points to a single after five minutes. Austin (Ozzie) Lynch opened up for Boden with a fine catch and strike, was followed by a free and up steps Jamie Desmond with a long range shot, another beauty. Plunketts response was a point from Mikey Walsh. Naoise Maguire operating on the Boden forty, landed a few good balls towards Donal Butler at the point of the attack. One of these led to one of the best scores of the game; Ozzie again the scorer. For Plunkets, Brian O'Sullivan, a giant of a man, started getting to grips with the tight marking of Mike Clifford, and profited with a fine effort (4-3).

The next ten minutes were dominated by the visitors, and they bagged some fine scores from the most influential man on the field-Ronan O'Brian. After twenty minutes play Plunketts led by four points (10-6). But back came Boden with their best period of play. Adam Jermyn from near the side-line, Butler after Chris Lambert assisted and Ozzie from frees, all added to Boden's tally and brought the half time score to ten to eight for the visitors.

The second thirty opened brightly for Boden with Jermyn and Ozzie bagging two great scores to tie the contest. However that prompted the visitors into action and Boden's goalman Gavin Corrigan came in for some serious scrutiny. Being a man who relishes a challenge, Gavin brought off a series of quality saves, but he was left almost completely exposed for the Plunketts goal; a mix-up in defence which left Dylan Burke with the simplest of tasks. The gap was now five points. The last fifteen minutes play was mainly under the control of the visitors with O'Brian showing some good touches and O'Sullivan offering his considerable frame as a target for in-coming balls. Butler and Finn McDonagh had goal opportunities for the home side but both came to nothing. Butler did point a fine effort, but this was quickly cancelled out by O'Brian.

Overall, the Boden management team under Brendan Ryan will be reasonably happy and look forward to building on this fine effort against a side who have serious aspirations to capturing this title, a feat they completed a few years ago at Boden's expense.

Boden playing good football went into an early two point lead courtesy of Ross McGarry and a Mark McNamee '45 but Naomh Mearnóg responded with six unanswered points. However Boden playing some good football regained the lead with finely taken scores from Ciaran O'Reilly and Sam Lally and then added two opportunist goals from full forward Luke Grady. Div 1 Hurling Feile Match Reports



Silver Park in Leopardstown was the venue for this year's Division 1 Hurling Feile Group B with Kilmacud Crokes hosting Ballyboden St. Endas, Commercials and Naomh Baróg. Ballyboden went into the tournament full of confidence with an impressive 100% success rate in the league to date.

Match 1: BBSE V Commercials

First up for the Boden Boys were Commercials, who always provide stiff opposition and Boden were not taking their task lightly, targeting the opening fixture as a 'must win' game.

When proceedings got underway, Boden started brightly with Captain Rhys McDonnell opening the scoring with a free just a couple of minutes in...he added another from play before Commercials struck an early goal against the run of play and they doubled their advantage with a point soon after. Boden were already into their stride however and bounced back with some excellent play and drew a succession of fouls resulting in three further pointed frees from the skipper to take a one point lead midway through the opening half. Mathew Ormsby then struck an excellent solo effort after a strong run from midfield to extend the lead before Commercials signalled that they were not lying down by retaliating quickly with a score of their own to narrow the deficit to the bare minimum. Boden finished the half stronger despite Commercials adding a late pointed free in reply to scores from Michael McDonald and the lively Cian Kelly and also full forward Jason Dwyer to leave the half time scoreline at 0-9 to 1-3 in Boden's favour.

With a stiff breeze at their backs in the second half, Boden added two early points from Rhys MacDonnell frees but Commercials did not throw in the towel and struck a goal and a point in reply to make it a one point game and ask some serious questions of their opponents. Ballyboden would answer emphatically and finally started to pull away with a

succession of scores from play and placed balls from the stick of Rhys McDonnell who, having moved into Full Forward for the second half, bagged a personal tally of 2-10 to cap a Man of the Match performance. Commercials managed to add four more points but Mathew Ormsby iced the cake for Ballyboden with another fantastic solo effort late on.

Match 2: BBSE V Kilmacud Crokes

Next up for Ballyboden was billed as the crunch game of the group against the hosts and fierce rivals Kilmacud Crokes. Although it would not be an eliminator as both sides had won their opening fixture, neither side wanted to come out on the wrong end of this one and a battle royal was anticipated in a bid to top the Group standings.

Such was the tension following the build-up to this contest, it almost inevitably proved a little anti-climatic for the purists as it turned out to be a low scoring affair dominated by excellent defences on both sides. The imperious Alex Gavin and David Gannon leading the Boden rearguard, showed their true class in this one repelling Crokes and frustrating the hosts time and again with their energetic and intelligent endeavours. Of course it was more than a two man job and they were ably assisted by Conor Barnes and Oisin Byrne, David Keane, Josh Corcoran and Harry Duff who combined to nullify Crokes attacks. The highlight of the game was a brilliant goal from Boden's Hugh O'Sullivan at Full Forward, gathering possession from a high ball about 20 metres out before powering past his marker to smash an unstoppable shot into the top far corner of the Crokes net. That score gave Boden a six point cushion at half time and the teams would only score once each in an uneventful second half to give Boden the desired spoils.

Match 3: BBSE V Naomh Baróg

The final group game pitted Boden against surprise packet Naomh Baróg who had effectively ended Commercials hopes with a victory in their head to head.

This would prove a much tougher test than anyone had predicted and Baróg settled into the swing of things quicker and raced into the lead with an early goal. A pointed free followed before Jason Dwyer opened Boden's account with a well taken point before a free from Josh Corcoran closed the gap further. Baróg converted another free heading towards half-time but the busy Jason Dwyer was rewarded for his high work rate with a goal to draw the sides level at the break at 1-2 each.

Boden grabbed the first score of the second period to take the lead for the first time in the contest when Hugh O'Sullivan pointed a long range effort almost straight from the throw-in but that was soon wiped out by another Baróg goal to really throw the cat among the pigeons! Cian Durkin then went on a personal crusade and took the game by the scruff of the neck to score a goal and two points and open a three point lead for Boden and it seemed the storm had been weathered. However, back came Baróg and despite Boden's resolute defence holding firm, with big performances from Barry Maguire, David Keane, Conor Barnes and David Keogh, their pressure paid off with two pointed frees to reduce the deficit to the bare minimum. To their credit Boden upped their game again to rally late on and forced a penalty when the industrious Sam Doyle was upended in the box and Rhys McDonnell duly

Semi-Final: BBSE V Faughs

This really was a tantalizing affair and the perfect stage to renew rivalries with our nearest neighbours. Faughs took the early advantage before Rhys McDonnell equalized from a free. Faughs then scored the first goal before another Boden free halved the deficit . A short 65 saw Ballyboden's Conor Casey benefit as he split the posts with a sharp shot to reduce the gap to a single point. A rare error in the Boden defence gave Faughs a second goal chance which was duly taken to open a four point gap midway through the opening half. Boden then enjoyed a period of dominance during which Cian Kelly and Jason Dwyer up front, both went close to netting which would have been no less than Boden deserved as reward for their endeavours with David Keogh, Mathew Ormsby and Connell McGlynn getting the better of their counterparts and providing a good supply of ball inside to the forwards. The pressure paid off when after a pointed free, the breakthrough finally came for Boden when Cian Kelly found the net to draw the sides level . However, two further scores including a converted 65 gave Faughs a two point lead at the break.

The impressive Sam Doyle reduced the arrears early in the second half and that was to be the last score form play from either side as defences tightened up and chances were scarce from then on. Boden Keeper, Jack Hutchinson's Goal wasn't threatened again as Cian Kiely, Oisin Byrne and Harry Duff worked tirelessly to minimize any threat that Faughs would pose around the park but neither could Boden impose themselves at the opposite end despite the best efforts of Thomas Brosnan, Sean O'Shea, Cormac McDonnell and Hugh O'Sullivan up front who were starved of good ball for large periods as the battle waged in the bear pit of midfield and on both flanks where neither side could command control. The hugely impressive Davy Keogh would produce the last score for Boden who ultimately could not close the gap and thus fell agonizingly short despite a last ditch effort from a 21 metre free by Rhys McDonnell being stopped short of the goal line.



Knocklyon Park pitches get a facelift!


